## Fire at Newcastle Thursday Night

Stable of Union Hotel Badly Damaged---  
Firemen Do Fine Work.

Fire was discovered in the stable of the Union Hotel, Newcastle, shortly before midnight on Thursday last. It was first seen by Mr. John W. McKay, of Millerton, who immediately gave the alarm.

The firemen were quickly on the scene but not before the flames had gained considerable headway. The fire spread from the stable to the rear of the kitchen of the house and it was with great difficulty that this building was saved.

A number of horses in the stable had a narrow escape and some splendid work was done by the firemen in rescuing the animals.

The buildings are owned by Mr. John McAulay, proprietor of the hotel.

The fire is supposed to have started by some one dropping a lighted match while after a horse.

The buildings were insured.

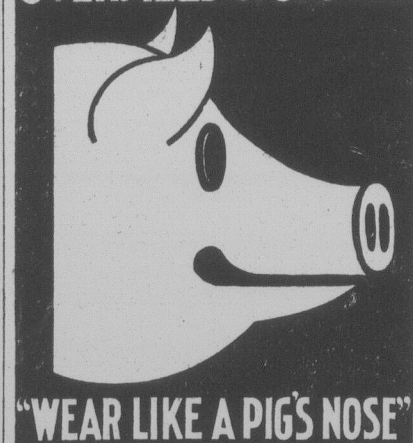
