### EXHIBITION OF THE INDUSTRY OF ALL NATIONS.

My dear Editors.—It was with sincere pleasure  
that I recently observed a communication in your  
paper over the signature of "Archimedes," regarding  
the property of New Brunswick being  
represented by some work of Art, at the great  
exhibition in London in 1851. I have learned  
of several persons residing in different parts of the Province  
express their earnest desire, that the project  
should be mentally carried out, in the manner  
suggested by your correspondent. It has been  
computed that about £2000 would be re-  
quired to pay for the labour and materials which  
necessarily would be expended on the construction  
of a miniature figure, about fifteen or twenty feet  
in length, with arms, &c., and of all the material's  
now, when as well known that all the material's  
required can be found in the productions of New-  
 Brunswick, and that there is abundance of native  
and foreign timber, to put these  
together in such a way as to reflect credit upon  
Archimedes to be employed in this undertaking,  
common with many, I do most sincerely hope  
that this desirable project may instantly engage  
the practical attention of the Legislature, and that  
of our Mechanics' in particular.

Your paper is the only one as yet, in which I  
have observed any notice of this commendable enter-  
prise, but I very much mistake the time and  
temper of your contemporaries, if they do not speedily  
follow suit, when on a good lead has been set  
to them.

The greatest reward is always found in the per-  
son who is the first to come forward to advance an  
undertaking intended for the public benefit, but  
equal merit is due to those who nobly sustain it,  
by cash—if needful—and influence, after it has  
been fairly brought under the public notice.

The leading object of a public subscription should  
be for the purpose of fully paying the Mechanics'  
engaged in this work; and at the same time it  
would be only a reasonable reward for their  
extraordinary and novel ingenuity, if they were  
permitted to retain for their own use, the proceeds  
of any sale, which might be effected at the exhibition,  
after the completion of the figure, but  
certain to be efficient.
