**No. 3 Gold Medal Folding Camp Chair**—This chair may be folded and carried as easily as an umbrella. It is strong enough for the heaviest man, being guaranteed to maintain a weight of 400 lbs., and comfortable for all, adjusting itself perfectly to the body and affording a better rest than any other chair made. Size, folded, 3 feet long by 3 inches square. Weight, 4 1/2 pounds.



**No. 5 Gold Medal Folding Camp Stool**—This is a strong, neat stool at a low price. It folds so compactly that a large number can be put in a small space and it will be found useful on many occasions, on this account, and because of its small cost. Guaranteed to support 500 lbs.



**No. 1 Gold Medal Folding Camp Bed**—In its construction this bed is a marvel of skill. 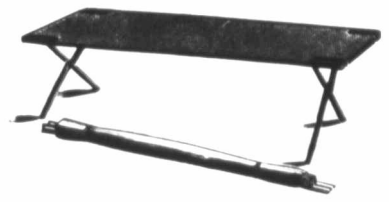

It is nicely finished with filler, and varnished, and folds more compactly than any similar chair manufactured. A dozen of these chairs folded occupy a space 36 inches long by 16 inches wide by 20 inches high. The folding device is new. Weight, 7 lbs.





**No. 2 Gold Medal Folding House Cot**—For an indoor Cot this is of special value. It is equally portable whether occupied or not—something that is appreciated by the sick who wish to be comfortably moved about, while the well will find it a source of comfort and rest. Like our Camp Bed it is also well adapted to outdoor use. Weighs only 12 pounds.

**DIMENSIONS**—Opened: 6 feet 2 inches long; 2 feet 2 inches wide. Folded: 6 feet long by 3 inches square.

**No. 20 Gold Medal Folding Bath-Tub**—The above cut represents our Gold Medal Folding Bath-tub, which is the most complete and convenient portable bath-tub ever invented. The frame is of hard wood, rock elm, nicely finished with filler and varnished, to which we have applied the principle of our patented metal joints by means of which it folds easily and compactly. The frame thus constructed stands firmly on the floor and is kept in the same position no matter how much weight the tub contains.

The cover of this tub consists of very heavy closely woven duck which is coated, especially for us, with thoroughly refined, vulcanized rubber, cured, and thus rendered tough and pliable. We guarantee it not to crack. It is composed of a single piece in which there are no cuts or seams. As the duck is thoroughly coated with pure rubber, it has a perfectly smooth surface and is as easily cleaned as a porcelain tub. It is uninjured by strong salt, sulphur, or medicated waters. It is complete with no separate parts. A pail and a half or two pails of water make a full bath, less will answer. As the frame is firmly put together with our metal joints, and riveted, there is absolutely no danger of tipping, and we guarantee the tub to be strong enough for the heaviest person even if a full submergent bath is desired. As the tub has no separate parts it is easily taken up and carried, even when it contains water for the bath, by taking hold of the tub at both ends where the duck is folded in several thicknesses and made strong for this purpose; when taken up in this manner the rails come nearly together and not a drop of water can be spilled; hence a bath can be taken in any part of the house, and, as the entire apparatus weighs only 16 pounds, it is easily handled by any woman or even a strong child. It is not necessary to dip the water out to empty the tub, simply take hold of the rails and lift up one end, when the other end forms a trough and the water can be easily poured into a pail without spilling a drop.

The shape is well shown in our cut. It is very similar to the metallic tubs. It is not suspended, but rests on the floor about one foot in width the entire length of the tub. At the top it is about 5 feet long by 27 inches wide and is 16 inches deep; these are about the dimensions of the modern metallic tub.

It is not necessary here to indulge in a dissertation on the benefits of frequent bathing; volumes have been written on this subject and they are well understood now-a-days. The infrequency of bathing is due to a lack of suitable appliances. Most people will bathe frequently if they could do so conveniently. The use of a sponge bath and small vessels commonly used results in neither cleanliness nor satisfaction. As nine families out of ten are without suitable and convenient bathing appliances, we feel that by offering this tub at a very small price, less than one-tenth the cost of ordinary suitable apparatus, we are supplying a long felt want. It will be found always ready; only a very small amount of hot water is necessary to temper a sufficient quantity for a full bath.

These tubs have been in use for nearly a year and are giving perfect satisfaction. With proper care they will last a generation. When folded these tubs are 5 feet long by 5 inches square and weigh but 16 pounds. These tubs are recommended by all physicians and nurses to whom they have been shown.

**No. 21 Infant's Tub**—This is made of the same material as the adult tub. The tub when open is 38 inches long, 22 inches high and 16 inches wide, and when closed is 38 inches long and 4 inches square. This tub is suspended above the floor, so the mother can sit in a chair and avoid the back-breaking strain necessary in using an ordinary tub.



**No. 11 Reclining Chair**—This chair is made so that it is adjustable to four different positions when in use. It is finished in oil and covered with a good quality of fancy duck put on double in an endless piece, left movable on the frame. The frame is made of hardwood and is thoroughly tested. This chair folds more compactly than any other Reclining Chair made, and, as the Duck is double and movable, it is stronger, more comfortable and durable and in every way more desirable than other similar chairs. Weight 7 pounds.

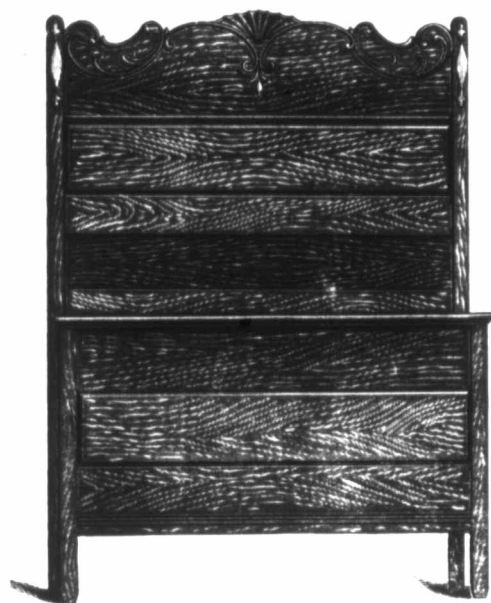

When shipping instructions are not given, we will use our best judgment as to the cheapest and best mode of sending.

We send samples and prices of cut goods free of charge, but would suggest, in order to facilitate matters, that a description as near as possible to article be given, and about price wanted, as our variety in most goods is very large, and to send samples of all would incur an enormous expense and would be impossible.

When ordering from samples, always enclose a small cut of pattern selected, and state if we may substitute, in case goods have been sold out. A second choice would greatly facilitate the filling of an order in such cases and avoid unnecessary delay.

We make no charge for packing, shipping or wharfage, which is an item of considerable importance in such goods as furniture, crockery, etc., and all goods are packed in the best manner by experienced packers.

We get receipt from transportation company that goods have been received by them in good order, after which our responsibility ceases, and any claim for damage or breakage must be made to company immediately at time of receiving goods.

Parties not having accounts with us should send references, so as to avoid any delay in shipping.

## POSTAL INFORMATION, ETC.

### 1st CLASS MATTER. Letters.

Letters addressed to places in Canada and United States, 3 cents per 1 oz. or fraction thereof.

Great Britain and all Foreign Countries, 5 cents per 1/2 oz. or fraction thereof.

Letters addressed to places in the United States must be prepaid at least one full rate (3 cents); otherwise they will be sent to the Dead Letter office.

Partly prepaid letters addressed to places in Canada will be forwarded to destination, subject on delivery to double the amount of postage remaining unpaid, and letters on which no postage has been prepaid will be sent to the Dead Letter Office.

### 2nd CLASS MATTER.

Newspapers and Periodicals published not less frequently than once a month and posted from the office of publication for transmission to regular subscribers in Canada, the United States and New Foundland, are sent free of postage. All specimen copies and all copies of publications published less frequently than once a month, must be prepaid 1 cent for each pound or fraction of a pound.

### 3rd CLASS MATTER.

Matter of this class must be so packed or put up as to be easily opened for examination, and there must be no correspondence enclosed.

### Patterns and Samples.

*Bona fide Patterns and Samples of Mereandise*, not exceeding 24 ounces in weight, may be sent to any place in Canada at 1 cent per 4 ounces. Must be put up so as to admit of inspection. Goods sent in execution of an order, however small the quantity may be, or articles sent by one private individual by another, *not being actually Trade Patterns or Samples*, are not admissible as such. A sample of tea is limited to half a pound. The limit of weight to the United States is eight ounces. The limit of weight to Great Britain is 2 ounces. Limit of weight to the United Kingdom is 5 lbs.; dimensions, 2 feet in length, 1 foot in width and depth.

### 4th CLASS MATTER Parcels.

Parcels should be plainly addressed, and there must be no correspondence enclosed.

Parcels for Canada must be prepaid 6 cents for 4 ounces, and must not exceed 5 lbs. in weight nor two feet in length by one foot in width or depth, and the senders name should be written on the lower left hand corner.

### 5th CLASS MATTER.

Comprises such articles of general men's merchandise as are not entitled to any lower rate of postage. Postage 1 cent per oz. or fraction of an oz. Limit of weight 5 lbs.; of size 2 feet in length by one foot in width or depth. Matter claiming to be 5th class *must be open to inspection* and there must be no correspondence enclosed. Packages of 5th Class Matter may be sent to the United States for the same prepayment as is required within the Dominion, but the contents will be liable to Customs inspection and collection of duty in the United States. Sealed Tins containing Fish, Lobsters, Vegetables, Meat, etc., if put up in a solid manner and labelled in such a way as to fully indicate the nature of their contents, may be sent as 5th Class matter within the Dominion, but no sealed tin can be forwarded to the United States under this head. Liquids, oils and fatty substances may be sent to places in Canada and the United States as 5th Class, if put up in accordance with the ruling referring to such articles in the Canada Postal Guide for 1891, page xiv.

### REGISTRATION.

All classes of matter addressed to places in Canada, the United States, New Foundland, Great Britain or any Postal Union Country may be registered for a fee of five cents for each article in addition to the Postage, and letters may be registered to most of the countries not included in the Union.

Every article intended for registration *must be handed in at the wicket*, and a receipt obtained therefor. *No receipt must be dropped into a letter box*. The registration fee should be paid by registration stamp.

The sender of a registered article addressed to any Postal Union Country may entitle himself to a certificate as to the disposal of said article by the Postmaster at the office addressed, on prepayment of an additional fee of 5 cents.

It will be seen from the above that the marine freight-carrying trade on the Pacific coast already almost equals two-thirds of that on the Atlantic at the above principal ports, and that the proportion of tonnage per ship is nearly 3 to 2, indicating a larger average class of vessels.
