A DISTINGUISHED VISITOR.

Hon. David A. Wells, a political economist of considerable note in the United States, arrived in the city last evening, accompanied by several notable gentlemen, mention of whom will be found in another column.

Mr. Wells has taken a high place among American economists. Among his best known works are, "The Primer of Free Trade," "Why We Trade and How We Trade," "Our Merchant Marine," "Practical Economics," and "A Study of Mercantile Policy."

Beginning with the July number of last year he contributed to the Popular Science Monthly a masterly series of articles on the "Economic Disturbances Since 1873." These articles, extended and rewritten, are to appear in book form next autumn.

It is improbable that to know an observer and lucid writer will traverse the Dominion without finding material for his notebook. Personally, Mr. Wells is a man of less than medium height, with a very intelligent face and a highly nervous temperament.

Mr. Wells first came to the attention of the public in 1840 when he entered the Lawrence Scientific School at Harvard University, becoming also at the same time a special pupil of Professor Agassiz, who had then recently returned from America.

On graduating in the Scientific School he received the appointment of assistant professor, and also that of lecturer on physics and chemistry in Groton Academy, Massachusetts. During his residence in Cambridge, Mr. Wells was one of the publishers of the "Annals of Scientific Discovery," and was also engaged in the preparation of a series of scientific school-books, which enjoyed an extensive circulation.

Mr. Wells first came prominently into public life in 1864, while residing in Troy, New York, through the publication of an essay on the resources and debt-paying ability of the United States, bearing the title, "Our Burden and Strength."

This essay, first read at a literary and social club in Troy, became one of the most famous publications of the war period, coming at a time when the nation was alarmed at the prospective magnitude of the public debt, and apprehensive of an impending crushing burden of taxation.
