quidation-La Banque Nationale. OTTAWA, April 9.—At 10.30 this morning Mr. H. C. Hammond, President, and Mr. G. W. Yarker, General Manager of the Federal Bank of Canada, were pacing rapidly up and down Banking and Commerce Committee was in ses-sion. Inside Mr. Nicol Kingsmill, the bank's Banking and Commerce Committee was in session. Mr. Kingsmill's explanation to the committee was so satisfactory that neither Mr. Yarker nor Mr. Hammond was called to give any evidence, although they came down from Toronto to do so in case of necessity. The bill was accordingly reported without nuch delay, and Mr. Yarker was enabled to go holidaying in the capital, visiting Government House, Mr. and Mrs. Cackburn and many other friends.

Mr. Kingsmill explained to the committee the unfortunate circumstances which had overtaken the Federal and which had forced the bank into open liquidation. The bill before the committee, he said, was entirely satisfactory to all concerned, oven to the Finance Department, to which it had been submitted.
