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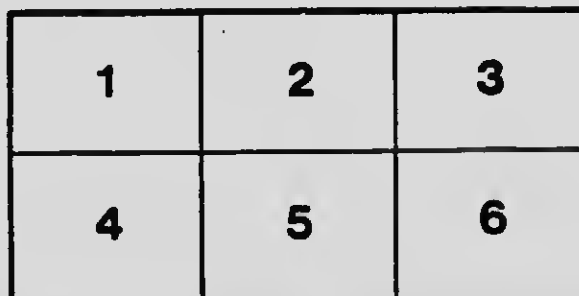
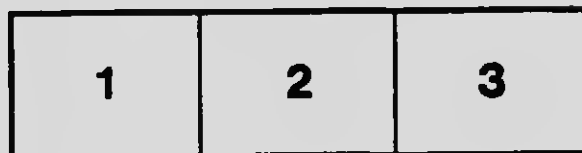
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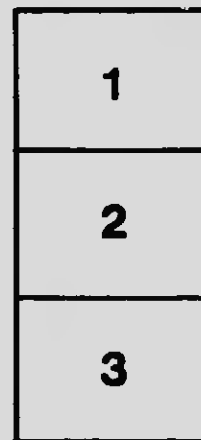

THE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY AND ITS WORK

ALTHOUGH the Woman's Auxiliary to the John H. Stratford Hospital is only a little over three years old, a great deal has been accomplished. In June, 1903, the following officers were elected: President, Mrs. Frank Cockshutt; Vice-Presidents, Mrs. John Hopa and Mrs. R. S. Scheil; Secretary, Mrs. T. H. Whitehead; Treasurer, Mrs. Jeffrey Hale. The Executive Committee: Mrs. Julius Waterous, Mrs. Church'li Livingston, Miss J. L. Sutherland and Officers.

During their officiate they purchased an ambulance, costing \$410.00, for the use of the Contagious Disease Hospital, and a laundry was erected and equipped with best steam plant at a cost of \$2548.85. Brantford ladies donated a good deal of linen and china and a sitting room was furnished for the nurses. The election of officers took place on June 2nd, 1903, and resulted in the following: President, Mrs. T. H. Cockshutt; 1st Vice President, Mrs. W. C. Livingston; 2nd Vice-President, Mrs. Julius Waterous; Treasurer, Mrs. Geo. Watt; Secretary, Miss J. L. Sutherland. A Committee of 12 ladies was appointed to visit the hospital during the year and provide the patients with flowers, magazines, fruits and jellies. Money has been raised in the following ways: From Parade, held in June, 1905; from executive Amalgamated Shops Excursions, 1905-6; from Women's Musical Club; from Rummage Sale, held in October, 1905; carnival at Waterloo Street rink; Hospital Sunday held in the churches, June, 1906; house-hall games and fares on the cars. An elevator was installed in the hospital at a cost of \$1556.00, the City Council giving \$778.00.

A Nurses' Home Necessary



A PRINCIPAL factor in connection with all well organized hospitals is a training school and separate home for nurses. Young women in this institution enter on a three-year term. One feature which has militated more than any other against the John H. Stratford hospital has been want of sleeping accommodation for the nursing staff, which has necessarily restricted the number of nurses out of all proportion to the growth of the hospital. To-day there is no greater number than existed in the early stages of the institution, when its bed capacity was 35. At the present moment, with the addition of the Isolation hospital, the bed capacity is 80.

To get best results, nurses must be educated in the home training school, not only in the high art of nursing, cooking, massage, general efficiency and other factors that go to make up a reliable, useful woman for hospital work, as well as outside nursing in the homes of our citizens at a moderate charge, while it is imperative there should be a relay at all times to draw from in case of epidemic or serious accident. This is a cardinal rule in all well-equipped hospitals.

To the doctor in attendance on the patient a trusty nurse is simply invaluable—to the patient, absolutely indispensable, while it is conceded by the profession that two-thirds of all the recoveries, especially in typhoid, come from good day and night nursing and best sanitary surroundings. The history of the nurses' splendid work should be more largely written and more largely studied in every home.

It is for a Nurses' Home that the W. H. A. of the John H. Stratford hospital is now working and that the Poster Show is being held. The object is a very worthy one, and it is not surprising that it is being heartily supported by all classes of Brantford's citizens.

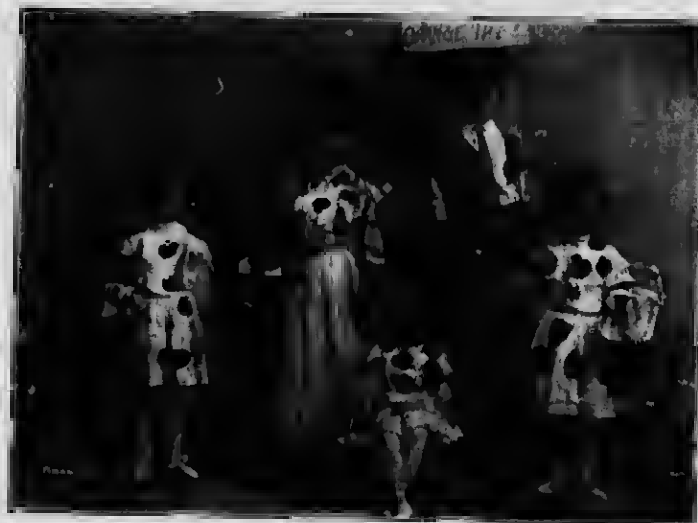

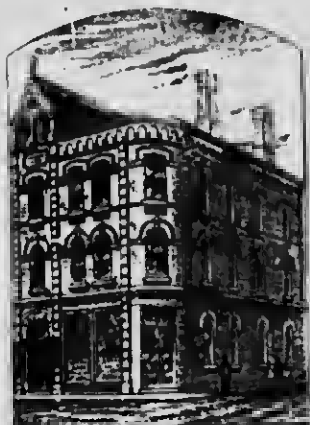

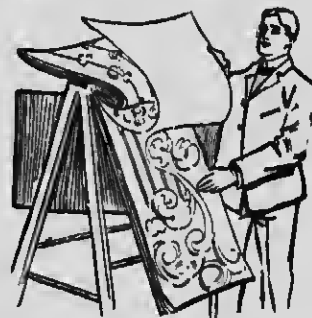

INDIAN BOOTH

The Indian Booth represents an encampment of Indians, with one wigwam and a campfire, over which a kettle is hung. In the back ground is the rough shelter, so often found in the much-frequented camping grounds. In this case the shelter is used for the display and sale of Indian baskets, mocassins, beadwork and birch bark. In the wigwams, one may see, for a small admission fee, a good representation of the Hospital Hill, many years ago, before the settlement of the white man. At the back of the booth a small space has been reserved where white boys and girls may compete at the Indian pastime of shooting with bow and arrows. The entrance to this is at the side of the booth.

One of the chief attractions at this camp is a large candle (made from the fat of wild (?) animals), which will be burning each evening to light the booth. This candle will be an exhibition for two weeks in a store window, so that all who so desire may have an opportunity to guess how long it will burn, and register their votes. A blanket has been donated as a prize for the one guessing nearest.
