

LEGAL.

TERRITORIAL LIMITS.

The Judicial District of Simcoe,

Includes the County of Simcoe proper, and for general judicial purposes comprehends the "Territorial District of Muskoka," and "Territorial District of Parry Sound."

The County of Simcoe consists of the Townships of "Adjala, Essa, Flos, West Gwillimbury, Innisfil, Matchedash, "Medonte, Nottawasaga, Orillia, Oro, Sunnidale, Tay, Tecumseth, Tiny, Tossorontio, and Vespra—together with the tract of land bounded on the east by the line forming the easterly boundary of the Townships of Morrison, Muskoka, Monek, Watt and Cardwell, produced northerly to French River; on the north by French River; on the west by the waters of the Georgian Bay; and on the south by the River Severn and Township of Rama, including the Islands in Lake Simcoe and the Georgian Bay, lying wholly or for the most part opposite to the said County of Simcoe, or any part thereof, and contiguous thereto. The Towns of Barrie, Collingwood, Orillia and Penetanguishene, and the Villages of Alliston, Beeton, Bradford, Gravenhurst, Stayner, Midland and Tottenham."

"The Territorial District of Muskoka" is bounded as follows:—"On the south by the middle of the main channel of the River Severn, and a line formed by the southerly boundaries of the Townships of Morrison and Ryde, the easterly boundary of Ryde, the southerly boundary of the Township of Oakley, the easterly boundary of Oakley, and the southerly boundary of the Township of Ridout; bounded on the east by the Bobcaygeon road and the line surveyed for the continuation of the said road; on the north by the southerly boundary of the Territorial District of Parry Sound; on the west by the waters of the Georgian Bay; including the Islands of the Georgian Bay, lying west of the said Territory and adjacent thereto."

"The Territorial District of Parry Sound" is bounded as follows: -- "Commencing at a point where the southerly "boundary of the Township of Humphrey, produced on a course " south sixty nine degrees eight minutes and twenty seconds west, "intersects the waters of the Georgian Bay; thence north sixty-nine "degrees eight minutes and twenty seconds east along the said boundary produced and along the southerly boundaries of the "Townships of Conger and Humphrey, to the south-east corner of "the Township of Humphrey; thence northerly along the easterly boundary of Humphrey to the north-east corner of Humphrey; "thence easterly along the northerly boundaries of the Townships of "Cardwell, Stisted and Chaffey to the north-east corner of the said, "Township of Chaffey; thence north sixty-nine degrees, eight "minutes and twenty seconds east to the line surveyed for the con-"tinuation of the Bobcaygeon road; thence north twenty degrees, fifty-one minutes and forty seconds west, along the said line to the "middle of the main channel of Lake Nipissing; thence westerly " along the main channel of said Lake and along the main channel of "French River to its most westerly mouth, at the intersection of the "easterly boundary of the District of Algoma with the waters of the "Georgian Bay; thence south-easterly along the east shore of the "said Georgian Bay to the place of beginning, including Parry "Island and the islands opposite to and along the shore of the said " District."

All accounts must be in the hands of the Clerk of the Peace not later than the first week of the quarter. Any account received after that time will be laid over till the next audit.

Suggestions to Magistrates and Constables.

Inasmuch as constables' accounts are often thrown out by the Board of Audit, owing to defects in the certificates of the Magistrates who vouch for the services performed, it is important that the following suggestions be carefully observed;

1 All unnecessary portions of the printed certificate should be struck out before it is signed, so that it will appear whether

- (a) The prisoner was committed for trial, or
- (b) Committed for a period certain, or
- (c) Discharged, and

odddal ne ayenieryndis

(d) Whether he was admitted to bail.

Magistrates would greatly assist constables in obtaining payment of

their accounts, if they would see that the following requirements are observed when the accounts are submitted to them to be certified:

- 1. The name of the prisoner set out.
- 2. The offence with which he was charged.
- 3. The mileage to and from any particular place, giving the town, village, lot and concession of township, &c.
- 4. The affidavit to be made by the constable carefully filled up, and the date given in the jurat.
- 5. The day, month and year must be given for each particular item of the account.
- 6. Claims against the County not to be included with those against the Government.
- 7. As blank forms are now printed on quarter sheets, it is suggested that in criminal matters, every case should have a separate sheet.
- 8. Claims in respect of inquests must not be included with any other claim.

Magistrates in making their quarterly returns to the Clerk of the Peace, will oblige by informing him at the same time of any Justices or Constables who have died or left the place since his last return.
