THE R. C. PRIEST, RICHIBUCTO—The Rev. Father, who has been at Richibucto on Tuesday of last week, netted \$300, a handsome sum considering the stringency of the times.

NEW MARRIAGE—The contract for building the manse, which the Presbyterians of the Parish of Richibucto propose erecting, has been awarded to Messrs. Lancaster and Little for \$1,500. The building will be completed during the summer of next year.

IN THE COURTS—The Editor of the St. John Sun has been visiting his Kent County friends lately. It is to be expected that he will be in the vicinity of the town of St. John's, N. B., in the morning by the Rev. S. T. Teed, pastor of the church, and in the evening by the Rev. John Prince ex-President of the Conference of New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island.

RECENTLY V. WILLSTON, Esq., M. D., has located himself at Richibucto. He graduated with honors at McGill College, Montreal, a few months since, and will, doubtless, do a fair field in the neighboring County for the practice of his profession.

AN ACCIDENT—Bark "Stanley," of Masard (Newport), from Glasgow, in ballast, for Miramichi, was abandoned at 2 o'clock on the morning of the 21st ult. lat. 44° 57', lon. 49° 01', in a sinking condition. Capt. A. S. Adams and the crew, exhausted by pumping and exposure, were taken off by the bark "Fris" (New), Capt. Carlson, to Philadelphia, from Kilmuch.

SUDDEN DEATH—Dr. J. E. James, son of J. A. James, Esq., Richibucto, died very suddenly at his father's residence, Richibucto, on Monday. Dr. James had been in poor health for some time past, but his death was quite unexpected. He walked across the floor of his room and seated himself on a chair, from which he fell to the floor, and immediately expired.

THE SHIP "ELIZA KERRY"—On Friday evening last 8 o'clock the Ship Eliza Kerry, which had grounded on the Horse Shoe Bar, was got off without sustaining any damage, after three nights work, the tugs Relief, Laidie, and Sultan, being assisted by the Steam Dredge in the work. The vessel had to discharge her deckload before being taken off.

A RAID was made on the wine vaults of Mr. McLean of the "Kingston House," Kingston, Kent, on the night of Monday last. The spiritually inclined raiders not satisfied with carrying away quantities of the "ardent" left the "kaps" open, and the loss is estimated to be to the general health of the neighborhood.

STABBED—On Saturday night about 9 o'clock, a well-known sailor named Jorgensen, was set upon in Upper Foundry Lane by three young men, and stabbed in the left side. He was taken by Policemen James Reynolds, to Dr. McKeown's surgery. The wound, although rather deep, was not very dangerous and the man is doing well. The young men concerned in this affair have since left town.

SINGULAR ESCAPE—On the arrival at this port of the bark "Stanley" on the morning of the 25th Aug., a little before daylight, a young French seaman on board fell from the fore-top-gallant yard, a distance of about 70 ft. to the deck. It is probable he struck the yard below in his descent. It is a singular fact that the only injury he sustained in addition to some bruises, was a simple fracture of the left thigh bone which was set by Dr. McKeown. He was then taken to the Marine Hospital, where he is doing well.

A CHARGE BROUGHT AT SEA—The Norwegian bark "Tosca," bound from St. Nazaire to Chatham, on July 29th, long. 12° latitude 48°, was boarded in the evening by a carrier pigeon. The bird's wings were each marked "Menard Antoni, Brucoguedes, No. 77." On the left wing there was also an oval stamp, the words on which, as far as could be made out, were "Noel, Delaigie, Charleat." On the whole the memoranda were more decorative than intelligible; and it was probably under this conviction that the bird continued to come to earth.

ESTATE CASE—The case of George McKean vs. A. Davidson and Sheriff Vail was tried in the Gloucester Circuit Court the other day, and resulted in a verdict for the plaintiff for \$325. The defendant, acting for Robert Rankine, of Liverpool, had seized debts which Mr. McKean had received from Ferguson, Rankine & Co. Mr. Thomson, who appeared for the plaintiff, "went far" the defendant in a lively manner. In the judgment of the Court Rankine is liable for \$325, and a Globe was returned for the plaintiff.

A SEVERE THUNDERSTORM passed over a portion of Kent County on Monday night, Sept. 1st. The house of Mr. Bartholomew Richard, (situated near the parish line between Richibucto and Westington), was struck by lightning and considerably damaged. The telegraph poles in the vicinity of Richard's house, for the distance of nearly a mile were more or less damaged, some being split in two. The recent heavy rains in Kent have retarded the farmers' harvesting operations. In some cases the wheat and oats have remained in stock for nearly a fortnight.

"MARRIAGE" FOR SEA—Capt. Mitchell of the bark "Luzerne" has purchased the bay colt "Mahomet" from Edward Sinclair, Esq., of Alexander King, Esq., a Belfast Merchant, and intends to take the animal home with him in that vessel. Mahomet is a promising three-year-old and we are informed that he comes of excellent stock having been sired by "Woodbrook Messenger" which is undoubtedly a guarantee for future fame. He has for dam Mr. Sinclair's beautiful driving mare "Mattie" which combines "Black Hawk and Messenger" blood. The parties interested were exercised about getting "Mahomet" on board the bark which is at present loading at Mr. Sinclair's Mill in Bridgetown, but although an unbroken colt, he deliberately walked up the gangway and seemed to feel himself one of the ship's company once Captain Mitchell's numerous friends wish him a satisfactory run and good luck with his passenger.

DROCKED—On Monday morning at 9 o'clock, Coroner Dr. J. S. Benson held

an inquest on the body of W. J. Gunn, a lad 9 years of age, son of Mr. William Gunn, joiner, Chatham. It appears that he and his elder brother, John Gunn, were sent by their mother with a parcel of clean clothes to the barque "Fris," lying at Snowfall's Mill wharf. The deceased was on the stage leading from the wharf to the vessel, intending to receive the parcel from his brother. He happened to tread on a plank not very well secured which tilted and threw him into the river. The deceased's brother gave the boatman the second mate of the French bark, Providence, who immediately stripped and dived twice to reach the wharf and ship, but in consequence of the small space between the two, he failed in rescuing him, although he felt him the first time. After deceased sank he never came completely to the surface again. His body was found about 8.30 on Sunday morning. A verdict of \$10,000 to be designated the "Relief and Extension Fund." The object of the proposed fund is, 1st, to pay the debt which the Missionary Society is now burdened, 2nd, to extend the work of Missionary operations, and 3rd, to aid other enterprises of the church.
