OTTAWA, April 22.
Despatches from Washington have
been received regarding the violation of
the Washington Treaty by the United
States Government in imposing customs
duties on packages containing preserved
fish. It is reported a demand is now to
be made through the Imperial Government
for reparation of injury done, and
forfeiture of observance of Treaty stipulations.

QUEBEC, April 22.
Capt. Wylie, of steamship Manitoba,
reports passed through one hundred
miles of field ice this side of Bird Rocks.

NEW YORK, April 22.
By the fire at Oshkosh all the newspaper
offices, banks, telegraph offices, Har-
ding's opera house, post office, Universalist
church, all the hotels but one, and
nearly all the business portion of the city,
were destroyed. Several persons were
killed by falling walls. The burnt dis-
trict is a mile and a half long and half
mile wide. Hundreds of persons are
homeless.

A committee of the Prussian Diet has
proposed a bill declaring that the old
Catholics are entitled to a share of the
Roman Catholic churches' cemeteries and
revenues proportionate to their numbers
as compared with other Catholics.

BERLIN'S ASSAULT.
The Times special despatch from Ber-
lin reports that the Belgian Minister of
Justice has made an explicit statement
that the Belgian courts are incompetent
to take up the proceedings against
Duchess, and that this statement has
been transmitted to the Berlin Govern-
ment.
