Women With Heart Disease Can Bear Children Safely

Most young women with heart disease can bear children safely by foilowing their doctors' instructions, according to a new booklet. "Heart Disease and Pregnancy," published recently by the American Heart Association and its affiliates, 44 E. Twenty-third Street, New York.

Answering the question, "Does childbearing tend to shorten the lives of women with heart disease?" the booklet reports that studies have been made of two groups of women with rheumatic heart diseas-those who have had children and those who have not. There was no differenec in the life span of these two groups.

Too often a doctor is not consulted early enough in pregnancy to yive the patient the frequent and regular checkups she should have, the booklet points out. The four dangers against which doctors warn pregnant women who have heart disease are: 1, Overfatigue; 2, Overweight; 3, Infection; 4, Tight clothing. The booklet urges women with heart disease to observe strictly the some com ton-sense rules which apply to all pregnancies. These are: Diet, rest, weight control, and proper clothing.

LARRY DOBY SIGNS '53 TRIBE CONTRACT

Tucson, Ariz. - Larry Doby. hardhitting Cleveland Indian centerfielder, who has been an "official" holdout since March 1, finally came to terms with the Tribe here Monday when he placed his signature on a contract for the 1953 season.

Doby, who led the American League in home runs last season, reportedly received an increase in salary amounting to about \$5,000. The contract is eypected to place Doby in the \$28,000 bracket.

Doby, who arrived here from his home in New Jersey Sunday, said he was "well satisfied' with the final ocer made him by General Manager Hank Greenberg.

While his batting average slipped last season to .276, Doby still managed to clout thirty-two home runs and drive in 104 runs. He also scored 104 runs.



WHY EGGS FOR EASTER? By David Gunston

The giving of eggs at Easter time is no chance celebration of the sea-To early man an egg was the symbol of the universe, of the all-powerful work of the Supreme Divinity, and there are traces in theology-in the writings of the Romans Greeks, Egyptians and Persians of the significance of eggs at the primitive spring celebrations long before Easter had a Christian significance Even today the natives of Hawaii and the Australian aborigines still se certain rites in which an egg figures prominently.

Since the Christian era the egg has symbolized the Resurrection, the com ing of a living thing out of an apparently dead object by breaking through the captive walls. It is clear that the older races had the same basic idea behind their egg customs, and even today we still rightly regard the egg as something of a mir-From the smallest eggs often grow the largest creatures.

Soon after the adoption of the egg as a symbol of Christian significance it became the custom to stain Easter eggs red to commemorate the blood of Christ, and eggs thus became bound up with Paschall sacrifices and ritual.

Also, before the Reformation eggs were first eaten again on Easter Day after forty days' obstention from such rich food during Lent.

The custom of giving one an other Easter eggs is very old, and the recipient of such an egg was held to partake in the rebirth of life. In mediaeval times English bishops took hard-boiled eggs into church on Easter Sunday, and at the start of the Antiphon they would begin to dance throwing their eggs to the choristers who tossed them to one another until the music ceased. At the close of the service everyone adjourned to an Easter feast of gammon and tansy pudding. Parents vould send eggs to church to be blessed for Easter and sprinkled with holy water by the priests. Unnallowed eggs were thrown at one nother by the children.

NAACP OPPOSES WEAKENING

OF N.Y. CHILD LABOR LAWS Albany, March 12-The National Association for the Advancement of Colored People last week vigorously urged state senators and assemblymen to vote against the Wadlin-Hatfield bills to amend the state's child labor laws so as to permit employment of children under 14 in farm work during the non-school period with no provision for maximum

Herbert Hill, NAACP labor relations assistant, led a delegation consisting of Mrs. Effie Gordon, president of the N.Y. State Conference of NAACP branches; Edward Gamarekian, president of the Schenectady branch; and Sol Markoff, of the National Child Labor Committee, in visits to state legislators urging defeat of the bills. Several senators and assemblymen, including Assembly minority Leader Eugene Banning ton and Assemblyman Hulan Jack. and Senators Zaretsky and Metcalf of the Senate Labor Committee. pledged support to the NAACP.

Mr. Hill said that the Wadlin-Hatfield bills refer to the children of Negro migratory workers, some twenty thousand of whom come to New York State to harvest crops during the summer and early fall. "The proposal to exclude these children from the protection of the N.Y. State child labor law would constitute an act of racial discrimination,' the NAACP representative declared.

The forty-three branches of the Association in N.Y. State sent telegrams to majority and minority lead ers in both houses of the legislature urging that the bills be voted down




