The "Big Six" of the nation's civil rights leaders are plying a prominent role in developing an "action -oriented" agenda for the White House Conference on Civil Rights, to be held on June 1 and 2.

The Council which is comprised of a cross section of national I eaders is holding a series of weekend "work sessions" at the White House to work out the format and a substantive agen-da for the historic Conference.

Among those serving on the Council are: A. Philip Randolph, the dean of the civil rights leaders, who is also Honorary Chairman of the Conference: Roy Wilkins, Executive Director, National Association for the Advancement of Colored People; Whitney M. Young, Jr., Executive Director, National Urban League; Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr., President, Southern Christian Leadership Conference; Floyd McKissick, National Director, John Lewis, Chairman, Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee and Miss Dorothy Height. President, National Council of Negro Women.

President Lyndon B Johnson proposed the Conference in his commencement address at Howard University last June 4 when he said its object would be "to help the American Negro fulfill the rights which after the long time of injustice, he is finally about to secure.







Roll of the Student And Army Elites . . . Max Lerner

There is one aspect of two widely separated struggles—in Ghana and Indonesia—that is worth more than passing notice. It is the role of the student elite and its relation to the army elite. In Ghana the revolution was made by the army, but in its wake the students have come to ratify and validate it by their joyous demonstrations of support for the new regime. In Indonesia where Sukarno managed to split the army leadership and play off Gen. Suharto against Gen. Nasution, the students have been demonstrating against Sukarno and his segment of the army leadership.

In both countries, as in many other developing nations, a good deal of future history will depend on what stand the intellectual elite in the universities takes in relation to the military elite.

The reason is fairly obvious. Most of the developing countries have no middle class to speak of, and no economic elite. While some of them have nuclei of civil servants carrying over from pre-independence days, they have not (except in India) developed a real administrative elite. Thus between the masses of the people on one side and the top single-party elite on the other, only the army and the students can exert any important influence on the movement of events.

Each operates in its own way. The army has the decisive power, in fact the only hard concrete power in the whole nation.



> In London, the British government expressed its concern to Portugal about the flow of oil from Portuguese Mozambique to Rhodesia despite the sanctions against the rebel colony. Though it has twice expressed itself to South Africa, Britain does not appear to be fretted over South Africa's assistance to Rhodesia. This is rather puzzling. Britain's Prime Ministetr Harold Wilson is stronger to-day politically than he was at the beginning of the African crisis. His firm stand against the rebel colony and his efforts to bring peace to Southeast Asia have creat ed a climate of opinion surprisingly favorable to him. Apparently, he is unwilling or unprepared to toss more fat into the fire by bringing South Africa into the focas of the Rhodesia crisis.




