Legends Tell About Hymn

Stories and legends sur-round most of the modern ways of celebrating Christmas — and sometimes there is more than one version of a story — such as the story of "Silent Night" and how the song came to be written.

Joseph Mohr, village priest of Hallein, Austria, wrote the words, and his organist wrote the music, probably adapted from a melody by Michael Haydn. On this point, most sources seem to be agreed.

What inspired Father Mohr to write the words is another story-or another two stor

One version, say researchers for The Book of Know-ledge, is that Father Mohr was called out into the snow on Christmas Eve of 1818, to bless a newly born baby in the home of one of his poorest parishioners.

He was so filled with the spirit of the season and the simple beauty of the mother and infant that when he returned to his study he wrote the poem, "Silent Night." Other versions have it that the church organ had broken the church organ had broken down (impaired by mice, one story says), and the people were saddened because there would be no music for Christmas Day. Shortly before Christmas, Father Mohr wrote his poem and Organist Gruber the music.

At midnight mass, the people sang "Silent Night"—with a guitar accompaniment.

Orphaned young and left a considerable fortune, Nicholas was imbued with two great interests-a deep admiration for Jesus Christ and a desire to imitate Him in deeds of kindness and charity.

Nicholas came to be so respected by his fellow-citizens that, at the age of 19, he was elected Bishop of Myra. Persecuted by the Emperor Diocletian, Nicholas was thrown into prison and released shortbefore his death in 343 A.

Canonized by Church

Nicholas was later canoniz-ed by his church and evenbecame the patron saint of children, sailors and bankers

The many deeds of kindness and charity which St. Nicholas carried out during his lifetime have become legen-

One story tells how he overheard a destitute merchant say that he planned to sell his three daughters because he had no money to provide suitable dowries for them.

Nicholas set out for the merchant's house and threw a purse of gold through the bedroom windows of the oldest and the second-oldest daughters. When he came to the window of the youngest daughter, however, he found that it was closed.

Refusing to admit defeat, Nicholas scaled the roof and dropped a purse of gold down the chimney. The purse fell into a stocking hung over the fireplace to dry, and it is from this action of Nicholas that the custom of hanging-up stockings on Christmas Eve is

The legend of St. Nicholas gradually travelled northward, through Russia to Lapland. Not having any horses, the Laplanders transferred St. Nicholas from his traditional drawn sleigh. The Laplanders also furnished him with a furFrom the Laplanders, the demeanours.

According to legend, Thor, ed to have ridden through the sky in a chariot drawn by two goats, in order to make an appearance at the traditional Feast of the Yule.

These goats subsequently gave way to reindeer, while Thor's red coat became trimmed with white fur.

Christmas Man Substituted

During the Reformation in Europe, the Feast of St. Nicholas was abolished in many countries. In place of the Saint, a "Christmas Man" was substituted.

Throughout this period of history, only a trace of the traditional Christmas Saint re- bought Manhattan Island from

In England, for instance, the "Boy Bishop" was honoured

During this ceremony, the outstanding boy of the local school was chosen and garbed in a bishop's robes. Wearing his miter and carrying a crozier, he would ride through town on a white horse and all were subject to his rule from

December 5 to December 28. This custom was abolished by Henry VIII in 1542, reinstated by Mary and finally ended by Elizabeth I.

In Holland, however, the people stubbornly clung to the tradition of St. Nicholas, although in that country he was known as Sinter Klaas.

Sinter Klaas, accompanied by his servant, Black Peter, usually rode into town on a

The character of Black Peter originated during the Spanish occupation of the Netherlands. At that time, gentlemen were invariably accompanied by Moorish or African

Carried to North America

The story of St. Nicholas was carried to North America by the Dutch colonists, who the Indians in 1626 and founded New Amsterdam or, as it later became, New York

As thousands of English settlers poured into North America, these newcomers found the kindly and generous character of Sinter Klaas more appealing than their "Christmas Man" and they adopted the former as their own.

Later, Swedish settlers added their traditions of the reindeer coming through the sky and of the red coat trimmed with fur

In 1880, the respective celebrations were combined into one and observed on December 25.

The characters of "Black Peter" and the white horse, however, disappeared. Black Peter was abolished because

of the widespread disapproval; Before Christmas." slavery that existed in the northern American states at that time; in the case of the white horse, it was felt that reindeer added more of a magical touch to the Christmas tradition.

With the wide variations in the legend of Santa Claus, it became necessary for someone to co-ordinate them, and this was done in 1822 by Dr. Clement Moore, a professor of

There is also the belief that legend. According to the leg-carol' comes from the Greek end, bees used to gather on word for flute player, in compliment to the musicians who played for the Christmas ringdancers. Still another thought is that carols originated with the songs of the Romans Sat-urnalia.

The name, 'Father of the Christmas Carol." is often given to St. Francis of Assisi.
At Greecio in 1224, he aranged a Nativity scene and led the singing of songs of praise to the Christ Child. Although Although the words and carols had been sung eorlier this act by St. Francis gave impetus to the idea of happy singing at the Christmas sea-

> Early carols were in Latin. As carols gained popularity during the fourtenth and fifteenth centuries many people preferred to sing in their own languages, and new carols were developed.

The growth of carols was helped along by 'wassailing' or 'gooding' expeditions. Children went from house to Good Wishes. house, singing songs and receiving treats

Later, English people learned carols from printed 'broad-sides' which sold for a pen-ny. When the Puritans a-bolished holiday observances in theh seventeenth century, the broadsides were still print ed and 'bootlegged' to the


