Bring the Children On Over

Madame Eugenie Masour of Paris, leader in child welfare work in France spoke recently to the Toronto section of the National Council of Women. She made a plea for Canadian homes for 1,000 European orphans who are being brought to this country through the agency of the Canadian Jewish Congress. . Mme Masour has already escorted the first group of these children from camps in France and Switzerland to Montreal. An additional 350 are expected at the end of this month.

We recommend this action of the Canadian Jewish Congress to all our citizens. Jewish children who have undergone privations and terrors during the Nazi ascendancy will find in this country refuge and the opportunity to develop normally. They will also contribute their manpower and ability to Canada's development. But we think that the scheme is not wide enough in its scope.

Children are potentially the best immigrants. Older folk who have suffered grievously from war and Nazi oppression are to be pitled and succoured, but the older they are the less likely they are to adapt themselves to a new country and new conditions. Even a sixteen-year-old German boy is not certain to become a good Canadian, for he has had a dozen years of Nazi indoctrination. A child who is brought to this country before it is in its 'teens will grow up as a Canadian, speak our language as its own, and have almost no recollection of any other homeland.

Child immigration should not be confined to Jews. There are thousands of German children who were babies when orphaned or left destitute. There are thousands of illegitimate children homeless or unwittingly housed in half a dozen European countries. In Holland, as in Britain, Belgium, France, Italy and even Germany there are untold hundreds of children between the ages of three and eight whose unknown fathers are or were healthy, lusty Canadian soldiers, sailors and air-

The Dutch-Canadian, Belgian-Can adian and other good Canadian bastards are already by their pataernity half Canadian. They would truly become worthy citizens if they were brought here and treated properly. We should like to see the Immigration Branch with the assistance of child welfare organizations undertake an extensive scheme for transporting these as well as orphaned to occupy useful places in our communities. That kind of scheme is the nearest we can come to the increment of our population through natural means.
