Speedy Test

A new laboratory test, developed by Dr. Albert Coons of Harvard Medical School, will enable physicians to diagnose and begin treatment of streptococcal infections within 2-3 hours. #### DAN HUGHES DIES AT 112, WAS LOUISVILLE'S OLDEST

LOUISVILLE, Ky. — Dan Hughes died at the home of his daughter shortly after telling relatives: "I'm tired. I want to go home." He was 112 and possibly Louisville's old-

Hughes was born in Crittenden County, Aug. 10, 1847.
Deeply religious, he was for 63 years a deacon of Main Street Free Will Baptist Church, Marion, which is about 20 miles from his birthplace. Funeral service was held at the church with bur-ial in the church cemetery. Shortly before his 112th

birthday party, Hughes touched of a controversy when he jokingly told a reporter he would be more excited "if I could get a quart of whisky.' Later his grandson, the Rev. J. C. Wilson, pastor of Beebe Chapel, explained that Hughes was just joking.

He gets a kick out of joking about whisky, but that's the only kick he gets from it," Wilson explained.




