Composer Is Chosen

Handy, who fought blindness and poverty to become an outstanding composer of blues and spirituals, has become the fourteenth outstanding American Negro to be elected to the EBONY Hall of Fame.

Handy, "whose songs will be sung and played by choristers and jazz trumpets as long as there is a place in the world for deeply felt music," is the fourth person elected. On the EBONY magazine's tenth anniversary the editors named ten distinguished Negroes.

Composer of the world-famous "St. Louis Blues," Handy made a major contribution to the establishment of the blues as America's only cultural export.

Other outstanding members of the Hall of Fame, individuals whose contributions to the progress and achievement of the Negro in American life were outstanding include: Mary Mc-Leod Bethune, Dr. George Washington Carver, Walter Francis White, Booker T. Washington, Dr. Danial Hale Williams, Harriet Tubman, Frederick Douglass, Benjamin Banneker, Sojourner Truth, Crispus Attucks, Madame C. J. Walker, Dr. Charles Spurgeon Johnson, and Carter G. Woodson.

Eye Operation Restores Sight

VANCOUVER (CP)—Hundreds of persons in Vancouver see their surcoundings through the corneas of eyes that belong to others. They are the fortunate minority whose fading sight has been saved by transplantion of the

So far, the cornea, or pupil—the clear, transparent lens-is the only part of the eye that can be transplanted to save sight. The good corneas are willed to the eye bank of Canada by persons at death.

Only 60 or 70 of the 2,300 totally blind in British Columbia have had their sight restored by this method. It is estimated that only about six per cent of the totally blind are sightless because of defective corneas.

But many others on the verge of blindness have had their sight saved by this operation.

The eye bank however now is in need of corneas. Some patients wait weeks, perhaps months, before they are eligible for the operation.

Commissions are not paid on arguments won, but on sales made.

CHICAGO — While some transit systems lose money, the Negro-owned Safe Bus Incorporated bus lines of Winston-Salem, North Carolina is thriving, and on a non-segregated seating basis.

The Safe Bus carries three million passengers annually, owns all of its equipment, sets their own policies, and ferry Negro and white passengers in an unsegregated fashion.

The white-owned City Bus Line long since took note of the desegregated followed suit. Today there is no color pattern in seating on any Winston-Salem busses.

Coed Describes Life Sentence

CHICAGO — A twenty-one year old coed tells what it is like to live with an incurable blood disease, sickle cell anemia, which strikes about one out of every 400 American Negroes.

In a by-lined article, "I'm Living On Borrowed Time," Marclan A. Walker of Huntington, West Virginia, tells of the rare and chronic blood disease which has necessitated over 250 blood transfusions as the only treatment for the disease.

Study Value of Life

"In the Torah, we study the value of life for the sake of finding the will of God," he said. 

A second plan spreads the cost of a four-year college course across a longer period of time. This is called an extended payment plan.

Bowen explained that under this method, payments can be extended from five to eight years.

In this plan, Bowen explained, a small interest charge is added to monservice fee.

Total monthly payments would be \$100.47 per month for five years, including an interest rate on the total amount of money, slightly more than one per cent.

Bowen said the payment plans are operated on a non-profit basis. Extra charges are aimed at reimbursing the college for its cost in administering the programs.

When parents wish to use an eightyear payment plan, the contract calls for payments to begin one year before the student enters college.

To protect the school, a parent using the extended payment plan must purchase an insurance policy which guarantees the college payment in case of the breadwinner's death.
