Highlighting the series of events will be a special message from the beloved and esteemed Founder, President Emeritus Mrs. Mary Mc-Leod Bethune, who will speak on the regular weekly program of the United Negro College Fund, over the ABC network Sunday, Dec. 5, at 10:30 a.m. Eastern Standard Time.

The message from Mrs. Bethune to council women everywhere will be broadcast from her Daytona Beach, Florida, home on three campus of Bethune-Cookman College. Mirs. Bethune, the author of many "firsts" in her long and brilliant career, is the founder of Beiliune-Cookman College, a memoer of the United Negro College Fund.

PEACE, GOOD WILL

"And as the shepherds watched, a multitude of voices sang out: Glory to God in the highes . . . Peace, good will toward men . . ."

That twinkling light of hope that shone in the heavens 2,000 years ago on the first Christmas night seems brighter this year than for many decades. Guns of battle around the world have been silenced altholgh the assurance of a permanent pease is far from certain.

As we approach this Christmas season and look forward to a new year we should be thankful for that blessing of peace but also aware that lasting peace will only be attained by Christian thinking and Christian living, putting into practice the true Brotherhood spirit, first fostered by Him whose birthday we are about to celebrate.

When we say our grace before Christmas dinner, perhaps we should pause for a second to think of those less fortunate, the hungry, the oppressed, the sick, and those in captivity behind the Iron Curtain, captured in mind if not in prisons. Sincere Christmas thoughts should resolve themselves into action in the New Year to be more considerate of others, both at home and abroad.

For our Brotherhood the New Year will be a period of much serious consideration. It will be a year for much broader thinking, a year to realize that unity and Real Brotherhood are as much needed now as

While we dream of peace and enjoy a luli in active warfare we must not be complacent, for self satisfaction tends to promote disregard for others. Dickens in his beloved Christmas Carol told of the conversion of Scrooge from a miserable miser to a worthy citizen with thoughts for others instead of his own greed. We do not wish to be a Marley Ghost, recording the failures of yes-Ghost, recording the failures of yesterday, today and tomorrow, but C. W. Summers & Sons Dickens' story is the same now as when it was written a century ago, a story that could have been told centuries before, and repeated today about ourselves. On this continent, the world's richest in natural wealth we enjoy our freedoms, and many appreciated advantages, yet we forget that in other parts of the world people are starving.

It is a grim thought for Christmas yet we must face realities. By facing them our thanks for blessings should be more sincere. Like Scrooge we may be able to develop an honest spirit of Brotherhood. As Dickens wrote:

"Scrooge became as good a friend, as good a master, and as good a man as the good old city knew, or any other good old city, town or borough, in the good old world. 

FIVE MEMBERS OF PARLIA MENT SPEAK FOR WEST AFRICA.

CAUX, Switzerland, - Five West African parliamentarians stood on the platform together and unitedly pledged themselves "to make Africa a continent with an answer, that unity be our greatest export to the world." They are from four different political parties and one independent, from Nigeria and the Gold Coast.

They were introduced by the Toon Na, a Chief, and representative from the North in the Gold Coast House of Assembly. "The future of Africa hangs in the balance," he "Only committed men and women can turn that balance. We love the Gold Coast and have decided to fight for it to be what it should be. In order to do this we must make the four standards the guide and compass of our daily

Mr. Michael Ogon of the Nigerian Legislative Assembly, who is a Catholic, spoke of the many parliamentarians he had met at Caux. 'All our problems are the same,' he said. "We have put our own political careers and ambitions before our country's needs. Together we have taken the decision to be different and bring a new principle into politics.

"If Nigeria achieves her self-government by the use of hate, she will have to maintain it by fear," said Ogon. He spoke of the great hope he had for Nigeria since many Nigerians including Cabinet Ministers had been to Caux. The alternatives before Nigeria were "unity through dictatorship or a true democracy under the guidance of God," he said.

Calling on a member of the Legislative Assembly for the Northern Region of Nigeria, Alhaji Saadu Alanamu, who is also attending the Assembly, he publicly apologized for the superior attitude we have adopted towards the people of the North." Ogon recognized that the division it has caused was being exploited by men of the wrong beliefs. "I would like to ask your forgiveness," he said. This produced a spontaneous response from the Norhern Nigerian delegate who shook nands with Ogon on the platform. He expressed his astonishments and gratitude for the apology saying, "I am grateful for what MRA has done for me and my country. We can ook forward now with confidence to Nigeria's progress.

From Togoland, the Rev. S. A. Dzirasa, Member of the Government Party in the Gold Coast Parliament, said that on the basis of the absolute moral standards "our internal unity will be achieved. I commit myself as a member of my party to think not only nationally but for



DELICIOUS NUT BREADS

Delicious nut breads are ideal to make for a party sandwich, a lunch box sweet or a picnic treat. They're packed full of bavor goodness and a favorite with almost everyone.

Ginger Nut Bread

One cup brown sugar, packed
One egg, well beaten
Two tablespoons melted butter
One-half cup chopped pecans
One-third cup chopped crystallized

ginger.
Two cups sifted flour
Three-fourths teaspoon soda
One-half teaspoon baking powder
One-fourth teaspoon sallt
One cup buttermilk

Oven temperature: 350 degrees Baking time: forty-five minutes Yield: One loaf

In a bowl beat the sugar, egg and butter until smooth and creamy. Add the nuts and ginger to the sifted dry ingredients. Stir the flour mixture alternately with the buttermilk into the egg mixture. Do not beat. Pour into a greased loaf pan (8"x5"x3). Bake in a moderate oven until a cake tester inserted in the center comes away clean. Remove to a rack. Cool before slicing.

END OF RACIAL SEGREGA-TION IN U.S. CHURCHES CALLED FOR

Boston, Dec. 1— (AP) —Christian leaders today called for deeds—and not just words—to end racial segregation in U.S. churches.

"The present time is of crucial importance," declared a special section meeting at the biennial assembly of the National Council of Churches.

"In various situations and areas over the nation, sacrifice and bravery appear to be prerequisite in the adjustment of tradition to the teachings of Jesus."

The appeal was sounded, in numerous addresses and in various resolutions, as about 2.000 representatives of 30 Protestant and Orthodox denominations worked to strengthen their joint fortress of faith.

J. Ernest Wilkins, assistant secretary of labor, told the assembly that churches have given faith with "brave and inspired pronouncements against segregation, but have been slow in putting the principles into "actual practice."

The particular need, he said, is not to "become all excited about the moral issue," but "to deal realistically with the situation which now confronts us."

Similar views were expressed by special sessions of delegates who said the Supreme Court ruling against segregation in the schools gave the churches added impetus to reform their own domain.

The councils division of Christian life and work, in a resolution, commended church bodies for speaking out against racial exclusiveness, but it said they "need to increase their efforts" to wipe out the practice.



FOR YULETIDE

Are you looking for something different to serve when friends meet at your house during the holidays? Something different in the way of sandwiches? Here are a few ideas for hostesses who take ttime to do things up in style during the festive

Decker Sandwiches

These are just what the name implies: three or more layers of white or brown bread placed on top of one another with a variety of fillings between each layer. Cut crusts from a loaf of white and a loaf of brown oread. Slice the bread lengthwise in varying thickness. If a thin sandwich is desired slice each layer about quarter of an inche thick. More ubstantial sandwiches may have layers from a half to one inch thick. Spread each layer lightly with butter and then the filling. See that the spread is moist enough to hold the layers together. The filling between each layer may be different but care must be taken that one blends with the other. Two layers of white and one of brown is the favorite combination but that is a matter of taste. Chill thoroughly pefore cutting, then cut down through the layers into whatever thickness is

Rolled Sandwiches

The bread is cut lengthwise of the oaf as before, spread lightly with outter and a filling, and place a long slender pickle (gherkins are good) or two or three olives at the end of the bread nearest you. Roll the bread over this centre. Roll carefully, handle lightly so as not to break the bread and fasten with toothpicks. Place in a waxed paper and chill. Chilling sets the sandwich and helps you to slice thre roll into neat attractive rounds. Here again filling must be chosen which will make the bread stick when rolled

Up to now there has not been much said about the fillings for these special treats but here again your ingenuity may be given full rein. Bearing in mind that the filling ha sto be moist enough and sticky enough to hold the layers of bread together, several foods may be combined to give a tasty effect. If cheese is used it must be a variety which spreads easily. Hard boiled eggs must be chopped very fine and mixed with a mild dressing so as to not give the finished sandwich too coarse an appearance. Fish does not blend well so is better left alone. Chopped meat, pickles, lives sandwich spreads and relishes may be used to advantage on the openfaced sandwiches. Jam with chopped nuts, peanut butter and honey, chopped raisins or dates and wolnuts are just a few of the sweet mixtures which may be used for the rolled

A CHRISTMAS ANGEL FOR TABLE OR MANTEL

If you like working with scissors and paste-pot, try this. The skirt is made from a handful of colored cellophane straws, held firmly at the top by a rubber band; head is white celluloid bali with features hightly inked on; hair is a snippet of curly gold pot-cleaner. Use white writing paper for cutting out arms, songbook and collar. For the wings, paste sheets of gold foil paper back to back, then cut out in the shape shown A straightened bobby pin pierced through the back of the head will hold it sufficiently securely to the rubber band around the plastic straws Several of these angels, contrived in diverent color schemes, would be charming on a dinner table or lined up along your mantel-
