America may not be altogether the "Land of the Free," the home of a brave new These Freedom Fighters

are the courageous students who are risking their lives on picket lines and suffering humiliation and indignities. Their goal is first class citizenship in a nation that boasts of democracy but falls far short in practice.

Negro students have been yanked from segregated lunch counters in the South and thrown into jail in wholesale numbers. They have been threatened by mobs and roughed up in the streets. In Tallahassee, Fla., recently, a group of Sit-In students were detained in a department store dining room, where the manager turned the heat on them despite an eighty degree temperature outside.

Despite the harassment, these students have clung steadfast to their aims-equality and dignity in America.

Kennedy and became the first Negro awarded a key position in the new administration. Also the first Negro in U.S. history to be placed in a top White House press slot, Hatcher—as a Democratic press agent—travelled with candidate Kennedy throughout the latter's 50,000-mile campaign while helping to supervise some 175 reporters. During the 1956 presidential race, Hatcher was a member of Democratic candidate Adlai Stevenson's personal cam-Stevenson's personal campaign staff, later was Rep. William Dawson's aide.

Says Negroes Should Stick to Principles

He said such a tendency would cut the ground from under the American Negro's basic contention that princi-ples have nothing to do with the color of a man's skin.

Rowan, one of the nation's TRAGIC CONCESSION outstanding newsmen, was sworn into his new post a week ago. He spoke at a meeting of the Washington Urban League.

Commenting on proposals that the United Nations entrust the Congo crisis to an all

hatred—if the United Nations ever were pressed to the point of conceding that it can use only Africans in Africa, Asians in Asia or caucasians in 'Caucasia.'

"This could represent only a tragic concession that we are not men whose capacity to reason lifts us high with hope, but are mere animals moved only by distrust and that acid of hate that already has etched such ugly figures on the face of humanity."

Rowan sharply criticized restaurant and hotel owners in this country who may have refused service to African dip-lomats because of their color.

He said such an owner "be trays the very institutions of liberty that we now strive so desperately to sustain. I don't think I need add that those whose minds are so small that they would humiliate and discriminate against others whose flesh and blood also is of America are equally guilty of treason."



He pointed out that no reference is made to race on the Red Cross employment blanks and that no racial information appears on the personnel IBM data cards.

"We have on occasion sought the referral of Negroes from universities and public and private employment agencies," Gen. Gruenther said. "Negro staff members have been well received throughout the Red Cross.

Bible Today

The question is sometimes followed when a new transla-tion of the Bible is undertakasked as to what procedure is en. An answer to the question may be found in the method used when the New English Translation was begun.

The Joint Committee, representing the churches, appointed three panels of translators one for the Old Testament for the New Testament and one for the Apocrypha, each with its own convenor. A panel of literature advisers was appointed also to scrutthe draft translations and to make criticisms and suggestions on matters of literary style. Each of these panels was made up of specialists in Hebrew for the Old Testament, Greek for the New Testament, and a combination of both for the Apocrypha to-gether with advisers in archeology and history.

The steps then followed were that the material to be translated was divided be-tween the members of the panel and each member submitted his translation to the whole panel. After being carefully scrutinized it was sent on for examination by the literary advisors. They, in turn, sought to improve the vocabulary, idiom and rhythm of the translation. They had to keep in mind the various levels of language used in the original writers and keep the flavour of the original composition on the appropriate level, for example, in simple narrative, theological argument, rhetor ic and poetry. Their work was the transla tors panel to make sure that the meaning was not changed. When any single book of the Bible was finished it was submitted to the judgment of the Joint Committee. These representatives of the churches then gained the approval of their religious body, to the New Translation.
