PRESIDENT'S REPORT.

GENTLEMEN :

I have the honor to lay before you a short account of the proceedings of the British Columbia Medical Council for the year ending 30th April, 1893.

During the past year, seven meetings of the Council have been held, of which three were regular meetings—held for the examination of candidates for the license and routine business; the others were held for the purpose of transacting special business.

Among the special business which occupied the attention of the Council, was the case of Dr. Metacrell, who claimed registration by virtue of his certificate of British registration. As there was some ambiguity in the reading of the B. C. Medical Act, the Council declined to register him, and he applied to the Supreme Court of the Province for a mandamus to compel the Council to enter his name on the Register. The learned Chief Justice, before whom the case came, gave his judgment to the effect that persons registered in Great Britain previous to the 30th day of June, 1887, were entitled to be registered in this Province upon furnishing satisfactory proof of British registration, and after paying the fees prescribed by the Medical Council of the Province. A matter which also claimed the attention of the Medical Council, was a bill to amend the Medical Act of 1886, and its amendments.

Section 2 meets the requirements of the Imperial Medical Act, 1886, and allows the registration in this Province of all persons registered in Great Britain on or before June 30th, 1887, upon complying with the rules, etc., of the Council, relative to proof of such registration, and upon payment of the fees fixed by the Council.

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REGISTRAR'S REPORT.

THE BRITISH COLUMBIA MEDICAL REGISTER contains the names of all the members who have been admitted to register in this Province, as properly qualified, and entitled to practice Medicine, Surgery and Midwifery in the Province of British Columbia at this date, as well as other information pertaining to the profession.

SYNOPSIS OF REQUIREMENTS.

For the information of those who are not acquainted with the requirements necessary for registration as medical practitioners in this Province, the following synopsis is given :

1. Section 29 of the Consolidated Statutes of British Columbia provides : "The Council shall admit upon the register any person who shall produce from any college or school of medicine or surgery, requiring a three years' course of study, a diploma of qualification ; provided, also, that the applicant shall furnish to the Council satisfactory evidence of indentification, and pass before the members thereof, or such of them as may be appointed for the purpose, a satisfactory examination touching his fitness and capacity to practice as a physician and surgeon." 1886, c. 13, s. 28.

2. Section 2 of the "Medical Act, Amendment Act, 1893," provides that : "The Council shall admit upon the register every person mentioned in chapter 48 of the Acts of Parliament of the United Kingdom, passed in the 49th and 50th years of Her Majesty's reign, duly registered under the "Medical Act," (Imperial), prior to and inclusive of the 30th day of June, 1887, upon complying with the orders, regulations or by-laws of the Council and giving due proof of such registration, and that the person applying for registration has not lost the benefit of same by reason of misconduct or otherwise, and upon payment of the fees fixed by the Council, not to exceed one hundred dollars."

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3. The examination shall be orally and in writing, upon the following subjects:

1. Anatomy.
2. Chemistry.
3. Physiology.
4. Pathology.
5. Materia Medica.
6. Medical Jurisprudence.
7. Theory and Practice of Medicine.
8. Surgery.
9. Clinical Medicine.
10. Clinical Surgery.
11. Obstretics and Diseases of Women and Children.

8. The highest marks to any written question shall be in respect to the first six branches, equalling in the aggregate fifty per cent. for each paper, and must obtain in respect of each branch, 7, 9 and 11, a number of marks equalling seventy-five per cent.

9. Before examination the candidate shall pay to the Registrar of the Council the fee of one hundred dollars for the examination, fifty dollars of which shall be returned if the candidate be rejected.

10. Every person applying for registration under Section 2 of the "Medical Act, Amendment Act, 1893," shall, on appearing in person before the Registrar of the Council and paying a fee to the Registrar of one hundred dollars, be entitled to be registered, on producing to such Registrar a certificate duly authenticated under the hand and seal of the Registrar of Medical Practitioners in England, Ireland or Scotland, as the case may be, (or other legal evidence), that such applicant is a duly registered Medical practitioner, and that he was duly registered under the "Medical Act" (Imperial) on or before the 30th day of June, 1887. Such applicant will also be required to produce a certificate of

good standing in the profession of Medicine from the Registrar or other officer, of the Medical body, having jurisdiction where such applicant last practised his profession, and evidence by statutory declaration that he has not lost the benefit of his said registration under the "Medical Act" (Imperial) by misconduct, or otherwise.

11. During the year there shall be three regular meetings, and three examinations held, beginning on the first Tuesday of May and September and the second Tuesday of January.

The following amendment to the Medical Act was passed at the last session of the Provincial Legislature :

BILL

AN ACT TO AMEND THE "MEDICAL ACT, 1893."

HER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, enacts as follows :

1. Section 36 of the "Medical Act," Chapter 81, "Consolidated Acts, 1888," is hereby amended by striking out the words, "ten dollars" and by substituting the words "such sum as is now fixed or may from time to time be fixed by the Council by resolution or by-law, but not exceeding one hundred dollars.

2. The Council shall admit upon the register every person mentioned in Chapter 48 of the Acts of Parliament of the United Kingdom, passed in the 49th and 50th years of Her Majesty's reign, duly registered under the "Medical Act," (Imperial), prior to and inclusive of the 30th day of June, 1887, upon complying with the orders, regulations or by-laws of the Council and giving due proof of such registration, and that the person applying for registration has not lost the benefit of same by reason of misconduct or other-

wise, and upon payment of the fees fixed by the Council, not to exceed one hundred dollars.

3. Section 52 of the "Medical Act" is hereby repealed.

4. All fees heretofore paid for registration under the "Medical Act" by resolution, order, regulation or by-law of the Council or otherwise, are hereby declared to have been lawfully imposed and exacted, and to form part of the funds of the Council.

6. This Act may be cited as the "Medical Act Amendment Act, 1893."

PRESIDENT'S REPORT.

GENTLEMEN :

I have the honor to lay before you a short account of the proceedings of the British Columbia Medical Council for the year ending 30th April, 1893.

During the past year, seven meetings of the Council have been held, of which three were regular meetings—held for the examination of candidates for the license and routine business; the others were held for the purpose of transacting special business.

Among the special business which occupied the attention of the Council, was the case of Dr. Metacrell, who claimed registration by virtue of his certificate of British registration. As there was some ambiguity in the reading of the B. C. Medical Act, the Council declined to register him, and he applied to the Supreme Court of the Province for a mandamus to compel the Council to enter his name on the Register. The learned Chief Justice, before whom the case came, gave his judgment to the effect that persons registered in Great Britain previous to the 30th day of June, 1887, were entitled to be registered in this Province upon furnishing satisfactory proof of British registration, and after paying the fees prescribed by the Medical Council of the Province. A matter which also claimed the attention of the Medical Council, was a bill to amend the Medical Act of 1886, and its amendments.

Section 2 meets the requirements of the Imperial Medical Act, 1886, and allows the registration in this Province of all persons registered in Great Britain on or before June 30th, 1887, upon complying with the rules, etc., of the Council, relative to proof of such registration, and upon payment of the fees fixed by the Council.

Sec. 3 and Sec. 4 relate to prosecutions under the Medical Act, and provide that fines, etc., shall be paid to, and form part of the funds of the Council.

Sec. 5 makes legal all fees hitherto imposed by the Council. I think that we now have a fairly good, workable Medical Act

The question of reciprocity, in the matter of registration, with the other Provinces, was brought before the Council by a communication from the College of Physicians and Surgeons of the Province of Ontario, and Dr. G. L. Milne, M.P.P., was appointed to represent the B. C. Medical Council at a meeting of delegates from the various provinces which was held in the City of Ottawa last fall. Owing to several difficulties, however, nothing resulted from the meeting.

During the past year also, the Medical Council made an arrangement with the Ontario Medical Journal, whereby that journal became the Official Organ of the Council, and each registered practitioner in the Province receives a copy of the Journal. A certain amount of space in each issue of the paper is reserved for the use of members of the profession in British Columbia, and Dr. W. J. McGuigan was appointed Associate Editor for this Province.

During the year just closed, 24 candidates for the License presented themselves, and after passing a satisfactory examination were admitted to the Register.

I cannot close this Report without mentioning with satisfaction the harmony and good feeling which have existed among the members of the Council during my term of office as President—in fact during the whole time that I have been connected with the Council. I desire also, to call your attention to the efficient manner in which the officers of the Council have performed their duties, and would particularly mention the Registrar, Dr. G. L. Milne,

who has devoted much of his time to promoting the interests of the Council and of the profession, and who has discharged the delicate duties connected with his office in a manner which calls for the admiration of all.
