

CHRONICLE.

BY R. R. BOGERT.

BAVARIA.—Mr. Lohmeyer has sent us two stamped telephone tickets, 10 pf. and 25 pf., both black on white, paper watermarked with perpendicular waved lines.

BRITISH HONDURAS.—The 5c. card has been surcharged ["3" in black, and the 10c. on 4d. has the "10" crossed out and "6" surcharged above in black.

BRITISH SOUTH AFRICA Co.—Mekeel's Weekly illustrates the design of the new stamps that have been expected for some time. A shield in the center is surmounted by a lion and supported by two unicorns. Above in two lines, "British South Africa Company," and below the motto, "Justice—Freedom—Commerce," and the value 1d., black, 6d., blue, 1 sh., brown.

GRENADA.—The 2 sh. fiscal stamp, green and orange, is now surcharged, 1d. in black, and the 8d. in four lines "Postage—and—Revenue—1d."

GUADELOUPE.—The I fc. has been surcharged $\frac{5c}{app}$ in black.

HONG KONG.—The 10c. green has been surcharged in two lines "7 cents." There will probably be a 7c. stamp issued as this is a new postal rate. They have also just celebrated the 50th anniversary of the Colony, by surcharging the 2c. stamp in four lines in black "1841—Hong Kong—JUBILEE 1891."

INDIA.—Another surcharge is before us. 2½ annas on 4a. 6p. Black on green.

LAGOS.—The 3d. is printed now in lilac and brown.

LEEWARD ISLANDS.—There is a 1d. envelope and ½d. and 1d. wrappers.

MARTINIQUE.—Le T. P. notes the 10 cts., 20 cts. and 25 cts. surcharged MARTINIQUE and MARTINIQUE 15c.

MAURITIUS.—It seems that both of the 8c. envelopes have been surcharged "50 CENTS."

NEWFOUNDLAND.—The ic. and 2c. cards are now white instead of buff.

NEW SOUTH WALES.—From *Mekeel's Weekly* we learn that the Id. is printed in gray and surcharged "half-penny," the 6d. is printed in brown and surcharged "seven-pence half-penny," the Ish. is printed in red and surcharged "twelve-pence half-penny." The postage due stamps are a poor copy of those of the United States; they are printed in a sickly green, values Id., 2d., 3d., 4d., 6d., 8d., 5s., Ios., 2os.

NICARAGUA.—The new stamps described last month are Ic., brown; 2c., red; 5c., blue; IOC., gray; 2OC., maroon; 5OC., violet; Ip., brown; 2p., green; 5p., lake; IOP., orange. The full set has also been printed in green, and surcharged in red Franqueo-Oficial in two lines. The post cards have the same stamp in

the upper right corner and a map of Nicaragua covering the center of the card. 2c. and 2x2c. dark green on rose card with blue ground work; 3c. and 3x3c. dark blue on buff card with orange ground work. The envelopes have the same stamp; 5c., blue on white, 153x90 mm.; 5c., blue on amber, 159x91 mm.; 10c., gray on white, 159x91 mm.; 20c., carmine on amber, 195x94 mm.; 30c., brown on amber, 240x103 mm.; 50c., lilac on amber, 240x103 mm. Wrappers 1c., 2c., and 4c., green on manila, 170x280 mm.

ORANGE FREE STATE.—The 4d. blue has lately been surcharged 1d, in black SALVADOR.—The 1891 stamps have a volcano and locomotive in a circle. "Correos del Salvador" above, value and date below, and figures of value at sides. Ic, vermilion; 2c., green; 3c., lilac; 5c., red; 10c., blue; 11c., lilac; 20c. green; 25c., brown; 50c., blue; 1p., brown. The cards have stamp resembling adhesive in upper right corner, arms in left corner and seated figure of Justice in the center with rayed ground work. Black impression and green ground on various colored cards as follows: 1c. on blue, 2c. and 2x2c. on buff, 3c. and 3x3c. on rose. The envelopes and wrappers have the usual large oval stamp with design in center resembling the adhesives. Envelope, 1c., violet on red, 150x85 mm.; 2c., vermilion on white, 150x85 mm.; 5c., brown on buff, 159x91 mm.; 10c., green on blue, 159x91 mm.; 11c., orange on red, 159x91 mm.; 20c. carmine on buff, 159x91 mm.; 22c., dark brown on buff, 159x91 mm. Wrappers, 2c., 3c., 6c., 12;2c., dark brown on red paper 208x267 mm.

SIAM.-The 3 att green and blue is surcharged 2 att in black.

TASMANIA.—We have received the 2½d. mentioned last month, but it is surcharged on the 9d. printed in pale blue.

TUNIS,—Le Timbre Poste says: Some of the stamps are surcharged "a percevoir" instead of having the letter "T" perforated.

VICTORIA.—Mekeel's Weekly illustrates the new 2½ and 5d. stamps; the former sepia on yellow has the queen's head at the right and the southern cross at the left; the 5d. has head in oval with branches at sides, and is brown on white. Both have "Victoria" above and value below. There is a ½d. postage due stamp.

VIRGIN ISLANDS.—The Ph. Record surprises us by the information that at least one sheet of the 1sh. 1867. with single outer line of color, must have been printed without the Virgin.

CORRESPONDENCE.

To the Eauor:

The Canadian Philatelic Society is dying through its own fault. Every number of your newspaper contains numerous resignations and expulsions and with but few new members joining.

What is the cause of all this? The answer is very simple. All the members of the Society admit that there is only *one* advantage in belonging to it, as owing to their residence being in different parts of the Dominion and the United States they are unable to meet weekly or monthly for the purpose of exchanging ideas, and discussing their interests.

The only advantage then, is, the Exchange in connection with the Society which unfortunately is not conducted properly. The stamps which are sent for circulation among the members are unheard of for months together and are not even acknowledged by its Exchange Superintendent.

Even when there is a return and a sum to one's credit there is great difficulty in getting paid. Nevertheless the Superintendent of the Exchange is very careful to exact all sums due, even when there is something due us.

Thus, I sent to the Exchange Superintendent, during last March stamps to the amount of \$300, that have never been acknowledged and have only been returned to me in January. That is to say after a period of *nine months*. Mr. Grenny notified me last August that I had \$12 to my credit.

A little later on I took some stamps from the Circulation Lists and was compelled to pay for them although being a creditor for a much larger amount.

In January last I was again notified that I had the sum of \$20 to my credit and at once demanded payment of these two sums in order to reimburse myself.

In reply I was told that the Secretary of the Montreal Association was ordered to collect from one of the members, the amount due, in order to pay me.

The very same day I received "THE DOMINION PHILATELIST" announcing the expulsion of the above member, for neglecting to pay his dues.

Since then I have heard nothing further and I am still unable to get what is lawfully due me, though having promptly paid everything due to the Society.

I therefore specially draw the attention of the Executive Committee to these facts in order that it may promptly and efficiently deal with this state of affairs, as failing which the Canadian Philatelic Society will be a thing of the past.

DEAR SIR,—The letters of Mr. V. H. Young and myself in relation to the group picture of all the C. P. A, members having been published in the February number of THE DOMINION PHILATELIST, I herewith send you a short sketch of what has been done about it.

The best plan seems to be that of reproduction by the Photo-Gravure process which will be the cheapest and most available. The work will be the best that can be procured and the grouping will be done in the most artistic manner. 50 to 100 bust cabinet pictures can be attractively arranged and printed by this process from an 18x22 plate on a 22x28 fine bristol board, that will admit of being rolled for the purpose of mailing.

Close estimates show that this work can be done for about \$76.00 for the first 100 pictures. I would undertake to have this done provided I received pledges for at least 75 pictures at \$1.00 each. It would be necessary to charge members \$1.00 each, as the pasteboard case to mail the pictures in and the postage would be extra.

I would further advocate that only those members pictures be included in the group that subscribe for at least one picture. There are now 50 cabinets, 5 card pictures and 4 stamp photos in the lot so far collected. The card pictures and stamp photos can not be used and only about 40 of the cabinets are available. No doubt a number of these are not now members and would have to be excluded.

If it is the wish of the members to have this scheme successfully carried out they must at once advise me by letter of their intentions, as I will not let the matter drag along for an indefinite period. I trust that by this time next month I can report progress or that the pictures have been returned.

STAMP COLLECTING IN ITALY.

BY THE AUTHOR OF "THE FIGHT AT DAME EUROPA'S SCHOOL."

It is very difficult to pick up Stamps in Italy, or indeed anywhere on the Continent. The shop windows, of course, are crowded with South Americans—Argentine, Brazil, Chili, Cuba, Uruguay, and other eternal and irrepressible spectres; but almost all the rare stamps are forged, while the price demanded for genuine specimens is absolutely ridiculous. Italians have the most exaggerated ideas about the value of their own Postal issues; and the national habit of asking just three times as much as you mean to take, in the expectation of being beaten down, makes it extremely difficult for a foreigner to come to terms. This system, originally imported from the East, is by no means based upon any principle of dishonesty. The trader simply assumes that his wares are wo the to the buyer what the buyer is willing to pay for them. When therefore he asks fifty francs, being perfectly willing to accept fifteen, he does not in the least intend to cheat his customer. He merely proposes to spend an hour or so in finding out what value his customer sets upon the article in question; and, in a country where time is of no consideration whatever, the system is not such a very bad one. At any rate the trick isterribly catching; and people who have lived some time abroad are apt, on their return home, to shock deeply the sensibilities of some respectable London tradesman by attempting to bargain with him. It is recorded of an Englishmen that after five years of continental travel he entered a shop in Oxford Street, and asked the price of a book. "Fifteen shillings," said the bookseller. "I will give you eight and a sixpence for it," was the magnanimous rejoinder. It is not recorded whether the intending purchaser left the shop suddenly by the door, or by one of the plate-glass windows.

Last summer, during a tour in the central and southern provinces of Italy, I made persistant but not altogether successful attemps to secure some Italian Stamps in various country towns. I began by asking the postmaster at Aquila for some 30c. unused brown and 2 lire red both of the present reign. He assured me that no such stamps existed, whereupon I produced a specimen of the former, to the immense astonishment of the entire staff. Considering that Aquila is the capital of a province, and has a population of 20,000, I thought it a little strange that the authorities at the Post Office should know less about the Stamps of their own country than a passing traveller. I then asked whether there was anybody in the town who had a good collection. Oh yes—there was Professor Giobbini, one of the masters at the Grammer School. He had one of the largest in Italy, and would no doubt be delighted to show it to me. I found the Professor sitting with his hat on in a draughty passage, which I have every reason to believe was his class-room, as numerous papers were laying blown about upon the floor. He was smoking a horrible limp black cigar, some nine inches long, which he stuck like a pen behind his ear as he arose to greet me. Stamps—oh yes, he had plenty of Stamps. His pupils collected for him; and several Old Boys who had gone out into the world send him specimens from South America, Egypt, and Japan. This did not sound very promising, so I asked whether he had any duplicates of Modena, Parma, or Tuscany. Certainly; he had any amount: and if I would

come to his house in the evening, when school was over, I should see them all Meanwhile the news had spread all over the town that there was a mad Englishman on the spot who wanted to buy stamps; and in the course of the afternoon a lean unwholesome youth called upon me at the inn, bringing his album with Before opening it, however, he proposed to dazzle my eyes with the sight of three splendid specimens, which he had gummed hard and fast upon the back of a Photograph and kept in an envelope by themselves. "There!" cried he "did you ever see such beauties? Look at their colour. You won't find three Stamps to match them in all Italy." So saying, he held up to my enraptured gaze a Leitmeritz unused triangular green, a forged West Australian Swan of an impossible coppery hue, and a gaudy Russian fiscal, "Yes I observed, "the colours are certainly remarkable; I am not sure that I ever saw such colours before. But what might the price of these rarities be?" "Well," said he, "they are worth ever so much—fifty francs at the very least; but as you are a friend (I had known the man just a minute and a half) I will let you have them as a reduction. What will you give me?" Looking as solemn as the occasion permitted, I drew an envelope out of my pocket, and offered my friend a 5 cent blue Garfield for the lot; whereupon he became mortally offended, recollected all at once that he had a pressing engagement, and said he would shew me the rest of his treasures another day.

POSTAL DOCUMENTS.

BUENOS AYRES, Sept. 22, 1890.

ARGENTINE—In view of the preceding notice of the commission for postal values and of the information obtained from the postal administration on this subject, by which it is shown that the 2½ centavos stamps have not for a long time been used for local postage, by order of the general administration, and as the South American Bank Note Co. is printing 1,500,000 of these stamps by order of this administration; and as Article II. of the laws on postal and

telegraph rates demands that local postage shall be one-half of the regular rate for internal postage, and commands that the smaller value shall be used when this results in a fraction; therefore, for local correspondence the postage on letters shall be 2 centavos for each 15 grams or fraction thereof, and in accordance with the views of the Procurator of the Treasury the Administration has decided.

- 1. To fix the rate on local correspondence at 2 centavos for each 15 grams or fraction thereof.
- 2. To order the South American Bank Note Co. to suspend operations on the 1,500,000 stamps of 2½ centavos, which they are printing by order of this administration.
- 3. To burn all the stamps of this value which exist in the post offices, and all which have been printed by the South American Bank Note Co., and it shall be done in the presence of the commission for postal values, with the assistance of the administrative departments.
- 4. The burning being completed, an account of it shall be rendered to the Minister of the Interior, and after confirmation the accounts of the department shall be credited accordingly.

DIEGO SUAREZ,—Report of the burning of the stamps of Diego Suarez, this day, October 10, 1890:

The commission appointed by the governor, under date of September 5th, and composed of Messrs. LeBoigue, underchief of the first-class of the post office; Poirier, agent of the postal service, and Terrentroy, assistant-secretary of the post office, met for the destruction of the provisional stamps which remained in the office. The stamps have been burnt.

The quantities and values of the stamps destroyed are as follows:

15 centimes, 3,546 stamps, value 531.90 frs.; 25 centimes, 6,903 stamps, value 1,725.75 frs.

As a result, the sum of 2,258.65 frs. shall be deducted from the accounts of the post office.

ADMINISTRATION OF EGYPTAIN POSTS.—By authority of the Khedive's decree of the 17th inst., the rates for cards originating in and destined for the interior of Egypt will be reduced after January 1st next to 3 milliemes for the single post card and to 6 milliemes for the post card with reply.

In consequence, while awaiting the issue of new cards of the above mentioned prices, there will be put on sale on January 1st next the cards now in use, single and with reply, with a surcharge of 3 milliemes. These cards will be sold singly or in packets of 10 single cards or 5 cards with reply, at the price of 30 milliemes (P. T. 3) each packet.

The surcharged cards may also be sent to foreign countries on the condition that the rate of 5 milliemes, which remains in force for cards going to countries of the Union, be completed by the addition of 2 milliemes in postage stamps upon the single card, or upon each of the two parts of the card with reply.

The administration will continue to put on sale single and reply cards of 5 milliemes for foreign countries.

It is well understood also that there will be accepted for the interior of Egypt single cards of private manufacture prepaid with 3 milliemes.

ALEXANDRIA, 29th December, 1890.

GERMANY—Notice on the subject of stamped envelopes and stamped wrappers. After December, 10, 1890 the office of distribution will sell no more stamped envelopes or wrappers. After the same date it is ordained by the imperial administration of posts that no more will be manufactured or put on sale. It is left to the public to procure for themselves unstamped envelopes and wrappers, and to affix the necessary stamp.

The stamped envelopes and wrappers of the new type which on the 10th of December still remain in the hands of the public, may still be used.

In addition, the stamped envelopes and wrappers of the old type will preserve their value until January 31, 1891. (Signed) Von Stephan,

BERLIN, 27th November, 1890.

ITALY.—The special stamps for postal packets altered into ordinary 2-cent postage stamps by the use of the surcharge *Valevole per le stampe Cmi 2*, according to Article 257 of the Regulation, approved by royal decree of July 2, 1890, No. 6,954 (3d series), will be put on sale after December 1st next, and may be used until through the month of June, 1891; after that date they will not be good for postage, but may be exchanged during another year.

ROME, 10th October, 1890.

There has been established by a recent regulation the issue of special post cards, reserved exclusively for the Deputies to the National Parliament, which will be put on sale only by the post office of the Chamber. These post cards are similar to the ordinary ones, but in the upper right corner of the address side is found the government arms and the following inscription: Carmera dei Deputati.

(This decree was issued some time in November.)

INDO-CHINA.—The Governor-General of Indo-China, officer of the Legion of Honor and of the Public Instruction:

By virtue of the decree of November 12th, 1887, in view of the report of the inspector of posts and telegraphs in Annam and Tonkin, announcing the early exhauston of the stamps of 15 centimes;

As these stamps are used to a great extent, and as it is necessary to provide for the demand; in view of the urgent necessity; on the proposition of the residents in Tonquin.

DECREES.—Article 1. The inspector, chief of the post office, is authorized to surcharge in order to transform them into stamps of 15 centimes the following kinds of postage stamps:

1st. 30,000 stamps of 20 centimes; 2nd. 40,000 stamps of 30 centimes; 3rd. 12,000 stamps of 35 centimes; 4th. 24,000 stamps of 40 centimes; 5th. 18,000 stamps of 75 centimes; 6th. 30,000 stamps of 1.00 centimes.

Article 2. The Superior Resident, Post Inspector at Tonkin is charged with the execution of the present decree.
