lilac in color．and bears the picture of the Priner Consort．The 1थd．is black in color and bears the picture of the Queen． Only alkme $1, i(h)$ of this last stamp was issued．and it is，consequently，the rarest and most expensive of all the Canadian stamps．a prefeet specimen being worth from $s f(k)$ to $s .0(t)$ ．The manner in which the value is expressed on it is not an error， as might be suppused，from its being of－ ficially called a＂shilling．＂There were shillings of different values in circulation in various parts of the colony．and to more definitely describe the value of it＂twelve pence＂was used instead of＂one shilling．＂ This last stamp was withdrawn when the lok．stamp was issuma December i．189is．

## The New Imperial Penny Postage Stamp.

We take pleasure in presenting to our readers the likeness of the new stamp issued to commemorate the inauguration of Penny Postage for British colonies. It is

a beautiful stamp, superior "(Canadians think)" to any stamp beretofore issued. The British possessions are printed in red as designated by the black in the illustra. tion above. The map stands out in lold reliff against a background of a delicate light blue. Surmounting this is a wreath of maple and oak leaves in which is a crown thus symbolizing the unity of England and Canada. At the apper edge are the words, "Canada Postage" and underneath the map "Xmas 1898" so that the date of the inauguration of Imperial Penny Postage will be made a matter of record. In each of the lower corners appear the figure 2 and at the lower edge connecting these in this sugrestive pansage taken from a peem by a Canadian poet. "We hold a vaster empire than has heen." As
someone remarked on seeing the stamp for first time, "It is the prettiest and cheapest map of the world ever published..

The stamp is already in circulation and will be available for local postage only, until Xmas day when the two cent rate to Great Britain takes effect. It is the purpose of Mr. Mulock to have prepared, a card bearing the impress of the new penny postage stamp together with a table of figures indicating the important elements in Canada's claim to greatness, the volume of her trade, etc., etc. These cards will be placed in envelopes and distributed amongst teachers and others in Canada and Great Britain in the hope that they assist in the formation of a true idea of Canada's present and prospective position.

A small number of these stamps have been issued and when this scpply is exhausted the issue will becume obsolete, and a new 2 cent stamp issued for Imperial Penny Postage purposes.

The stamps were first placed on sale in Toronto on Wednesday, 7th inst. Mr. Jno. H. Lowe secured the first sheet. As no one knew of their early appearance the demand was not great. It is expected that the stamps will be comparatively scarce.

An error has been noticed already or rather a misprint. We have a copy where the red is priuted altogether out of place. Careful search among several thousand other copies does not reveal another similar copy.

What spnse is there in snch discrimination against Canadians :

Why shonld we pay two cents for a long distancer and three ceints for a sbort ole:


One cent post cards will appear with numerals in lower corner of the stamp, shortly.

The special new one cent card for advertising purposes has been issued by the Post-office Department in sheets of sixteen, eight and singly.

The Canada Stamp Co. of Quebec, have published a catalogue of Canadian postage and revenue stamps, also an album for $\mathbf{B}$. N. A. stamps.
R. S. Mason has opened up a stamp store at 30 King St. W. Hamilton. We wish Mr. Mason success in his new venture.
On Christmas day, simultaneously with the institution of the Imperial penny post, and to mark the Queen's appreciation of his efforts to bring it about, Mr. Mulock will become "Sir William."

The impression has been made that an entire new commemorative issue for Canada would appear at Xmas. This is a mis. take as only the 2 -cent stamp and two cent post card will be especially issued. It is likely that an entirely new issue will ap. pear the first part of next year.
The new one-cent postcard (special) for advertising purposes is printed for the Postoffice Department in sheets of sixteen, eight and singly. The sixteen card sheet is made up in packages of $12 \overline{\mathrm{j}}$ sheets, or 20,000 cards each; the eight card sheet in packages 12 i sheets, or one thousand cards; the single card sheet is made up like the ordinary one cent, in packages of one hundred. The eight-card sheet is in greatest request, that being the size best addapted for the printing press genarally used for printing advertisements of the kind in question.

Dear Sir：From press dispatches I note that the two－cent postal rate of Can ada，with various British possessions and for inland rate has gone into effect．Now I desire to ask a few questions in regard to the color of the two－cent dencmination． The present shade is purple．According to the agreement of U．P．U．，the color of the stamp necessary for foreign（single letter，postage must be blue．Will the color of the two cont stamp，be chamired to blue ？Now according to U．P．U．the color of stamp necessary for inland（single letter）postage must be red．Will the colur of the two cent be changed to red？

As this reduction of rate only applies to certain conntries，will it become necessary to chinge the color at all，or at least for foreign postage ：

To sum up．There minst be a two ant stamp color red．There will jurthifs：be a two－cent stamp color blue：or the purple may remain．

The color of the five－cent stam！is al－ ready blue and to issue a two eent stamp in the same shade．may cause much incon－ venience and unlimited tronble to all con－ cerned．

The above shows how the letters of dif－ ferent Canacian philatelic correspondents， Who have likely been scarce of news，nave created a wrong impression．In the first place the 2－cent rate to（irent Britain and （＇olonies has not gone into effect，and afain no action has been taken respecting the re． duction of the inland rate．In answer to the first guestion．we do not think the color of the ecent stamp will le changed to blue，because in the first place the penty rate is not a＂Universal Rate＂and as is now known the stamp is a three colored one．As to tho socond aluestion we think that when the inland rate take＇s effect the two and three cont stamps will change color．Therefore we have sood groumes on which to believe the rumor that an en． tire new issue is in preparation．Moral Get your present iscme in time and sate money．

## Pertinent Paragraphs Clipped and Tipped.

Will Canada's new stamp be scarce ? Th number is limited and as soon as the supply is exhsusted the issue will become obsolete.

Who said that the Canadian Philatelic Association was going to "take up its bed and walk?" Is philately dead in Canada? The present condition of afairs general does not make one think we.

No parcel can be sent to Canada by any other country by parcel post unless it bears a customs deciaration setting forth the nature of its coatents and its value. Parcels posted without first having been subuitted to and marked by the customs will be sent to the dead-letter oftice.

How appropriate the motto is on Canada's new stamp. That hereafter Canada will bear upon the envelcpes of its correspondence this engraved mapin three colors, but little larger than the ordinary postage stamp, an adpertisement not only of the immense deruains of the Empire, but of the extraordinary limits of the Dominion, should be considered a triumph of Canadian negotiations with the Home Government and an achievement of our Postruaster. General, Hon. William Mulock.
"If our Postmaster-General would devote himself to improving the facilities for the collection and distribution of mail in rural districts instead of ar:anging to carry letters for the residents of Hong Kong at lower rates than he carries ours, he would be performing better service for the public. It soems almost necessary to remind him that there are within the British Empive a very deserving people known as Candians. who, as they pay his salary, wnald like a little attention to their interests when he gets through with the people beyond the seas."-The Weekly Sun.

A specimen of the new Imprial "-cent stamp was shown to a local philatelist. While the general appearance of the stamp he remarked, is pleasing to the eye, and flattering to Canadians from the prominence which the Dominion repeives in this miniature map of the world, yet. from an artistic standpoint, the stamp is not a suc. cess. The red color. which is intended to indicate portions of the Empire, is not printed evenly or accurately upon the land areas, thereby destroving the value of the stamp as a work of art This criticism does not of course .pply to every- stamp. as on some the printing is wall done. Pro
bably the work has been spoiled by im. porting those "experts" from New York. If the Canadian plate printers had relied entirely upon their own resources they must certainly have made a bettor fist of it, as what is given to the public is hardly "expert work."-Mail and Empire.
