The W. M. A. S. have been very successful with the envelope system. In the first quarter the sum of fifteen dollars was sent to the Maritime Treasurer, and the last quarter twenty-four more. This is very encouraging. The following amounts have also been sent by the Treasurer, from Mrs. J. C. Amarese, \$25 for life membership in Foreign Missions, a memorial of her uncle, Allan R. McDonald; from Mrs. W. Gates \$25, making herself a life member in Home Missions. It is to be hoped this is only the beginning of good things for our women in their mission work.

Our Home Department under superintendent Bro C. R. Hoben with its active committee is making rapid progress. Already this important part of our Sunday School has 76 members. The Committee seek not only the good of the Sunday School but of the Church. We expect to see grand results from the energetic and prayerful labors of the Home Department committee and Members; if you cannot possibly get out to Sunday School in the Home Department.

Our Sunday School is vigorous and aggressive. When scholars come join they are delighted and do not care to leave. But we ought to have very much larger attendance than we do. Two hundred is very good indeed but it might just as well be three hundred in our main school. If each scholar will bring one and help to hold that one until established, our roll will soon read 300. Let us go to work with these fine Spring days.

Our Bloomfield Mission is one of the hopeful parts of our work. Great progress has been made there. The Sunday school is rapidly growing. The social services are full of the power of the spirit. Let us attend if we can. There is a bright future for our mission.
