The Pastor will be glad to speak with you at the close of each service. Kindly inform him concerning the sick, strangers, and without regular church home, and where a visit will be helpful.

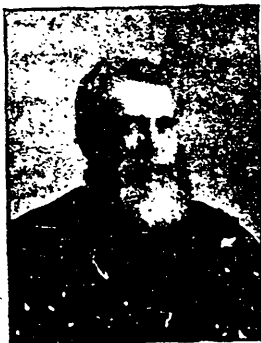
