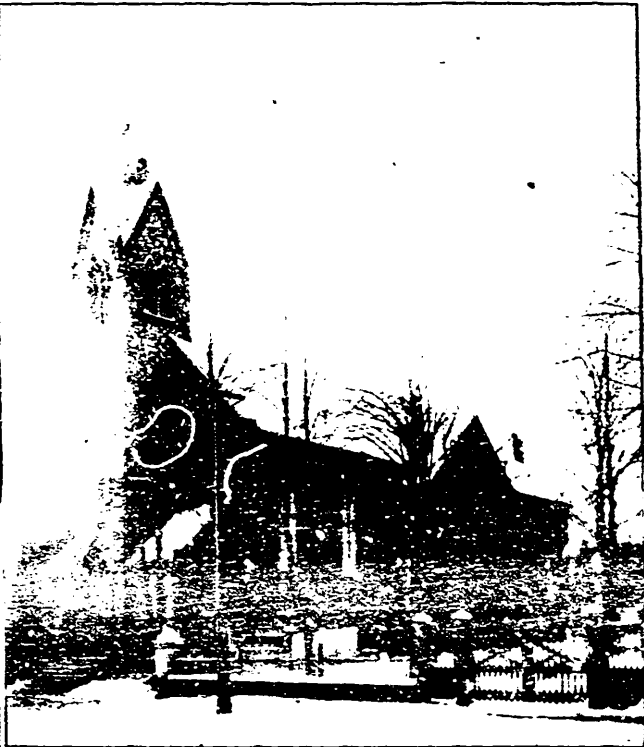

Notes.

The Lecture by Rev. G. O. Gates was full of interest. It made us anxious to hear the series of 14 lectures which he has prepared concerning trip.

The times of Examination for our Normal Class and Christian Literature Class are rapidly approaching. The North Church is going to make a splendid record. This is especially true of the Normal Class. Let us as far as possible take the Examinations.

Build up the spiritual life of the church and everything else prospers. Religion is reduced to a minimum. When people are alive in Christian service they have little time to find fault. When they have really joined the church they are not disturbed by little storms. Those who cling to the outside are never happy, and in constant danger of falling off. When we truly enter into the heart of Jesus Christ we get into the heart of his Apostolic church. Then we shall see that the very existence of the church is imperiled by that which tends to weaken her spiritual life. There is no service where our spiritual strength is more renewed than in the prayer service. A church with a dead prayer meeting is an unspiritual church. There are, if any, conversions. The unsaved are not attracted to Christ, though their vanity may be fed. The prayer meeting is the index of the church. It can rise no higher than that point. How important then that Christians should make the prayer service a first duty. The church member who neglects the prayer meeting is unfaithful to his church, his Saviour, his soul, and the souls of sinners.
