The attention of the church and congregation is called to a most important matter which must have prompt attention. The three years' fire insurance policy on the church building expired a few days ago. The Treasurer and Chairman of the Finance Committee had not the \$180.00 on hand to pay for the renewal of the same. They did secure the renewal, however, on very favorable terms, if the money, or a fair proportion of it, is paid within 30 days. The business meeting approved of their action, but that did not provide the money. It will be necessary for every one of us to give for this object at once. We cannot allow our church home to be without insurance; but if the money is not in the treasury soon, there will be no other course. The North Church does not believe in letting any part of the Lord's work suffer. Brethren, help.

Without Financial recompense there are those amongst us who are bearing the financial burdens of our church. Faithfully and well they are toiling for our prosperity. The burden of the business falls on the shoulders of a few. Let us help them by prompt and cheerful response. Let us show our appreciation in a practical way.

The contributions for the year have been slightly more than last year. But at the beginning of the year additional and unavoidable expenses were incurred. The insurance policy has matured. The total of these extras will amount to about \$350. It will be necessary to increase our collections that amount, in order to close the year without a deficit. May the Holy Spirit burn these facts into our hearts. Let us all give to the Lord. This call comes from Him and we cannot neglect it. We have great reason to thank God for the blessings of the year. Truly, He has been good to us as a people.
