CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS. ONTARIO.

There has been a rush of lumber ship-There has been a rush of lumber ship-ments during the past week, owing to the desire of shippers to take advantage of water rates. Some dissatisfaction is ex-pressed at the action of the Grand Trunk Railway in preventing the shipment of lumber from Georgian Bay points to New York via Alban, and the Hudson

Although no actual changes in lumber prices can be reported since last issue, there are indications that slight advances will be made in certain grades before the winter basis is reached. From every direction comes the report of enquiries for lath and shingles, and at the close of the sawing season the stock of these at the collection will be savely and the competition of the sawing season the stock of these at the collection. saving season the stock of these at the mills is well nigh exhausted. Competition in buying has been extremely keen, resulting in the advanced prices now quoted. Generally trade is brisk.

QUEBRC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

Owing to the large number of vessels chartered by the British government to transport troops and supplies to South transport troops and supplies to South Africa, a sharp advance in ocean freight rates has resulted, and few, if any, vessels are likely to be chartered for carrying lumber from the St. Lawrence to Great Britain this fall. Rates from Montreal rule at 47s 6d to Liverpool, 50s to London, Bristol, Manchester, Glasgow and Leith, and 55s to Dublin and Belfast. No lumber of any account excepting that contracted for will go forward. This will permit of the stocks of pine in Great Britain becoming reduced to a normal basis, as they are now said to be excessive. In New Brunswick and Nova Scotia

there is very little lumber not already contracted for. The stocks of British deals have been largely bought up, and manufacturers look forward to higher prices and a brisk demand next season. There is a good enquiry for shingles and lath, the latter selling at the mill at \$1.20 per thousand.

MANITOBA AND BRITISH COLUMBIA.

Manufacturers and retail dealers are busy filling orders for lumber. The farmers in Manitoba and the Territories having finished harvesting operations, they are now turning their attention to needed im-provements and additions to their buildings. Besides the large country demand, no small quantity of lumber is being consumed in building work, finishing material being much enquired for. Prices, as far as can be learned, are being adhered to with a tendency towards as advanced. to, with a tendency towards an advance. In British Columbia, and in fact in the entire Pacific Northwest, the lumber business is in a prosperous condition. The increased demand has caused prices to stiffen slightly, but they are not as yet high enough to leave more than a limited margin of profit for the manufacturers. The manufacturers in British Columbia feel that, placed on an equal footing with their competitors south of the border, they can control the local market, but the present condition permits of the low grades of lumber being shipped from the United States and sold at a very low price, while Canadian lumber marketed in that country must pay a duty of two dollars per thousand feet. Of export trade no complaint is have been made to large shipments have been made to hav Australia, and some to China and Japan.

UNITED STATES.

The high prices for lumber have at last the high prices for lumber have at last checked consumption in the United States to some extent. Lumber for manufacturing purposes is as much asked for as ever, but such is not the case with building material. This is about the only change in the situation since last report.

The white pine manufacturers in the Upper Mississippi Valley have issued a new price list making an advance of 50 cents per thousand on several items. In that district medium grade lumber is in fair supply, but there is a shortage of factory plank and No. 3 and No. 4 boards and strips. Some markets also report a scarcitus fairs etack. scarcity of piece stock. At eastern whole-sale points receipts of late have been quite heavy, owing to the fact that a rise quite heavy, owing to the fact that a rise in freight rates from the upper lakes is probable. Prices are firmly maintained. All grades of box lumber and No 3 barn were advanced\$* 50 per thousand at Tonawanda last week, and a further advance of 50 cents is looked for. Buffalo dealers report a great scarcity of low grade pine. Cutting up stock is being sold on the basis of \$31.50 for inch No. 1 cuts. Spruce prices at Boston are higher, and manufacturers are confident of being able to maintain the advance. to maintain the advance.

Hardwood lumber is being bought up as fast as it can be located, the price being largely a secondary consideration. Cull elm and basswood is quoted at Tona-wanda at \$17 to \$18, the price at which firsts and seconds were selling less than one year ago. The sale is reported of a quantity of thick elm at \$32. The demand for maple and ash in the eastern states is increasing.

FOREIGN.

The consumption of lumber in Great Britain is of very satisfactory volume, and prices generally show a tendency to advance. Particularly is this the case with spruce deals, which are advancing very rapidly. At a recent sale at London and 11 inch sold at £8.58 to £8.108, while about two months ago the quotations were fully 108 below this figure. Spruce prices are, however, governed to some extent by the prices of Swedish white-wood, which is now quoted as high as £9. In view of this there is no difficulty in realizing high prices for spruce deals. Prices of pine deals at some of the ports show an advance, but at Liverpool and London receipts have been so heavy that the market is depressed. There is a feeling that imports must be decreased before there can be any substantial improvement At Glasgow 3 and 4 inch pine deals, which have been dull of sale for some time, are showing more activity. Red pine deals are in active demand and receipts are eagerly picked up. For square and waney timber the market is rather quiet.

STOCKS AND PRICES.

Hemlock now sells at Buffalo at the base price of \$13.50, as against \$8 50 one year ago.

Munro & Ebert, of Little Current, Ont., are taking out some fine board timber at Bay Finn.

The steamer Begstad has completed loading deals at Liscombe, N.S., for the United Kingdom.

The steamer Alderney sailed from St. John, N. B., last week for a British port, with 1,695 standards of deals.

The steamer Bentala sailed from Richibucto, N. B., on September 28th, for Liverpool, Eng., with 1160 standards of deals.

White ash is still quoted at Boston at \$45 for 1 inch, \$50 for 1 1 and 1 1 inch and \$55 for 2 inch. Elm is being received in that market in increased quan-

Washington cedar shingles have advanced in the Boston market 5 cents, and although eastern cedar shingles cannot quoted higher, there is a visible stiffening of prices.

Montgomery Bros. & Co., of Buffalo, N.Y., are reported to have closed a contract with Joseph Turner, of Midland, Ont., for the immediate delivery in Buffals of 10,000,000 feet of pine lumber.

At a meeting of the eastern spruce manufacturers held at Boston, Mass., on October 4th, a general advance in prices was made averaging about one dollar per thousand. The average price on 10 and 12 inch spruce is \$19, and on 10 to 12 inch randoms \$18.50. For covering boards 5 inches wide and up the price is \$15. Many of the spruce mills have been restricted in their operations lately by low water in the rivers, and for several weeks it has been almost impossible to place orders at the mills with any certainty of securing shipment.

It is said that F. W. Gilchrist is desirous of increasing his holdings of Ontario timber limits, for which purpose Mr. F. S. Dunhum, of Alpena, Mich., is obtaining particulars of timber proper-ties in the market.

Up to October 1st of this year Buffalo received 156,294,000 feet of lumber and 99,127,000 shingles, against 125,962,000 feet of lumber and 69,530,000 shingles up to same onte last year, but so great has been the demand that stocks now held are unusually low.

The yard dealers in Chicago are selling white pine lath at \$4 and mixed lath at \$3.75. Recent sales on the cargo market have been on the basis, of \$3.50 for white pine and from \$3.25 to \$3.40 for hemlock and mixed lath. At Minneapolis No. 1 white pine lath sells at \$3.75 and mixed

at \$3.50.
The Canadian-American lumber firm of Alger, Smith & Co. purpose cutting at their Duluth mill next year about 60,000,000 feet of lumber, as against 40,000,000 feet this year. They have three camps on Pigeon river on the Canadian side, and will make a larger cut than usual there.

The Elder-Dempster Co., steamship owners, are also engaged in the cultiva-tion of fruit on the Canary islands, and recently placed an order with an Ottawa firm for a cargo of box shooks for the manufacture of crates. The stock will be shipped to the Canary island on the steamship Turrett.

D. L. Mather, of Keewatin, Ont., has secured a contract from the Canadian Pacific Railway for from forty to fifty thousand jack pine ties. These ties are being taken out at Eagle Lake, and will be loaded at Vermillion Bay. The use of jack pine was decided upon as a result of the scarcity of tannarac and the difficulty of handling at the support season. of handling it in the summer season.

Robert Ward & Co., Limited, of Victoria, B. C., recently loaded the American schooner Fred J. Wood with mining props for Santa Rosalio, Mexico. She carried a cargo of 9,300 pieces, containing 180,000 lineal feet. The export of props has in the past constituted a profitprops has in the past constituted a profitable side industry of British Columbia lumbering, and the re-opening of the mines of Mexico is greatly stimulating the trade.

THE CUTTING OF TIMBER.

The Ontario government was interviewed recently by a deputation of lumbermen, including Cornelius Whitney, of the St. Anthony Lumber Co.; Alex. Fraser, Ottawa; H. Robinson, Ottawa; A. McKenzie, Ottawa; C. McLachlin, Arnprior, and J. Gillies, Braeside. They asked the government to grant licenses for cutting hardwood timber on land in Algonquin Park. Other matters in connection with lumbering were discussed at some length. The government promised nothing to the deputation, saying they had no accurate information regarding the timber in the park.

The Montreal members of the Quebec government were last week waited upon by a deputation of lumber merchants, including Hon. Geo. Bryson, Hon. J. K. Ward, David Gilhes, M.P.P. for Pontiac, Rodolph Tourir-tee, and E. B. Eddy. They asked for modifications in the egulations respecting the cutting of timber. CONDITIONS IN AUSTRALIA.

The state of the market has on the whole The state of the market has on the whole shown some little improvement within the past few weeks, many buyers having purchased supplies from stocks at the wharf and out of the yards, in the hope of not only a better demand being shown in the near future for both local and country requirements, but also with the belief that an increased range of the varied asso with the belief that an increased range of values may shortly rule for many of the varied descriptions of timber which come upon this market. Up to the present, however, no advance in prices has been shown in flooring, hing, and weatherboards, but for Oregon better rates are now ruling, and would appear likely to continue, as supplies on hand of this lumber are no more than a ficient to meet early actual wants. Several other kinds of timber have also slightly increased in value since the issue of our last report.

LATHS AND PICKRTS.— Imports: Laths, 105,570 pieces; pickets, 44,080 pieces. Arrival: Star of France, from Chemanus; and steamer, from Sydney. Business has been solve in both these lines but supplied are below requirements. Laths have been sold at from 335 6d to 35s, and pickets are worth £7 105 per 1000 pieces.

HINT TO CANADIAN MANUFACTURERS.

The Liverpool correspondent of the Timber Trades Journal, London, Eng., in referring to the lumber market, says:

'No one branch of our trade seems to show "No one branch of our trade seems to show diminution of activity, if, as we have said before, we except the Canadian pine trade in deals and boards. This market, like other recipients of large direct importations, is depressed from the large supplies which still come forward upon the old stock. If this part f the market is to have a rebound from its

present dull condition, it can only be found in a diminution of production. But this is hardly likely to occur. The millmen must have had a rare good time for a couple of years, and they are not likely to stay their hands until they are forced by a lower price upon the

"At any rate, this market and several others round the coast are over-burdened with stocks, and until these are cleared, or lessened to a material degree, we cannot hope for a better state of things here.

"What the Ottawa people may think is quite another story.

"Spruce deals keep slowly working up-

wards in price. Here we have some large cargoes landing which were bought at prices nominally 55, per standard below the current rates. The steamer "Asphodel" is landing about 700 standards of spruce deals for Jas. Halsall & Son, from which they should do well, as the demand keeps strong. One large importing firm tells us they have only alwart 1,000 standards in stock, which they will keep for the satisfaction of small orders. All who have stocks of sprace deals are holding on to them, as every indication points to still further advances as the closing season goes onwards to its termination. For a large steamer cargo now on the way £7 is wanted, and will probably be obtained before arrival."

SHIPPING MATTERS

The bark Africa has been chartered to load lumber at Boston for Buenos Ayres at \$9, if Rosano \$10. The bark F. V. Lovitt will load lumber at Yarmouth, N.S., for Buenos Ayres, at \$10.50.

The Lumber Section of the Toronto Board of Trade has been notified by the G.T.R. that after November 1st lumber rates to Eastern States points will be advanced to the basis of 21½ cents per 100 lbs. from Georgian Bay points to New York, other points pro rata; but the recent tariff advancing the rates to Buffalo, Suspension Bridge and Tonawanda will not be disturbed.
