CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS.

ONTARIO.

As the season advances the outlook for the lumber trade becomes more promising. The number of permits issued within the past fortnight for new buildings to be built in the city of Toronto shows that a large quantity of lumber will be consumed in building operations. It now seems probable that serious labor troubles in that city will be averted, in which case a season of great activity may confidently be predicted. In other parts of the province there promises to be more building than last year. The lumber market received an unexpected boom by the recent mild weather, which almost put an end to logging operations for the time being. It is doubtful whether there will be sufficient cold weather, accompanied by the necessary snow fall, during the next month to enable logging operations to be completed as arranged, while it is feared that there will be a scarcity of water for the drives this spring. It is predicted that weather conditions will curtail the quantity of logs available for this year's sawing by at least 20 per cent.

The stocks at the mills are so small that buyers are finding difficulty in obtaining the necessary assortments. There is practically no good lumber in white pine that has not been contracted for. Of the common grades the supply is more plentiful, although it is estimated that nothing will be left in the yards when the mills resume operations. Some manufacturers are asking \$14.50 to \$15.50 for box and common, the latter for 12 to 16 feet lengths. For 1 by 10 and 12 inch mill culls \$12 at the mill is asked. Hemlock lumber sells on the basis of \$9.50 for 2 x 4 up to 12 inch, in lengths from 12 to 14 feet. It is almost impossible to give a quotation on white pine shingles, as very few manufacturers have any for sale. For No. 1 pine lath as high as \$2.85 at the mill has been asked, but the average quotation is about \$2.75.

QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

There is not so much life to the spruce market as earlier in the year. The fact that the British trade has not improved to the extent that was expected has restricted the volume of buying on that account, but holders of Quebec spruce deals are showing no anxiety as to the future, believing that the market will absorb the supply at good prices. Fancy prices are being paid for clapboards for shipment to the United States, where the supply is very light. The quotation for No. 1, Boston delivery, is \$38. Cedar shingles continue

to sell on the basis of \$3.30 for extras. The log supply has become an important factor in the market. What is believed to be an early breaking up of winter has resulted in the decision of one or two operators not to attempt to drive their logs this year, as unless there should be large snow-falls within the next month, the streams will not be suitable for driving purposes. It is estimated that the cut this year on the Upper St. John river in New Brunswick was about 130,000,000 feet, which is about the same as last year. On the Lower St. John, however, unfavorable weather conditions curtailed the output. The total cut of spruce logs this winter was perhaps slightly less than one year ago, with the probability that a considerable proportion of the production will not reach the mills for this season's sawing.

UNITED STATES.

Our Albany price list this week shows an advance of one dollar per thousand in the price of 1 to 2 inch fine common and 1 by 12 inch shippers. This indicates the tendency of the white market. The recent mild weather has stimulated the buying of lumber. Dealers are picking up stock in the Lake Superior district and are paying prices which a few months ago would have been regarded as excessive. There is an active demand for No. 4 boards. This is one of the hopeful features of the white pine situation, as the supply of lower grades, while not large, is much greater than of good lumber. Should the demand develop as now seems probable, something approaching a famine in white pine will likely be experienced, particularly as the available crop of logs for the sawing season has been reduced in quantity by the recent mild weather. Spruce lumber is firm. The amount of dry stock on hand is gradually decreasing, whereas the new cut will not be in shipping condition for some time yet. Hemlock lumber has improved of late. An advance of one dollar per thousand has been made, the base price being \$14.50 at Buffalo, \$15 at Albany, \$16 at New York, and \$17 at Boston. It is claimed that the demand is greater than the supply. Hardwoods are stronger. Thick white ash has advanced at Buffalo to \$35 to \$37 for 1 1/2 to 2 inch, and \$40 to \$42 for 2 1/2 to 1 inch. Birch is being used quite largely for house finish. Basswood is meeting with a larger inquiry. A marked shortage of lath is reported from producing points and from eastern wholesale markets. In Chicago the yard quotation on No. 1 white pine laths \$4.25, and on No. 2 mixed and Norway \$3.75. At

Duluth and Ashland No. 1 is bringing \$3.75, and No. 2 \$3.25 in large quantities, and 25 cents more in car load lots. Shingles are firm in price, and the demand is increasing. It is predicted that extra A red cedar shingles will bring \$3 in the Minneapolis market before the close of this year. The present price is \$2.65. Clear white pine shingles are bringing \$3.40 in Chicago.

GREAT BRITAIN.

We cannot report a material improvement in the British timber market. Very little buying is being done by importers, as there is an impression that the prices which shippers are asking are too high, and that sooner or later they must be adjusted to the level of the market. The consumption is moderately active, but dealers are obtaining their requirements from the stocks now landed, which in most cases can be bought on more liberal terms than in the case of new stock to arrive. First quality pine deals of broad average are inquired for, and recent sales have been made at high prices. The lower qualities are less firm. The outlook for spruce does not seem to be as good as it was two months ago. Prices at auction sales have shown weakness, 3 x 7 unassorted selling as low as £7 5s, and a small lot of third quality Quebec spruce, 3 x 11, at about £8 10s. The stock of waney timber at Glasgow and Liverpool is small and there has been some activity in demand. Messrs. Denny, Mott and Dickson state that the attempt to substitute swamp elm for Canadian rock elm has caused much friction and dissatisfaction to dealers and consumers in Great Britain.

STOCKS AND PRICES.

Mill culls are held as high as \$15 by some Buffalo dealers. The range of box lumber is from \$17 to \$25.

Butler Bros., of Woodstock, Ont., have recently made an extensive purchase of shingles in British Columbia.

John Cameron, of Watson's Corners, Ont., has sold 100,000 feet of pine lumber to H. S. Toffey, of Portland, and 50,000 feet to T. B. Caldwell, of Lanark.

R. A. Brown, of Grand Forks, B. C., is taking out 2,700,000 ft. of logs on the north fork of the Kettle river, to be manufactured at the mill of Lequime & Powers on Smelter Lake.

W. H. McAuliffe, of Ottawa, has purchased 2,000,000 feet of dry lumber, the cut of A. Lumsden's mill at Temiscaming.

Some of the lumber will be shipped to the United States and the balance sold in the local market.

It is estimated that the cut of logs during the past winter on the Cannan river in Queen's county, N. B., was about 5,000,000 feet. Of this quantity West Bros. got out over one million, the Sussex Mercantile Co. one million, and H. B. Heatherington over one and a half million.

The recent mild weather has been a drawback to logging operations. The Parry Sound Lumber Company have their logs cut in their own camps about all watered, but some of their jobbers are behind with their work. Hamill Bros. have 20,000 pieces yet to water, and McCormick & McLeod have 100,000 logs to draw. The William Peter Estate have made good progress with their logging operations.

Quotations at the Chicago yards for No. 1 pine piece stuff range from \$16 to \$20 for short and from \$18 to \$26 for long, the latter quotation being 3x12-30. No. 1 boards are quoted at from \$25 to \$26 for 12 inch, \$21 to \$22.50 for 10 inch and \$22.50 for 8 inch. No. 2 boards are based on \$22 to \$23.50 for 12 inch, \$19.50 for 10 inch and \$18.50 for 8 inch. No. 3 boards sell at \$16.50, \$17 and \$17.50 for 8, 10 and 12 inch respectively.

Messrs. S. P. Musson, Son & Company in their report of March 1st, say of the Barbadoes market: "The arrivals have been the 'Mercedese,' from Belliveau Cove, N. S., and the 'Hattie P,' from Annapolis, N.S. The cargo of the former was sold for another market; that of the latter, consisting of 40,000 feet white pine, 44,000 feet spruce and 5,000 plain hemlock, has been sold at \$20.05 shipping. \$14.50 second quality white pine; \$17.05 shipping, \$13.05 second quality spruce; \$11 hemlock. It is reported that other cargoes are on the way, and the market is heavily stocked. No receipts of shingles have taken place.

There are in the St. John river above and below the Fredericton booms and at Grand Falls, N. B., about 30,000,000 feet of loose logs which have come down from the drives and are now in the ice. At a meeting of representative lumbermen held last week, tenders were opened for delivering the logs at the different mills, but as they were considered too high, it was decided that the lumbermen should do the work themselves, under the direction of J. Fraser Gregory. The logs are so situated that should the ice suddenly run the logs would be in danger of being carried out to the sea.

THE BOSTON MARKET.

The spruce lumber market is firmer, with a better demand. The departure of the snow has started up building operations, or would have but for the transportation strike. But that is now over. Meantime advices from the northern and eastern spruce mills say that the snow is

about all gone, and that the cut of spruce logs has been considerably shortened. Lumbermen also fear that the drives must be hung up for the want of water. Orders are better, but full prices have to be paid: Ten and 12 inch dimensions, \$20; 9 inch and under, \$18; 10 and 12 inch random lengths, 10 feet and up, \$19 to \$19.50; 2x3, 2x4, 2x5, 2x6, 2x7 and 3x4, 10 feet and up, \$16 to \$16.50; all other randoms, 9 in. and under, 10 feet and up, \$17 to \$17.50; 5-inch and up merchantable boards, \$15 to \$16; matched boards, \$18 to \$19; cut spruce boards, \$13, bundle furring, \$16 to \$17.

Hemlock is fully sustained at the recent advance: Boards, 12, 14 and 16 feet stock, \$15 to \$15.50 for good eastern; Pennsylvania, No. 1, \$16 to \$17; No. 2, \$14.50 to \$15.

White pine is firmer and higher, with advices of a still further shortened supply, from which there is never to be any relief: Uppers, 1-in. \$75 to \$80; 2 1/2 and 3 in. \$80 to \$85; 4-in. \$85 to \$88; selects, 1 to 1 1/2 in. \$65 to \$68; 2-in. \$69 to \$70; 2 1/2 to 3 in. \$74 to \$76; 4-in. \$79 to \$80; fine com-

mon, 1-in. \$56 to \$58; 1 1/4 to 1 1/2 in. \$62 to \$66; 2-in. \$68 to \$70; 2 1/2 and 3 in. \$69 to \$71; 4-in. \$80; barn boards, \$23 to \$33; coffin boards, \$27 to \$32.

Hardwoods are steady, with a quiet request: One-inch, whitewood, \$38 to \$40; thicker, \$39 to \$42; 1/2 inch, \$30 to \$35; saps, inch, \$25 to \$30; common, \$23 to \$25; quartered oak, \$56 to \$65; fancy, \$70 to \$75; plain oak, \$40 to \$47; black ash, \$40 to \$50; white ash, \$45 to \$55; cherry, \$90 to \$130; maple, \$32 to \$40.

Shingles are in short supply: Extra cedar, \$3.30 to \$3.35; clear, \$2.90 to \$3; second clear, \$2.35 to \$2.50; sup. \$2.10; extra No. 1, \$1.75 to \$1.90; Washington and British Columbia red cedar, 16-inch, five butts to 2 inches, \$3.45 to \$3.50; 18-inch, \$4.25 to \$4.50.

Clapboards continue scarce and fancy prices are paid: Extra spruce, \$38 to \$40; clear, \$36 to \$38; second clear, \$33 to \$35; extra No. 1, \$24 to \$26.

Laths continue firm: One and five-eighths inch, \$3 to \$3.25; 1 1/2 inch, \$2.85 to \$3.

A London importer has asked to be referred to Canadian makers of turned wood boxes and other similar wood goods,

The shingle mill of the British Columbia Manufacturing Co. on Falso Creek, near Vancouver, B.C., was destroyed by fire last week. The capacity of the mill was 76,000 shingles per day, and the loss is estimated at \$12,000.
