TIMBER LIMIT TRANSACTION.

One of the largest transactions in timber limits that has taken place in Ottawa in recent years was quietly concluded recently, when the W.C. Edwards Company purchased from the Arthur Hill Company, of Saginaw, Michigan, a large limit in the Temiskaming region, said to contain some of the best timber in Canada. The purchase price is in the neighborhood of \$300,000.

CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS. ONTARIO.

There are no visible signs of weakness in the pine lumber market. All grades are firm and moving quite actively. Persons who earlier in the year predicted lower prices have now changed their attitude towards the market, and expect the sustenance of present prices at least. Good crops throughout the province have inspired confidence in a continuance of business prosperity. A large manufacturer who sold his season's production of pine lumber early in the season tells us that he is constantly in receipt of letters from dealers and customers to the effect that they would regard it as a favor if he could supply them with a certain quantity of lumber. This, perhaps more than anything else, illustrates the strength of the market. There are practically no large blocks of lumber that have not passed out of first hands. Log run pine delivered on the water's edge of the Georgian Bay has been sold as high as \$23.

The activity in hardwoods is looked upon in a very favorable light. There will doubtless be a heavy consumption of hardwood lumber this fall for building and factory purposes, and the supply of stock will be none too great to go round. Some of the standard varieties are likely to witness a further advance.

QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

There has been quite active buying of spruce lumber of late and the mills will likely go into the winter with very light stocks. Prices have gradually strengthened and are now at a point where they represent a fair margin of profit to manufacturers. Shipments from Montreal to the British market are quite active, although the total for the season will probably show a falling off as compared with last year. In spruce claphboards we find an extraordinary condition of affairs. The supply is insufficient to meet the demand; in fact there is something closely resembling a dearth. Where the supply for the fall and winter trade will come from is a question. Shingles continue strong on the basis of \$3.50 to \$3.60 per extras on Boston freight rate. It is predicted that there will be an advance in cedar shingles in September, when dealers commence to buy for the fall trade.

MANITOBA AND BRITISH COLUMBIA.

The active building movement in all parts of the west has created a demand for lumber which mills have much difficulty in meeting. So great has been the pressure upon stocks that prices have again advanced and are now \$1 per thousand

higher for all kinds of white pine, red pine and British Columbia lumber. Lath has also advanced to the extent of 25 cents per thousand, making the wholesale price in Winnipeg now \$4.00. British Columbia mill work is very busy, but logging operations are all handicapped by the scarcity of men.

UNITED STATES.

The conditions outlined in last issue still prevail. Wholesale dealers could do a little more business, but still their sales are greater than is usual in midsummer. The recent advances put into effect are being easily sustained. Wide box lumber is a good seller in the eastern markets. Building at Buffalo and Tonawanda is quite brisk and has had a good effect upon the market. A few Michigan dealers report that it is not so difficult to pick up lumber at manufacturing points as it was in the spring. This, however, might be expected after the mills have been in operation for several months. Spruce lumber is strong and quite active. On frames prices are being well sustained. On an easy schedule there are small mills ready to concede a little in price, but the large producers refuse to give way except in the case of random, which is weak. Hemlock is steady at last quotations. Hardwood lumber is showing considerable life and will probably be somewhat higher before many weeks. The demand for cedar shingles is quite heavy. There has been no cutting of prices except by one or two of the small manufacturers. This is almost remarkable for the season of the year, as it has been quite customary for weakness to exhibit itself during the months of July and August. It is predicted that shingles will advance next month, as the stock in the hands of manufacturers is practically of no account. Lath is moving quite freely without any great exertion on the part of the seller.

GREAT BRITAIN.

Lumber prices in the British market continue to show a hardening tendency. Business is progressing favorably, and indications point to a firm market throughout the year. The statistical position of the timber in the London public docks is a very strong one, all classes of lumber showing a decrease as compared with the stock on hand August 1, 1901. The decreases are as follows: Pine deals, 132,610 pieces; pine battens, 25,080 pieces; spruce deals, 171,590 pieces; spruce battens, 119,458 pieces. There is a decided shortage in the supply of the upper grades. At the Millwall Docks pine deals show an increase of about 650 standards. The belief is growing that the falling off in the importations this year will represent a larger percentage than was at first expected, whereupon certain importers are speculating in deals and battens for fall shipment. Higher prices are anticipated at Liverpool. The best quality of pine deals are selling readily at high figures, but the poorer grades move slowly. The stock of waney pine and first-class oak at Liverpool is lighter than has been known for some time. Birch logs continue firm in price.

STOCKS AND PRICES.

The steamer Hampshire is loading deals at St. John, N. B., for the United Kingdom.

The Bank of British North America is asking for tenders up to October 31st for 13,776 acres of British Columbia timber leases.

The Savanne Lumber Company, of Sav-

anne, Ont., have received their last tow of logs for the season, numbering 200,000 pieces.

Vigars & Company, of Port Arthur, Ont., will supply a large quantity of timber for the new storage elevator to be built there by Barnet & Record.

There were exported from Canada to Bay City during the month of July 13-483,937 feet of pine lumber and 2,491,850 pieces of lath, with a total value of \$216,345.67.

P. A. Smith, who has had charge of the logging operations for the Rat Portage Lumber Company, states that all of the company's logs are now in deep water ready for towing.

A fortnight ago Hale & Bell disposed of their limits in the township of Ermatinger to N. N. Wright & Company, who recently purchased a mill at Cutler. It is said that the consideration was \$160,000.

The Montgomery Door & Box Company, of Buffalo, have purchased the entire stock of lumber belonging to the Sheppard & Morse Lumber Company at North Tonawanda. The latter intend giving up their yard at that point.

Bliss & Van Auken, of Saginaw, Mich., are offering to dispose of their entire stock of white pine, as they intend to discontinue that part of their business. They claim that white pine cannot now be handled from that market with advantage.

The total stock of wood in the public docks at London, England, on August 1st, 1902, was 20,439,000 pieces, as compared with 25,663,000 pieces in 1901, 16,882,000 pieces in 1900, and 15,127,000 pieces in 1899. Deliveries for the first seven months of this year were 22,960,000 pieces, against 23,786,000 pieces for same period last year.

Commenting upon the cooperage stock market, the Sutherland-Innes Company, of Chatham, Ont., say: The situation is not a good one from the manufacturer's standpoint. There is hardly a mill in the country running, being closed down either for lack of logs or rather than see stock mildew just as soon as it is placed in the yard. At present it looks as if the price of No. 1 stave will approach the present price of hoops before the season is over. The difficulty this season will not be to get enough hoops, but to get enough staves for the trade. Hoops are a little easier, staves are going up, while heading remains about the same.

We quote from the market report of S. P. Musson, Son & Company, Barbadoes, under date of August 2nd, as follows: There have been no further arrivals of white pine since our last, and a small cargo will probably bring fair prices. In spruce, the "Civilian" arrived from Tuskent, N.S., on 21st ult., with 94,000 feet, which was placed at \$19.60. The demand is very limited at present. The Civilian had a small lot of 22,000 laying spruce shingles, extra good quality, which were sold at \$2.21. A cargo of cedar by the "Lizzie Lindsay" was placed at \$4.07 to \$3.67½ for long; \$6.27 for 5-inch; \$7.27 for 6-inch; and \$8.27 for 7-inch.

Spruce deals, say the Timber Trades Journal, keep on their recent firm basis of 67 7/8. Gd. c.i.f. for common run of a mill, with corresponding increase for better specifications and assortments. Whilst on the subject of spruce deals, we may say David Roberts, Son & Co., Ltd., of this port, have just received a shipment of Roumanian spruce, chiefly 3x11 and 3x9, and

of an extraordinary long average length, some running up to 32 ft. We saw some going through the planing machine and they come out with clear and satiny surface. These were being prepared for one of the Liverpool liners which has been chartered by the Government for five years for transport duty. As these fixtures will be permanent until the time charter is over, it speaks well for the quality of the new import. We hear, however, that the brokers are already asking a large advance in price, which in general opinion is likely to strangle the baby in its birth.

WAGON OAK.

Considerable activity marks the railway carriage and wagon building trade in the Midlands, says the Timber Trades Journal, of London, Eng. Orders, we learn from a good source, have come in from the chief foreign countries, some of which had previously been delayed owing to political complications. It is estimated that foreign orders worth £120,000 have come in by the last one or two mails, while recent government and other South African requirements will make up an additional £100,000. The home railways are also in the market for rolling stock. Oak being so largely used in railway carriage and wagon building, it is not surprising to find that prices both for Baltic hewn oak logs and for American white oak scantlings have advanced. Of the former, stocks at Danzig and Stettin are within unusually small compass, and the knowledge that one of the large English railroads were on the market with large inquiries led to shippers promptly advancing prices. With short stocks and higher prices at the Baltic ports the question of obtaining supplies from Odessa is one which is being urged by agents representing interests in that port. As regards American white oak scantlings, shippers appear to be very much behind hand with their contracts, owing to the scarcity of stock, and for further orders for prime planks advanced prices are being asked.

LONDON IMPORTS OF TIMBER.

Churchill & Sim say: From the St. Lawrence the arrivals have been: Pine deals, 712,000 pieces, against 1,005,000 pieces in 1901; spruce deals, 777,000 pieces, against 1,443,000 pieces in 1901. From New Brunswick and Nova Scotia: Pine deals, 90,000 pieces, against 176,000 pieces in 1901; spruce deals, 119,000 pieces, against 244,000 pieces in 1901; birch planks, 79,000 pieces, against 108,000 pieces in 1901. The importation of pine and spruce to this market has been very much reduced by the great demand elsewhere in the United Kingdom, and es-

pecially in America. Pine deals have been a quiet market, and prices have hardly moved except for the very best descriptions, which show some slight improvement. Spruce has been eagerly competed for at higher prices, and the small quantities available have mostly gone direct into consumption, leaving the stock in the docks a very small one. The position of hardwoods has slightly improved during the month, and the stocks have been refreshed by a few importations.

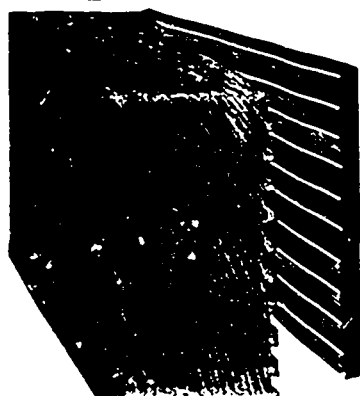

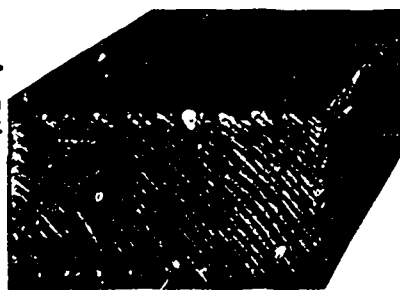

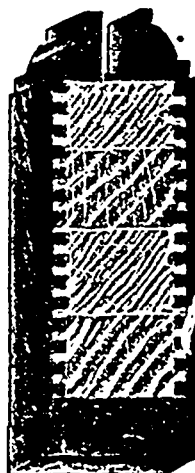

THE BOSTON MARKET.

Spruce lumber seems to be a little firmer at Boston, with the demand rather better and less desire on the part of manufacturers to urge business. The low grade randoms that have recently hung over the market have many been worked off. Quotations are firm: Ten and 12-inch dimensions, \$20 to \$21, 9-inch and under,

\$19 to \$20; 10 and 12 inch, random lengths, 10 feet and up, \$20.50; 2x3, 2x4, 2x5, 2x6, 2x7, and 3x4, 10 feet and up, \$17 to \$17.50; all other randoms 9 inch and under 10 feet and up, \$16.50 to \$18; 5-inch and up, merchantable boards, \$17; matched boards, \$19 to \$20; out spruce boards, \$13.50 to \$14; bundle furring, \$17 to \$18.

Hemlock lumber is steady, with offerings small: Boards, 12, 14 and 16 feet stock, \$15 to \$15.50 for good eastern; Pennsylvania, No. 1, \$16 to \$17.50; No. 2, \$15 to \$15.50.

White pine is even firmer and higher, with quotations advanced: Uppers, 1-in. to 2 in. \$82.50 to \$85; 2 1/2 to 3 in. \$87 to \$90; 4-in. \$90; selects, 1 in. \$98; 1 1/2 to 1 3/4 in. \$70; 2 in. \$72; 2 1/2 to 3 in. \$80; 4 in. \$82; fine common, 1-in. \$62 to \$63; 1 1/2 to 1 3/4 in. \$65; 2-in. \$67.50; 2 1/2 and 3 in. \$72.50; 4-in. \$82.50; barn boards, \$23 to \$33; coffin boards, \$28 to \$32.

Hardwood lumber is firm, with a steady request: Quartered oak, \$64 to

\$66; plain oak, \$41 to \$45; common and rejects, \$20 to \$25; whitewood, \$42 to \$43; sap and common, \$30 to \$35; brown ash \$41 to \$44; white ash, \$43 to \$46; maple, \$28 to \$30; end-dried white maple, \$38 to \$42; birch, \$27 to \$30; birch, 75 per cent. red, \$45 to \$50; elm, \$29 to \$31.

Shingles are in pretty good demand and firm, with shippers wanting 10 cents more for next month's shipment: Extra cedar, \$3.50 to \$3.60; clear, \$3 to \$3.10; second clear, \$2.50; extra No. 1, \$1.90 to \$2; British Columbia red cedar, 16-inch, five butts to 2 inches, \$3.75 to \$3.80; 18-inch, \$4.25 to \$4.50.

Clapboards are scarce and high: Clear, \$38 to \$40; second clear, \$35 to \$36; extra No. 1, \$25 to \$30.

Laths are firmer, with the New York market higher: One and five-eighths inch, \$3.10 to \$3.15; 1 1/2 inch, \$2.95 to \$3.00.
