### CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS.

ONTARIO.

If present trade is any criterion of the fall demand, an active lumber business may be expected. No one complains of more than seasonal dullness, while the number of inquiries received indicates an early change for the better. Investigation leads to the conclusion that the stocks of dealers and consumers are generally light and in need of replenishment. Buyers have held off in the hope of being able to purchase to better advantage, and being unsuccessful are now disposed to accept the inevitable. The proposed increase in pine stumpage dues is not indicative of lower prices for lumber.

There is an active demand for low grade pine, particularly box lumber and mill culls. The consumption of box lumber this season has been exceptionally heavy, box factories being operated to their utmost capacity. The position of mill culls is equally strong. The price at the mills in the Georgian Bay district is in the neighborhood of \$10.50 per thousand feet. This price has been paid by American buyers, and with a duty of two dollars and freight rate of from \$1.50 to \$2, means a total cost for the stock laid in the yards on the west coast of Lake Huron of upwards

of \$14. The good end of pine is also much inquired for, leaving the intermediate grades the most inactive.

The demand for hardwoods is not less pronounced than heretofore. The mills have very little dry stock for sale. Prices are uniformly firm, with singular strength in birch, which is meeting with a heavy call for furniture manufacture. Basswood is slightly more plentiful than earlier in the season, but still in short supply.

QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

The past week has witnessed considerable activity in lumber shipments from the Eastern Provinces. Montreal exports have been quite heavy, consisting chiefly of the Ottawa valley production. The spruce market maintains its strength. Boston is a large buyer of clapboards even at the high prices now ruling. There has lately been received several inquiries for cargo lots of spruce lumber for shipment to New York, where the demand is quite active. In some sections, principally eastern Nova Scotia and Cape Breton, there is a scarcity of spruce sheathing and flooring.

It is necessary to quote a wider range for New Brunswick cedar shingles, as the market is still unsettled. Small manufacturers are offering extras as low as \$3.35 for Boston delivery, while a few of the more prominent manufacturers are holding out for \$3.50. It is probably within the mark to say that the bulk of the transactions are on the basis of \$3.40 for extras, with clears fluctuating between \$2.85 and \$3.

MANITOBA AND BRITISH COLUMBIA.

The general tone of the lumber market throughout the west is not as firm as it was, although the demand is still of fair proportions. Lower prices are predicted by some, while others argue that after the crops are harvested the demand will be such as to keep prices steady. The shingle mills in British Columbia which cater to the Canadian trade are now closed down, in accordance with the general resolution, but those supplying the American market are still in operation. The demand for shingles from the Northwest has practically ceased temporarily. The position of loggers has not improved, one of the largest firms in the province having been compelled to make an assignment within the past week.

UNITED STATES.

Taken as a whole the lumber market of the United States is more active than at last writing. Buffalo and Tonawanda dealers are making large shipments to the Eastern States and travellers from that district have returned with very satisfac-

tory orders. If labor matters at New York should become permanently settled for this reason it would do much to still further revive the eastern markets. Price lists issued indicate that there has been no weakness. Some Buffalo dealers are asking \$100 for 6-inch white pine uppers, \$94 for 4-inch, \$80 for 2-inch and \$75 for inch selects. While receipts at that point have been quite heavy stocks have not increased to any extent. Business at Bay City and Saginaw has improved during the week. There is more inquiry for lumber and some dealers who purchased earlier in the season are being offered an advance of fifty cents a thousand on what is still to be manufactured for them at the mills. Much interest is taken in the meeting of the Mississippi Valley Lumbermen's Association to be held this week. The Association has been making inquiry into stock conditions with the object of revising the price list. It is probable that an advance will be made in the price of dimension, as everything points to a serious shortage in this class of lumber. The percentage of dimension being sawed is very small and it is thought that the production might be stimulated by raising the price. The hemlock manufacturers are also considering the question of advancing prices.

A decline in cargo spruce was predicted some time ago, but owing to the fact that the logs have been slow in reaching the mills the opposite condition has resulted. Prices have stiffened materially, the supply being below the demand and many mills refusing to quote figures. Some of the Bangor mills have sawed all their logs. A freer movement of spruce lumber may be expected in September, and an easing off in prices would not be unnatural.

Oak and basswood still lead among the hardwoods, although the entire list is active and firm. Our Buffalo quotations this week show an advance of \$2 in ash and elm. Good ash is very scarce and is being replaced by maple to some extent. Birch is also selling quite freely.

**GREAT MOUNTAIN.**

It is difficult to reach a conclusion as to the actual condition of the British lumber trade. One usually reliable authority states that the receipt of large shipments has taken the edge off the market and that prices are maintained only with difficulty. On the other hand, information from other sources indicates an improvement in trade and a somewhat hopeful feeling in regard to the outlook. Canadian lumber has been firm all season, and now it is stated that White Sea shippers have absolutely refused to make any concessions whatever, stating that if they cannot obtain their present asking prices they will hold their stocks over until next season. For the first seven months of this year the imports of sawn and planed

lumber were 2,919,921 loads, as against 2,899,963 loads for the corresponding period of last year. Thus it will be seen that the increased import is very slight. As the consumption has been of average volume, the stock on hand is not large.

The retail trade are placing orders more liberally, having apparently realized that there is not likely to be any material slump in the prices of the best class of lumber. First quality pine deals range from £25 to £31 per standard, while third quality sell as low as £12. The strength of spruce deals is frequently commented upon by the trade. At some points, especially Bristol and Liverpool, the stock of the better grades is unusually low. Red pine deals now command from £19 10s to £22 for first quality, and from £13 to £15 for second quality. Some dealers are carrying more than an ordinary stock of red pine on account of its lower price in comparison with white pine, believing that the demand for it will steadily grow. Waney and square pine timber is in good demand at high prices.

**STOCKS AND PRICES.**

During the week ending August 15th 29 vessels reached the Tonawandas, with a total of over 22,000,000 feet of lumber.

The steamer Dunmore Head, from Montreal, with a cargo of deals for the Imperial government, arrived at Portsmouth last week.

J. Carew, of Lindsay, Ont., has secured a contract to supply ties for the Lindsay, Bobcaygeon and Pontypool Railway.

The schooner Eduardo is loading lumber at Bear River, N. S., for Grenada, Clarke Bros. being the shippers. The barque Hornet is loading at Annapolis, N. S., for Havana.

P. S. McManus, of Memramcook, N.B., has secured a contract for the reconstruction of the Courtenay Bay branch of the Intercolonial Railway. The work will call for over 1,000,000 feet of timber.

The last of the drives on the St. Croix river, N. B., which left Vanceboro, on July 6th, reached Milltown, on August 15. Very few logs were left behind on any of the St. Croix waters.

The St. Joe Island Lumber Company, of Sault Ste. Marie, Ont., last week received a raft of 150,000 feet of logs from Batchewana Bay, being the last of this season's Lake Superior cut.

The tug Harrison arrived at Owen Sound Ont., last week from Byng Inlet, with a raft comprising 750,000 feet of logs for the John Harrison & Sons Company. The company have still 3,000,000 feet at Byng Inlet to be brought down this season.

The cooperage trade is in fairly good condition. There are practically no No.

2 staves nor heading in stock at Buffalo. Jobbers quote first-class elm flour barrel staves at \$9.75, mill run at \$7.50, and second-class at \$6; first-class basswood heading 7 cents, mill run 6½ cents; coiled hoops \$9.75 for 5½ foot, \$10.25 for 6 foot.

Daniel McCoy, of Grand Rapid, Mich., and others have timber estimators at work in British Columbia on a tract of timber 100 miles in length and 2 miles wide, covered with fir, spruce and cedar, estimated to cut 2,000,000,000 feet. If reports are favorable a syndicate will purchase the property.

Licenses to cut timber on the following berths will be sold at Fredericton, N. B., on September 2nd: Two square miles at mouth of Crystal Brook, Nepisiguit river, R. McEwan, applicant; 4½ square miles on Never's Brook, branch of Caanan river, J. H. Barry, applicant; 2 square miles at head of Gibson's creek, George W. Masten, applicant; 2 square miles south of Shediak river, east of McLaughlan road, J. H. Barry, applicant; 2 square miles on Salmon river, Henry Lamp, applicant; 3 square miles on north branch of Oromocto river, F. Phillips, applicant.

Of the lumber demand in the Barbadoes Messrs. Clairmonte, Man & Company say: "Just now our market for white pine is moderately supplied. Last local sales of small lots ex Talmouth was at \$22.43 as it runs. Last sale of spruce was at \$17.29. After our reaping season is over, the demand for lumber, especially spruce, generally falls off. The last importation of Gaspe long cedar shingles was 100,000 of small size from St. John, N. B., which sold at \$3.33 per M. Good large size are worth \$4.50 to \$5. Cedar laying are held at \$2.24 to \$3.20 according to quality, and spruce laying at \$2.24."

The Mississippi Valley Lumberman thus refers to the white pine lumber market: "The white pine situation has shown marked and decided improvement within the past ten days or two weeks. This fact is made apparent by the reports of manufacturers in the two valleys. There is but one strong reason for this. They now more thoroughly appreciate the situation. During the past month a number of large companies permitted their quotations to sink considerably under list. Concessions have even been made on items that are in very small supply all over the country. Something of the nature of panic was experienced, though statistically the market should have been in the best of conditions. They were unable to withstand the many times repeated reports of crop failures and light demand for lumber. Most of them appear to have come to their senses again and the market to-day is much stronger than it has been for some time. There can be no doubt but that the demand for pine has increased, principally from the country trade. The line yards

are placing more numerous and heavier orders than was the case three weeks ago and this condition is also true of the small dealer. Their confidence has been restored by the late crop reports, which show that the damage to grain in different parts of the pine territory will not be as large as expected. The wheat crop will be of fair size and in addition wheat prices are soaring, promising as heavy returns in actual money as ever received by the northern farmers.

**BRITISH COLUMBIA LETTER.**

(Special Correspondence of the CANADA LUMBERMAN)

The lumber industry in all parts of British Columbia is in a fairly prosperous condition. For the past few months large shipments have been made by land and sea, and orders continue to come in, necessitating some of the mills running overtime to fill rush orders. Trade in Manitoba and the Territories is very satisfactory and will likely continue so. Reports of lumber agents in those parts state that although the crops in Manitoba are not equal to those of last year by at least fifteen per cent.; the condition of buyers financially is satisfactory and the price of grain is higher than last year, which will more than compensate for the shortage. Prices for foreign shipments remain firm and the demand fair.

In the shingle industry, there has been an over-production, and the mills, with the exception of two or three of the smaller ones, have signed an agreement to shut down for thirty days to relieve the situation. Many of the mills have been running two shifts for some time and the market has been temporarily overstocked. It is not the intention of the Manufacturers' Association to make any cut in price, and eastern buyers who have been endeavoring to "bear" the market are not likely to accomplish their object, unless something unforeseen occurs. The manufacturers almost to a man are resolved on keeping the prices firm, and there is little fear of the price of shingles being lowered below a fair profit-making basis.

The logging business has been overdone. "Hot air" newspaper accounts of the enormous profits that were to be made in the business, induced inexperienced men in the business to invest, with the consequence that there were about one-third more logs going into the water than the mills had a market for. The result has been that prices of the inferior grade of logs have fallen \$2.50 per thousand feet, which practically places many of them below cost. Some firms have already assigned and more are likely to follow. Many of those now in the business are closing their camps and the industry will regain its equilibrium shortly. Over-booming of the industries of British Columbia by the press has its detrimental effects, and it

would be wisdom for intending investors to make careful investigation as to where a market for their product is to be found before making investments in the lumber and shingle industry. There are more than enough mills in the Province to supply what Canadian trade comes to British Columbia, and lumbermen here are practically shut out of the United States market by the duty. On the other hand, United States rough lumber and shingles come into Canada free and in some instances this country is made the dumping ground for their surplus.

**FOURTH QUALITY PINE**

It is pleasant to be able to report in favor of consumers that the culling of pine—especially in 3rd quality deals—is generally found to be satisfactory. Several parcels which we have personally inspected are so good as to remind us of the high-water mark of a few years ago. It is evident, therefore, that £13 c.i.f. for an ordinary specification of 3rd quality 3 in. deals is leaving the maker a sufficient margin of profit to raise the culling, and thus in another form to help the British importer to better please those he has to cater for. The worst feature of the demand is seen in the cabinet trade, in which direction the bulk of the 4th quality

deals shipped are required. This big demand is now being partially supplied by the lower qualities of planed cypress white-wood and cottonwood in thin kiln-dried sizes practically ready for use. Both these American woods are now admitted to be equally good substitutes for common pines, with the extra advantage of being regularly obtainable at a relatively lower range of values. This fully accounts for the shrinkage in 4th quality Canadian deals apart from the prevalent dullness in all classes of cabinet work.—Liverpool Timber News.

Hemlock is easier for eastern stock: Boards, 12, 14 and 16 feet stock, \$14.50 for good eastern; Pennsylvania, No. 1,

\$18.50 to \$19.50; No. 2, \$15 to \$16.50. There is a firm market for western pine lumber, though the demand is quiet: Uppers, 1 to 2 in. \$84 to \$87; 2 1/2 to 3 in. \$92 to \$97; 4-in. \$96 to \$100; selects, 1-in. \$76; 1 1/4 to 1 1/2 in. \$76 to \$78; 2-in. \$78; 2 1/2 to 3 in. \$84; 4-in. \$86; fine common, 1-in. \$67; 1 1/4 to 1 1/2 in. \$69; 2-in. \$72; 2 1/2 to 3 in. \$80; 4-in. \$82; barn boards, \$23 to \$33; coffin boards, \$28 to \$32.

Hardwood lumber is firm with a steady demand: Quartered oak, \$75 to \$83; plain oak, \$45 to \$47; common and rejects, \$20 to \$25; red oak, plain, \$43; white-wood, \$54 to \$60; sap, \$43 to \$48; common, \$38 to \$45; brown ash, \$41 to \$44; white ash, \$43 to \$46; maple, \$33 to \$37; end dried white maple, \$46; birch, \$27 to \$30; birch, 75 per cent. red, \$45 to \$50; northern elm, \$29 to \$31.

Clapboards are steady and unchanged: Extra, \$45; clear, \$43; second clear, \$40; extra No. 1, \$30.

Some off grade shingles are still selling at low prices, but generally the market is steady; western red cedars are firmer: Extra cedar, \$2.35 to \$3.50; clear, \$2.90 to \$3.00; second clear, \$2.25 to \$2.40; extra No. 1, \$1.50 to \$1.75; British Columbia red cedar, 16-in. five butts to 2-in., \$3.45 to \$3.50; 18-in. five butts to 2 in., \$3.75; five butts to 2 1/2 in., \$3.90 to \$4.

Laths are quiet: One and five-eighth in., \$3.15 to \$3.25; 1 1/2-in., \$3 to \$3.10.
