## HARVEST THANKSGIVING.

$0^{N}$the 20th of October. the day appointed by Government for Thanksgiving for the Harvest, there was morning prayer in the Church, followed by Holy Communion, and in the evening a Choral Service, the Church being decorated with grain, fruit, and autumn leaves. The attendance was not so large at cither service as was expected, which may to some extent, be attributed to the weather, the day being dull and cold.

The decorations were retained for service on the following Sunday, after which the grapes were sent to the Sick Children's Hospital and the other fruits, \&c., to the Orphans' Home.
