In many cases one ceilt. per pound prolit is being ireely made.
Shippers would be able to have far better results if they were to agree amongst themselves, at brokers in other businesses do, and lix a miníunm commission, belowis which they would not work; also if they would have a clear anderstanding about the weighing and paying for the cheese. Above all, buyers will have to insist that when they attend a conntry maket to buy cheese, and those cheose are pul on auction, that the farmer seils to the Highest bidder. Nine of the, exhibits from Canada secured 99 1-2 points out of a. possible 100 for perfection. Five of these lots were from Ontario and four from Quebec.
The result by provinces were as follows: Ontario, 275 exhibits, 260 awards; Quebec, 113 exhibits, 105 awards; Nown Scotia, 10 exhibits, 3 awards; New Brumewick, 4 exhibits, 2 awards; Prince Edward Island, 10 cxhíbits, 8 awards; Manitoba, 4 exhibits; 3 awards.

## PAYMINT OF DRAFT AFTER DRAWER'S

 insolviency.A correspondent of the Bankers' Magaaine p:opounds the interesting question: "Is it right, and can a bauk which is holding funds of a bank that has suspeñed rofuse payment of a draft drawn before suspension but not presented for paymente fay, until a day aftor the draweo has suspended, in the absence of instructions from the drawer?": American authorith ics do not reveal any decision of the quostion, and English cases are not much help, as they are simply a construction of the English bunkuptcy act. Doubtless, says our contemporary, if such a dyaft wis paid by the drawee without notice of the drawer's failure or lankruptey, he would be free from all liability to the drawer's assigneo subsequently chosen; but if the drawer's bankruptey was known, the snfest course would be to decline to pay his draft. There are other cases also in whicha draft operates as an equitille assigument of the drawer's funds in the possession of the draweo, and these can be safely paid with' out any roference to the death, bankruptcy or other happenings to the drawer. The drawee can always dechine to pay unless he is under an obligation to pay them, implied from the relation existing between the drawer and drawee, as in the case of a bank and its depositols, Several cases have arisen in which the drower has failed and the drawee had money in his hands, but instend of paring the drawer's drafts drawn before his bankruptey, has applied it to discharge an indebtness due from the diawer. The drawee is not compelled to pay, and doubless the saie course

the attempts of the Fire Insurance Companies to obtain special legislation are justifled by the action of the degis. latures of Ontario and Quebec in the matter of statutory conditions. But these attempts very generably result unentisfactorlify by reason of the amendments in the committees of the leglsiatures which are made by members who do not quite comprehend that the interests of assured and assumer are one.

The Fire Underwriters endeavour so far as it is possible for them to discriminate equitably in favour of those places in whith the fire department and appliances are equal to the local requirements bat it is, no doubt, very provoklag that the most ample provisions for safety are so often rendered wortiness by the neglect or ignorance or the want of thought in those who have the charge of the appliances or the command of the forces.
In our reports we remember one case in which the englue was in a house so situate that the water aroze on the Chreshold so that an axe haid to we procured to chop out the doorway. Then the wheels of the engine were found entangled by the same impediment. As though this was not sufficient-when the engine go to the river, the ice agaid formed a' barrier. Duxing all this time the fire-which a few palls of water would have quenched-was gaining headway so that when the engine was ready to work the building and stock were olready destroyod.
On another occusion the engine was promptly on the scene of the flue but something appeared to delay the raising of steam. Examination showed that no water had been put into the bower.
Thls object was lustantly remedled when the change of temperature canseid
a collapse of the boiler and gave the froa real good chance.
On another-engine, hose and men were all promptly at the seene of the fire; Jut only a tricking of water could be got for a long time. At last it was found that the hydrant had been only partially opened-but in the meantime the fire had become uncontrollable.
It is but recently that an impetnous fireman, having no key to the hydrant took a plank and knocked off the nozzle when of course no comection could be made and the fire went on its way un-impeded.
In another piace in which there is a chemical engine the Chief ordered some four or flve streams of water turned on to quell a smoke in a fragilo stock where perforce wetting meant al. most total loss of value.
It is a lamentrible fact that in too many cases the chief of the fire department depends yery much more on his stock of profanity than on the cool judgment which is necessary to safety and success.

We remember having pread some years ago a serics of papers on this subject which appeared to bo of very great value lix showlug how fires should be attacked. Main strength and lyuorance do too oiten cause more damage by the injudicious use of water, so that it is not alone the engines hose, water and men but the Man on, whom the companies und the people must rely for safety.

## * * *

Infuactions of Tariff will occur just so long as the Tarlffs are level promium tarifis in which a horse is a horse whether just discarded by the street Rahway or one sired by "muscovite" In other words-so long as every class of risks whith one tapifi rate presents differences in ownership, exposure and other occupaucles.

Incendiarism will flourish so long at
it is profitable and no longer. of counse there are cases of incendlarism for rerenge, but it is yery singular low seldom these occur when the sufferer is lightly insured.

There have decn cases iñ wnich incend. laulsm has been resorted to for the purpose of getting rid of a rival business, but the form which is most rifo finds the persous with unsaleable stocks or unrentable buildings and with insurances which leat the knowing ones to jump at conclusions to which they deem it unsafe to give utterance.
a Wittle more care in taking appli eations for insurance and in ingyecting tho risks wond materially diminish these sad occurrences because they would prevent over-Insurances and would give the assured knowledge that without proper accounts be was "uninsurable."

Advances in Losses necessarily lead to advances in rates -but when a tarlff which is a mininum tariff is confinuously minimized by intrigue, it is rough on those whose properties present the minlmum of risk, that they should suffer because they have not known "the ways that are dark and the trieks which are vain" but which are effectual in obtaining minimizations of the minimum.

Inspectors who inspect are valuable officers of insurance companies, but those who inspect the front exterior of the buflings only, or such parts of the interior as are specially brought to thele notice by the proprletors of the properties,are an expense without proportionate benefit. Of course the rays of the sun, being concentrated do some. times cause fires-but the much more frequent eanses of fires require for thein discovers and climination a Jantern and brains, and however difficult it may be to some of the Inspectors to compre:hend the fact, the enuses of fires may we more gencrally found by entering the wack door than by the front-whlist the
causes of conflagrations may be found in the rubbish of empty cases, emply crates and piles of straw and paper with whith the alleys of nearly every town and viluge are strewn.

*     *         * 

We are glad to note that the permits for other insurance without notice are to ve restricted to certain elassee of risks. We trust that the fullest consideration has been given to the article on this subject in our lssue of the 13th inst., Under the headng of "Pire Los. ses in 1893."
"Plate Glass" is a deceptlve deseription because so many aif the large sized panes of glass are not properly prate glass but are of the thinnest and most brittle of all substanees, so thero whould not only be speceilic amoments on plate glass in stock, wut there should be in provision of nou-liablitty for glass of more than $12 \times 20$ sige when in windows fin order that real plate glass may be more generally used and then it will be eovered by the Plate Glass Companles; or fif covered by fire policies will be spectically Insured.

Is a Laundry a Laundry? or is it a Hospital? or a Hotel? are very important ind afficult guestions. Does the good sammitanism of bite Hospital or the hospitality of the hotel lessen the dangers arising from the Laundry detached therefrom or not? If not, is the neth neighbomhood of the Hospi. tal a good exense for insuring the latundry at a dower rate than is commensurate with its hazard? If so, it winl be a good dea to be careful to stelect locations for lanndries near the good grey walls of the hospitals.

Ihe Co-Tnsurance clanse has ween used too much as a patent medicine warranted to cover all the ils to which fire underwrithg is jiable. Its fuse showd be as cantious as should be the "further insurince whthout notlee" permit. 'Lo restrict the datter while re. quiring the former would we an anomaly. The truth is that in fire underwriting as in every obler businessrules are good, but brains and experlence we idetter-the datter will wake such rules as may we necessary to suceess whilst the former alone will alwiys degenernte and be misapplied.

## * * *

Slop-Bowl-Is there $a$ limlt to the rate which may be adeguately levied upon any risk? Is there a risk of a class which may not properly be insured? If so the companles do not want
the rlsks and they need not care who gets them. li not, then il the CompanLes are Fire Insurance Compandes they shond not refuse them.
But if they object to the class as uninsurable, or the proper rates be unobtainable, why should they object to the Agents having places to put that which They themselves do not want and whll not have.
Are not the Companies in danger of having these which they deem not blessings in disguise if it becomes a question with the agent as to whether he shall lose hls commission or not?
Is it not a fact now that if one company deelines a risk it is sent from of fice to office with constantly modified descriptions untill some unwary office is sadded with it, whereas if the agen't had a slop-bowl or a hospital into which to putit. it would go there at once in all lis naked deformity to the general safely of the more conservative companies?
If the compauies require from thelr agents a distinct statement as to the risks declined by other companies, and the causes of their rejections, their eyes would sometimes be opened very wide by the audacity of the agents and theil want of a Slop Bowl.
-••
The Young Men-We trust the time whil soon come when the young men of the fire offices whll be eligible for membership in C.I. U. A., and that a gerics of addresses and discussions on the various questions affecting fire insurance will be a prominent feature of the Association. As it is proposed to organize a "House of Lords" in the guise of a Dominion Board, a "Llouse of Cadets" would te a valuable counterpoise, jeaving the House of Commons as the real legislators, so that there will be no encroachment upon "Provinciat Riglts"-no destriction upon "Home Rule" no bar to the Feleration of the Empire-but peneral development at every desk, in every office-among the agents and in the education of the people in their co-Interests in flre underwriting.

Thime was when such gentlemen as M. Bennet, Jr. now of the Scottish Union and National, and George I. Hope late President of the Conlinental and other gentiemen who Jand made Fhre Insurance t ilfe study, made addresses nhich roused discussion to the univers. al bencilt, whilst the field men of the Northwestern and Southern States wrote about and tallsed over tho exper-
lences and difficulties which beset them in their various vocations; therefore we are glad to note that it is proposed to extend the eliginility to membership in the C.I. U. A. and we liope it whll we in the direction of the young men to whom the interests of the country in respect to lire insurance will necessarily be confided.

- . .

It is undoubtedly necessary to the safety of Banks, Life Insurance Companies and Loan Companies that they should have some form of fire insurance which may glve them protection against the acts of the owners of the properties on which they marse advances; but this protection should not le against their own aets or laches; in other words, their fire Insurances should always be upon real values and not merely on suppositious ones. It is a sad fact, however that warehouse receipts are plot always guarantees of the proper. ties specified in them, and that the buildings upon mortgage propertles are not of their supposed intrinsic values. More than this, the subrogation clatuges in policles have been. found. . , generally deceptive that no reliance can now be placed upou them.
-- Under these circumstances it is somewhat difficult to. understand why the fire insurance companies have so long offered special inducements for these classes of ribks by paying commissions to clerks in connection with them.

BANK S'IATEMENTS.
It is a somewhat striking leature of the Govermment Bank Returm ; to 30th September that while the trade discounts have diminished in volune there has been an increase in chrculation of $\$ 1,819,959$ ' since 81 st August. It must, therefore, be agalnst withdiaw: ans from deposit accounts that the outflow has occurred, as we find that a deerease is shown in the statement of these funds of $\$ 1,203,113$. The current accounts are however only affected to the extent of $\$ 102,001$, while time-deposits linve been reduced $\$ 1,011,118$.

Though indicative of increased activily in trade, these changes show what need there was to bring into its arteries moneys which had ween in dormant condition for some months, moneys which with the season's adyancement came butt of hiding to seek a greater profit than that afforded by a Bank Deposit rate: they mlght have remained undisturbed had there not been a..ghrinkage $\ln$ the
amounts reanized from the sale of grains and other commodities.
To revert again to circulation we find that the figures now before us are $\$ 1,000,000$ beyond those of the corres. ponding montils of 1892 and 1891, and $\$ 2,000,000$ over the annual average of these two perlods; we may therafore hope to approach, if not surpass, the record of last year, when November is reached, which as will be remembered totalled $\$ 89,818,218$ during November, 1892.

Deposits slnce September of last year show an increase of $\$ 665,607$ owly, in both forms, as against a net increase of $\$ 11 ; 610,265$ in advances. To admit of thls latter increase the banks have reduced their lendings in the American centres, which from weing $\$ 24,211,355$ in 1892 fell to $\$ 13,451,883$ at the elose of lastimonth. The shrinkage which has
taken place throughout the year in speculative: ventures is shown in the-reduction of $\$ 4,868,080$ In stock loons. Specie and Dominion notes are less than durlng August by $\$ 242,095$,though $\$ 1,540,148$, greater than in 1892. The avorage holding is a fair one from $a$ conservative standpoint though in individual cases greater strength would not we amiss. Overdue debts, notwith. standing the midsummer appropriations, have Increased $\$ 649,134$ since September, 1892, and this sum is about equal to four per cent. upon the total increase for the year in trade discounts. We wast defer further reference to tho figures of the Return muth another issue, meantime directing attention to the comparative sitatement which we print below, and to the larger statement in detain which is in its usual place:

## STATISTICS IN BANKRUPTCY.

We are in receipt of a letter from the Statistical Branch of the Department of Agriculture at Ottawa, concurring in the view which we expressed last week concerning the importance of having la the harids of the puidle a return of the Rallures throughout the Domlnion whteh coudd be regarded as officiai. We appreciate with the Department the alfleultles which surrouid the compl:

Iation of statistics at the present time owlng to the differences of legal procedure in the several provinces, which multiply the arenues through whith these statistles would have to be sought. Coupled with this is the fact that there is nothing fin the statutes to compel an assignec of an insolyent estato to render a statement of affalis to the public. Notice of the insolyency is given by the assignce do the oiflelal

Gazette of his Province, and there lisis bounden duty ends. In the Province of Quebee the prothonotaries of the Superior Courts, or their Deputles, to whom abandomments are made, could furnish the Department with certain pough and hastily prepared figures; so might tha clerks of the Court of Queen's Bench in Manitoba and the Northwest Ter. ritories and the cleris of the varlous county courts in the other Provinces; but: thele figures would be insufficient and Incomplete. The Department could only ontain exact information directly from the assignees themselves.

Hence it follows that certaln legal enactments will be necessary before the public interest can be fully served, or the compilation of statistics made pos. sible.

Should the sentiment of the business community, as it may find expression in the House of Commons, lead to the adoption of a general Bankruptey mensure it will be within the duty of the Minister of Justice to secure the insertion of a special ciluse in the Act under which assignees shatl, whthin areasonable delay after recelving an assignment fyle with the statistical offee a wal. anee sheet, on some unlform plan. We say within a reasonable delay. for the moment at which the assignee at present trinsmits his announcemenit of the insolvency to the Official Gazette is too early a one in wiheh to expect any certified statement of the insolvent's affairs. A later date must therefore be selected.
But even with the existence of $n$ gencral Act, amendments must be made to the common law of the Province unnder which abnadonments arc at present effected for there are thoso in tho legal profession and efsewhere who contend that a general Bankruptey Act does not render the common daw, in regard to bankruptey proceedings, a nuy. lity. The assignees thereby created must also be brought under the operation of the clause requiring a stato. mont to be fyled, and without the amendments to the law they would be under no obligation to the country at large beyond what the public splrit might suggest.
It will not be lost time for the Boards of Trade hroughout the country to study our suggestions, and do what they can to help forward the preparation of the necessary statistics in Bunkruptey, wheh the able statistician Mr. Geo. Johnson is himself most anxl. ous to provide for publle information.

THA CITIZENS' RIGITTS AND DUJIIES.
I'ne recent formation of a Citizens' Manicipal Association, having for ita object the promotion of munieipal reforms by the dissemination of literalure bear. ing upon the sulbject, the raising and exponding, in a legitimate way, of funds to secure the nomination and election of wortiay men to sit at the Aldermanic Board-atl this affords us opportunity to enlarge upon the necussity of understanding aright the duties which overy male member of the community owes both to the State, and to that portion of it which constitutes the city or town in which le exercises his sufferages.
It is almost too late for him to perform these duties thoroughly, whether in assisting to redress wrongs, or to correct legishative abuses, or in working to improve civil govermment, if his activitics luve only been stirred through listoning to the declumations or demmeiations of others, after nome abouse has crept in, and not becanse he has all along been enbuged as a duty, in a careful stuly of the various events transpiring around him, and can say that the abuses have occurred notwithetanding his beat and most loynd efforts.

Where ean he get his knowledge of what ought to be, yet is not? IIis lack may be supplied through the instrumentality of some such organization as that whose formation we now chronicle, but the very existenco of that organization and his having to seek his knowledge through it, suggests the absence of previons training in the rights and duties of citizenship.
Something has gone wrong. Taxation is excessive, how did it beemoe so? Is it through redutions of revonue the rosult of exemptions uf real property from taxation? Is it owing to heary outlays for interest on lomas ineured for some axtravigunt parpose-or for a rightial purpose, may be, but where the cost un-: fortumatey has been swollen under some jobbing contract? Is it bechuse work budly dow has to be done agrin? Is it bechuse monopolies have to be encouraged $?$ These aro questions which create in the citizen's mind, wheller he can answer them or not, the belief that some ono lus erred, either because he was corrupted himself, or failed in his aldermanic duties through ignornuce or purtizan feeling.

If the questions be those affecting the State rather than tho Municipality they bring into play a wider range of thought and experience. They require thati the citizen should know why revchues lunve to be procured-how they ought to be applied-and undor whent con-
ditions they can best be obtained.
Will a business experience enable one to auswer all these enguiries? To some extent, possibly, but not in a brouclminded way.
Our ordinary eitizen has but a faint idea of the constitution of his countrywhat changes have been wrouglat in it by its very growth-how he camo to have al country at all. The fact is he laeked sehool training. Ho fulfilled all his obligations as a seholar on the ordinary lines but his curriculum covered no instruction in the arts of finance, nothing regarding the functions of the State, and the duitices which citizens owe to it; nothing as to the lawfulness of taxation, and the difference between it and the tribute of the slave; nothing as to the use and abuse of credit, and the immorndity of repudiating debts of the city or State, or rashly incurring any public delst whatever.
There aro ways of teaching these subjects which unfit the citizen for his duties, and make a narrow spirit dominate his career.
When in dealing with political and social seience in Yulo Colloge, a professor there taught his students that 'the greatest job of all is a protective tariff. It includes the biggest log-rolling and the widest corruption of economic and political ideas, he falled, in the very unworthiness of his Euglish, to tone the minds of his students, und he was guilty of imparting a narrow view to a subject which can never be disposed of in the schools, but must bo one of renewed debate in the logislatures of overy country.
With the view of drawing attention to tho need of traning in political and social science at our schools and colleges, wo wonld direct the attention of our businuss men, as well as the instructors in our educational establishments to an able article in a late number of the "Contemporary Review," by the Right ILon. Jumes Bryce, M. P., on "The Teaching of Civic Duty," wherein he deseribes the habits of civic duty which a sehoolmaster should seok to form in his pupils, ne consisting of three things-1. To strive to know what is best for one's country as a whole. 2. 'lo place one's country's intereat, whou one knows it, aboye party feeling or class feeling, or any other sectional feoling or motive. 3. To be willing to take tronble, personal aud even tedious trouble, for the well-govorning of every public community one bolongs to, bo it township or parish, a ward or $a$ eity, or the nation as a whole.
He gives two methods of forming these habits, 1. Tho giviug of knowledgo re-
garding the institutions of the countryknowledge sufficient to enable the young citizen to comprehend their workingand the inspiring of a love for the nation, an appreciation of all that makes its true grentness, a desire to join in serving it.
To apprehend the force of the headlines which we have affixed to these remarks, we quote further from Mr. Bryee's article, an incident occurring in one of the Swiss cantons, and in the course of his conversation with $\Omega$ peasanit landowner, and member of the popular primary assembly, which regulated the affains of the canton. In answer to a question whether it was not $a$ fact that all citizens had the right of attending and voting in this assembly, the landowner replied, "It is not so much their right as their duty." This is the spirit which should inspire us in the discharge of our citizenship, and if we possess that spirit in full degree, we shall not stop at the registration of our vote at the polls, but censelessly endeavour to raise the standards of political morality, whether oi local or other politics, and be ever on the alert for reforme.

PROVINCIAL TAXATION.
As many of our readers are aware the tax problem has been made a subject of investigation by a joint committec of the Board of Trade, Chambro de Commerce and the Citizens' Taxation Committec, and the views of this body have just been impressed upon the leaders of the Legislature at a meeting held in this city, It is siguificant that the Euglish and french members were a unit in the roforms recommended.
The committee presented a resolution aleclaring that the Provincial taxes of ' 02 , collected from the mercantile community, were onerous and excessive. They recommended that in their place a tax of one mill be collected on all tasable real estate in the Province, such retrenchment to be enforced as would render the revenue so obtained sufficient to meet the presenit extraordinary requirements of the Govermmont. The committee also suggested that all exemptions from taxation be abolished. The burden of the speeches was that the country must tako its share of the burden of taxation. "Sueh a tax," said one, " would probably be opposed by the country members, for moṣt of the money collected from the city was spent in their constitucucies. But the merchants of Montreal would ino longer stand their fair city being milked dry for the benofit of the rural districts."
L. E. Morin, president of the Chambre.
do Commerec, said the rural population had too long been necustomed to having their taxes paid by Montreal, and it was time there was a clange. The proposed land tax was not an onerous one, and if the Cubinet dared to appeal to the people on this mensure he felt sure it would have the unanimous support, irrespective of poItiics, race, or creed, of all classes.
A member of the Citizens' Committee remarked, amid applause, that Mọatreal. might seek political independence from the rest of the Province, if not rolievede
Other speakers insisted that tho farmers would not feel the proposed tax, while the present tax on commerce was a trx ou progress and a bar to enterprise. All should pay his proportion and then all would be interested in checking public extravagance. A tax on real property was shown to be more ensily collectable and more equitable than a tax on personal property. Tho deputation was not satisficd with the tax of one and a hals per cent. on real estate trauslers ; bute thicy wore in fnvor of haviug the exomptions from the tax on successions reduced, from estates under $\$ 10,000$ to those under $\$ 1,000$. They thought all suceessions over $\$ 1,000$ should be taxed. This, and a tax of a half por cent. upou real os: tate transfors, would give the Government the extra moucy they requirod. AB to the proposed real estate tas, the bulle of it yould still fall on the cities. The value of the renl estate of Moutral was $\$ 167,000,000$, that of quebec was $\$ 50$,000,000 . As the whole Province was only rated at $\$ 387,000,000$, wore than hall the tax would be paid by the citiees: Such a tax, too, would not drive large concerns out of the Province, as the present busincess tax was doing.. Some time was spent in diseussing the provistons of the $H_{u c k}$ chtt bill which has already been reviewod twice in theses columens. The meeting upyented to fully realize the diffieulty of organizing an equitable systeng of taxation at short notice to meet the legacy of bad dobts and burdonsomen oulipgations left us by a former administration.
It is probably known to all the business men present at the mooting that a gencral tax ou real estate throughout the Province, although admitediy the most equitable ono, is rendered impracticable by the indifference of a large proportion of the municipalities to theire duties in such a case. They will make no :returns; and they will not even pay the : $\$ 10$ to $\$ 12$ a year they owo for Building : and, Jury Fund for which many of them : are years behind. Thoso of our readers 'Who wish to study the subject thoroughly wwill find it all in a mutshell in the re-
port, page 20, "Journal of Commeree," O Jnmury, 1803 , und editorially on pago $97^{4}$ of the issue of the 20th of the same month. It is surprising that no one seems to have followed up the iden there suggested of a tax on sales of stocks. The masked bucket shops might then contribute their " Lake-off"-their chips from the "Kitty,"-and no ouc be much worse ofi than before. Such luxuries might then bear a share of the burthen. We commend this to Messrs, Baylis, Featherston, Stephenson, in view of the almost impossibility of reaching the greater number of the municipalitigs east of Three Rivers.

## YOUTHFUL DEFAULTERS.

Our attention has been directed sevoral times lately to the frequent cases of dofaleation among young men eutrusted with the handing of money in businoss offices. We have before us at present not less than six cases of the kind, the actors in all of them of respectable purentiage. The sums vary from $\$ 50$ to $\$ 1,000$, one of them, $\$ 900$ being the appropriations of the son of an insurance man and engaged in an office not a thousand yards distant. This fortuinutely, perhaps, for the young man's career,' las been condoned, the father making the amount good to the compaing. The temptations to which young men aro exposed in a large city like Montreal are so great as to call for continued circumspection on the part of parents and guardians. Young men of gregarions disposition-and they are the great majority-are keenly alive to inability on their part to keep pace with those of their companions who can or may spend money freely. There is no point on which boys and youthe and oven some of their elders are more sensitive than this of the purchase of luxuries for themselves and their companions. The schoolboy of 12 has already talsen his degree, and the young man of 18 or 20 is probably a past master. Many parents provide home amusements for their hoys, such as billiards, music, etc., to wean them from the street, but not every iamdly has a room large enourh for the former, and a sufficient taste for musie is not unversal. Happy the youth whose taste ipelines him to so ipexpepsive a hobly as music-
"-- that internal power"
Active and stropg and feclingly alive To cach fine impulso?"
-ior everyone should liave a holby. of some liciud, only must not allow the holby to ride him. Why, it may be asked, do wo not hear more on this subject from the pulpit? "Render unto. Caesar the things that aro Cacsar's," and so on. The foundation of a carcer of dishonesty is Jaid at a time when the minds of youth aro plastic, and it behooves parents and clergymen to warn, to direct, to make the impress of honesty, of honor while yet it is not too late.
"If good we plant not, vice will fill the place,
And rankest weeds the richest soil deface:"

One of the most painful cases recently made public, involving the " borrowing" of a very large anount of money, in sums great aud small as required, was the third misoppropriation in the man's curcer, but it is vory rarely that the transgressor escapes so easily.
To every foung man in a position of trust we raise the voice of warning ; it is the first step that costs,-- "C'est le premier pas ani conte," say the French: beware of the first step; do not touch a cent of your employer's money for your own use; do without the luxury; it is surely a poor thing compared with what you must barter for it,-your inherit-ance,-probaby;-your chancter, your honour.

" $A$ duly on heather!" sounds like a Constoms joles ; but the fact lies before us, ainl the fact is also present that goods-if-they may be so termed-of a similar character have been regularly charged duty in the past. The volume of business has continued moderate, the fine, open weather delaying trade in some lines. A lower temporalure wauld be welcomed by dry groods traders, ifuriers, fuel dealers, and the host of relailers generally. Farmers continue to prosccute out-door work and aro leaving their marketing until later. The production of butter and cheese has naturally kept up well, but the shrinkage is now begianing to be felt. Prices of staple goods have not undergone much change during the week, and the markets are steady on most importations. Higher freights will soon be a factor in the situation.
Ashes.-Receipts continue light. We quote pots 4.75 for firsta cone small bill selling for 4.80), sccońds 4.10. Pearls 6.25 for firsts. Received since 1st Janualy 1,280 pols, $9 \pm$ pearls; delivered since Ist January 1,355 pots, 133 perils; in storo 26 th $0 \mathrm{c}^{-}$ tober, at 3 p.m. 26 pota, 13 pearls.

- Bulter and Cheese.-The high price of butter is preventing business but it is likely more sales will soon develop. Offorings are chieliy lato made creamory, fine daily being scurce. Finest fall creamery is, held for 22 c to 23 c and perhaps a fraction more. Thero is a scarcity at western points which formerly supplied a good denl of butter. 'Somebody should mako money at present values, and haudlers here say it is the producer, as up to 23 es has boen paid in the country: In cheese, some Late made Ottawa Valley diatrictif in maid
to have been placed at $111-8 \mathrm{~s}$. Tho marrbet appears to be steady, despite reports to the contrary, and sales are being put through on private terms here and at country points. Finest Ontario fall is quoted at 11 3-8c to 1-2c, and Quebec at 11 1 -Sc to $1-4 \mathrm{c}$. Liverpool cable 55 s . At Iugersoll, oficrings were 2,320 September. For some lots D1e was bid, but market was dull. At Noodstock 13 iactories offered 8,300 Sept., and balance of season, but no sales were reported. The quick trip of the Campania gives us a late report of the London market. It says: The c. i. f. quotations cabled from Nuw York and Canada are respectively 56 and 54 s to $\overline{0} 4 \mathrm{~s} \mathbf{6 d}$, which are 2 s to 3 s ligher than a week ago. The market does not respond, and busincss has been but slowlý concluded at the former currency for the primest lot's at 50 s to 52 s , with perhaps a fine pareel at 53 s , inferior mukes at 44 s to 48 s , and more or less heated sorts at 38 s to 42 s .
Cement.-Dealers reporit the usual fall business. Portiand cement is selling at $\$ 2.10$ to $\$ 2.25$, according to brand, and Belgian at $\$ 1.90$ to $\$ 2$.
Chemicals and Drugs.-The market fior heavy chemicals is quiet but steady. Demand for drugs has been alightly on tho increase. Opium is easy in tonc. The statistical position, as reported from the East, is favorable as regards new crop, put tho quantity of old goods carried there and in the principal distributing: markets is large. The position of quinine has further improved, the entire stock of loroign makes offored in New York at 19c cash having been taken up, tho tramsaction aggregating 15,000 ounces.
Dry Goods.-The local mills continue to report steady work and are confining themselves to orders. Raw cotton and wool are ifirm in price and, in some instances, advances havo beon paid. Manufacturer's' prico lists are unchanged but tho tendency is upward. Wholesale morchants inforim us that the week's business has been on the quiet side, orders coming in slower than was expected. The extremoly fine weather, of late, has had its influenco on orders for heavier and warm'er material. Farmers appear to be too busy to do any selling, or buying, as they, are ploughing, and otherwise preparing, for the next crop year. Retail suburban business has been fair and city trado barely up to expectations. Buyers in Europe write of firmuess, in all classes of goods, and advances are likely to be establishod on some lines, later in the sesson. Liverpool cotton quiet; Americazi middings 41-2d. Groceries.-With the near approach of the close of natigation the wholesale
trade are now busy in getting all ordere pushed out, and, as usual at this scason, are more intent on selling than in buying. In coffees, the market is yet bare of Rios and Santos, and orders sent in by travellers have to be cancelled. Some Maracaibo has come to hand since our last issue, and a few sales have been made at a slight advance. A small lotion Mocha, direct shipmnet from Aden, has also come to hand. In teas we have nothing to report, except that Ceylons and Indians show a hardening tendency. No purchases, at least to any extent, have been made during the past week, but prices nevertheless are steady. Japan teas unelanged in price and quiet.. In canned goods there is nothing doing, buyers being supplied for the moment. We seo that the U. S. is short of corn, the pack this year, owing to drought, being much short of last year. The situntion as regards raisins is as was stated in our last. Prices in Denia have advanced and are now about 1s over lowest offers of last season. New York and London markete have stiffened, but here wo don't 'lhow any hurry in following the markets, "and fruits can be had in Montreal under. What it would cost to lay it down... Curt rants are still low, and likely to remain so. Rice is a little stifier 1 n Now York but no advance has beon mado here, so far. Tapioca and Sago havo eased off $n$ little on the London market, sny about 3d per ewt. Spices are still loy. Peppers aro rather lower in London and so are cloves, a drop of $1-4 d$ having been made.
