-Whe 'lraders' Bank of Canada sleared 0.13 per cent. profits on the paid up capital last year. Annual meeting 20th Junc.
-'The Merchants' Bank of Canada announces net profits of pasti year as $\$ 417,819$, which is a trifle under 7 per cent. on paid up capital.
-Mir. A. B. Van Felsen, manager of the upper town branch of the Quebec Bank, at Quebec, has been appointed manager of the Quobec Branch of the People's Bank of Halifax.
-The Imperial Bank of Canada announces its profits for the past year as $\$ 302,6 \% 6$, which is over 15 per cent. on the paid up capital. Out of this $\$ 100,000$ has been transferred to reserve fimd. The meeting takes phace on 21st inst.
-'The assignee has possession of the grocery stock of 1 . J. Barbour, St. Mary's, Ont., He was formerly of Barbour \& Baird, who dissolved some years ago. He re-opened on his own acconnt with little eapital, after a trip to the North--West. Tiiabilities light.
$-\Lambda$ a recent trial in England it came out that in law, a "factory" practically included every place or building in or on which any machinery actuated by steam, water, electrieity, or other mechanical power was used.

The Finance Minister has laid supplementary estimates before the House mounting to $\$ 2,647,628$. Of this $\$ 1,993$,545 is-for dailways to be charged to capital account, and $\$ 453,919$ for sundries on account of Consolidated Fund. The sum of $\$ 60,000$ extra is asked for the ship channel of the St. Lawrence, and $\$ 21,500$ for the buoy service of that river.

Four mining companies have been incorporated within the week, with an aggregate capital of $\$ 3,700,000$.
-The Western Assurançe Company, fire and marine, points to a record dating from 1 sä1, during whish period its obligations have always been promptly and likerally mot. Though a Canadian company, the Western is a great favourite in the United States, having stood so staunch in stormy days when aative companies wore wrecked by the score. Last year its income was $\$ 2,290,000$. The Vice-President and Mapaging Director, Mrr. J. J. Kenny, stands in the frout rank of underwriters.
-The first crop bulletin for 1899 has been issued by the ManitobaManitoba Govermment. The acreage is given as follows:

most impossible for any but half-witted eandidates to fail in passing the examinations. An administation which sanctions such an armagement has lost all sense of honour and self-respect.
'There exists a strong movenent in Germany against the department stores, according to a report from ConsulGeneral Mason, and varions measures have been before the Wieichstag aimed at their suppression. Most of these take the form of a progressive tax, such as has been enacted in Missouri, but po legistation has as yot been applied. In Hrance a retailers' league of 40,000 members has been formed to oppose department stores, one of which is instanced as hiving extinguished 000 smatl shops and as now doing a business of $\$ 30,000,000$ a year, or enough "to maintain from 1,800 to 2,000 small stores," The idea here, says the "Springfield Republican," seems to be that stores exist to give business and profit to as mony proprictors as possible, fud not primarily as an agent in distribution for the benefit of the general public.

The far-reaching consequences of strikes, even though sometimes of but small proportions, are seldom brought immediately to the notice of those particularly interested and on whom any stoppage of the wheels of progress weighs the heaviest. A recent sitike among the employees of the Laidlaw-Watson Shoe Company of London, Ont, a eoneern employing some 70 hands, while settled without much loss of time, caused the firm to consider a change of location as desirable against further troubles arising from a similar cause. It is said the firm have received offers fiom the town of Aytmer, which have been accepted. They expeet to move about July 1st. . The eitizens of London regret the
proposed loss and may propose some arrangements which will keep the shoe firm in their present location. The striking employee, even though his cause be just and he has won what le contended for, has lost for all time the grood opinion originally entertained of him by his employers. This he camot lave entirely yestored.
-The temptation to deal in bankrupt stocks is occasionally found to lend to greater risks than the shrewd merchant cares to run. 'the old idea, by some entertained, of believing that buying wholesale and selling at retail constituted all that was necessary to know in the mercantile line, led many followers to flnancial iuin. In a like manner the idea of believing that in purchasing a stock of merchandise at 50 to rocents in the dollar of the wholesale price constitutes a real gain of 30 to 50 per cent., has causea many otherwise experienced merchants to seak the indulgence of creditors whom they had avoided in the chase after a supposed shap. Were sufficient thought given to the fact that the porisession of all the goods in a town would not make one merchant any better oft until he had found a market for them, there would be less failures and extensions as a result of bankrupt stocks. There are two acquirements neecssary belore a clealer should bid on such goods. The cash to spate from his business, and the surety of cusfom whereby they may be hurriedly turned over. We hear of the assigmment of Wm. Dunlop, of Kingston, Ont. He began some years ago, seeming to possess fair ability, but latterly payments have not been met as readily as required. Last January , lured by a bankrupt stock of tailor goods, of the estate of A. F. Roney, amounting to $\$ 0,700$, he obtained a loan from a friend and secured the stock at 55 cents in the dollar, cash. This was a large stock to acquire in goods which are generally of a doubtful value when forced on the

market, and which in the regutar way are apt to linger long and depreciate in price betore being sold, owing to new styles, etc., constantiy coming forward. When a merchant gets overstocked the wholesale house from whom he purchased will give him all the protection he deserves, but when this arises from a "bankiupt" purchase he is apt to find himself devoid of the sympathy generally extended.
-Hill Brothers, hardware dealers, St. Johns, N.F., are again financially embarrassed and have made an assignment. Liabilities, $\$ 6,500$, preferred $\$ 2,800$. Assets, $\$ 5,000$. The firm is composed of two brothers, who have been in business since ' 93 . In '97 they encountered more obligations than they could satisfactorily protect in full, some $\$ 3,300$, and obtained a settlement at 45 cents in the dollar: 15 cents in April, '08; 15 cents in December, '98; and 15 cents in August, ' 90 . This long term did not, apparently, entirely reliere.

## GROCERY NOTES.

While concerted action has not yet been taken regurding the earlier closing of grocery stores it is pleasing to note that in many cities and towns agreements have been reached whereby there may be some slight relief for the grocery assistant from the "all work and no play" feature of his hours of duty. A Brantford, Ont., dispatch states that the grocers and buichers of that city have agreed upon a Wednesday half-holiday during June, July and August. The annual excursion of the Hamilton, Ont., Retail Grocers' Association will take place on July 19 to Niagara Falls and Buffalo.

Fortunately for Canada its inhabitants are not being brought into daily contact with the numerous food adulterations, which, for the past decade or more, have been forming no small portion of the stocks of many U.S. retail grocers. Conditions have favoured this means of acquiring greater profits by unscrupulous manufactures, the records showing how well these conditions have been taken to apcount. To obtain pure coffee was some time ago thought difficult owing to the free use of chicory, consumers gradually preferring the coffce in the berry, to be ground as required. But after a time the redeeming qualities of chicory became more generally recognized, many lovers of coffee buying a proportion of about one-fifth for blending, to add flavour and clarify the liquid. chicory is adulterated. There is a commoditiy known as "substitute," or "commercial chicory," which is made of baked carrots, turnips, or any other cheap vegetable. Being coarsely ground, this resembles coftee or chicory except being of a duller shade. lt has no taste, but blended with chicory it plays its part only too well, for it is heavier than either chicory or coffee, It sells, wholesale, at from 3 to 4 cents per pound. It never sells at retail; at least, it is never supposed to. But, like many other abuses, food adulteration has spread in the United States, till it has reached the precipice, from where it is likely soon to find its grave. The Pure Food Commissioner is on the trail and if the disclosures are kept up and the new laws enforeed the public will soon be enabled to breathe more freely and possibly for a longer time. A Chicago dispatel of the sth inst. says:-Senator Mason of the Pure Commission, who leaves for Washington to-day, made the following positive state-ment:-"I wish to say, first, that this commission will prepare a bill compelling manufacturers of food products to mark their goods for what they are; for instance, chicory must not be labelled coffee, bui chicory. Second, we will have in the bill a provision that will absolutely prohibit the introduction of deleterious substances in food products, that which is deleterious to be left to the evidence submitted by impartial scientific men. Third, I propose to offer an amendment to the revenue bill which will absolutely prohibit the importation of food arricles the sale of which is prohibited in the country from which they are exporten."

## OPFICLAL CTANGES IN O.P.R.

Sir William Yan Horne has retired from the presidency of the Canadian Pacilic Railuay Company. In future he will be Chairman of the Board of Directors. Sir William explains this change to have been necessitated by the need of enlarging the executive of the Company, as the growth of its operations involves work beyond the capacity of any two men. If Sir William finds his dutjes too heavy under the present organization, no other man could be found equal to the burthen, for, since he iook hold of the C.P.R., eighteen yearsago, his capacity for work has been a continual marvel to his colleagues and the staft generally. He declared at the recent meeting that in his forty years of railway work he has had only two short holidays. Sir William, however, has found in his artistic tastes a source of recreation. Having brought the railway into a more prosperous position than it ever before occupied, he considers the present a favourable time for handing over the reins to a younger man, who will enjoy the benefit of Sir William's co-operation and counsel as Chairman of the Board. The new President is Mr. I. G. Shaughnessy, who for some time has been Tice-President, in which position he has evidenced the same indomitable energy, mastery of detail, foresight, enterprise and sagacity, which distinguished his chief, to whom indeed he was right hand man. Mr. Shanghnessy is one of the most popular men in railway scrvice as well as one of the most able. The amouncement of his elevation to the presidency of the Canadian Pacific has been received by business men throughout the country with much gratification. It is expected that


Mr. R. B. Angus will be elected Tiec-President. Mr. D. McNTicoll has been appointed Assistant General Manager, a promotion which meets with general approval. The contre of intorest, however, is the ex-president, the reord of whose work in establishing the Candimn Pacific, and developing what some eminent men said was "a wild scheme" into a prosperous railway across this continent, will ever be a brilliant chapter in Canadian history.

## THE TRADE IN "CHIPS."

This is not an article on a lumber subject. Nor has it any reference to the ivory trade, though the articles jimed in the title are sometimes made of that material. There is a form of symbolic currency in use by those who play one of the various kinds of game which has the elegant name of "Poker." This currency is titled "chips" that have a conventional value, familiau enough to gamesters, but of which our studies of currency problems, havo, so far, left us in complete ignorance, with no ambition to be enlightened.

We, howered, take the title "Clips" as being highly appropriate as a designation of a certain class of mining stocks. 'They have no actual vilue, present or prospective, but are mere instruments for conducting gambling iransactions, just as are Poker Chips. Jhese stocks have as much to do with mining business as the cardgame of Pokei has to do with the implement for stirring a ine. They, howerer, have, at times, a redhot end which, burns the fingers of whover handles them. 'The strange thing is, that when one holder drops them after being lount, others are rendy to risk scorching or senring, which goes past the fingers until the contents of the pooket are destroyed, Even further still the damage extends, as character and position become, as fire insurance men say, "a total loss-no insurance," or any form of compensation for the injury done. A victim of "Chips"-has, quite recently, fled to parts mannown. Others have their fingers in their months endenvouring to mollify the burn. Others have their hands in their pockets groping in vacancy, while they lament the departure of funds, "that are no more," like the "lays" Tennyson wept over with tiears which he called "idle" as he did not know "what they mean." The "Chips" viction does know what his tears mean, as they indicate unavailing grief over what he lost by gamising of the rankest character.

Were the operators in "Chips" to put their own money at risk they would only be open to a charge of folly. But a large number of these who operate; use money which is not their. own. It is often their creditors' who are de-

prived of its use by some unscrupulous debtor who, instead of paying his debts, puts the money for them at risk in stock speculations: Any man who does this, or who uses money which he holds in trust, as many are now doing, has cut loose from the restraints of honourable principles, he is adrilit on waters which are so dangerous that no marine underwriter would take a risk thereon. The current indeed has a strong set towards worse shoals than the bed of the Gallia, and worse rocks than now impale the Paris. If some Asmodeus of Tenfelsdrock could suddenly unveil the sources from whence margins are drawn for trading in "Chips," there would be such a revelation as would convulse the business world.

BUILDING OPERATIONS IN MONTIREAL.
This is promising to be a remarkably prosperous year for the building trade in this city. Work has commenced on the site upon which the new offices of the Graud Trumk Railway are to be erected. How extensive the buildings will be may be judged by 200 carts being being required to clear the ground for foundation work. Ted granite will be used for the lower part, the height of which will be nine feet. On this, courses of grey grauite will be placed up to the lop of the first floor, after which Nova Scotia blue stone will be used. The building will cost $\$ 000,000$. The Canadian Pacific has commenced operations on the extension of its Windsor st. station, which will give work to a large mumber of men. On lachel street a large new elhutech has just been commenced construction, to replace the one destroyed by fire over a year ago. The preparatory work for the additions to to le made to the head office of the Merchants Bank of Canada, St. James street, have commenced, they will probably take a year to complete. At the head of St. Framille street, and on St. Catherine street, between Main and Bleury, there will be dwellings and stores erected of a substantial character. $\Lambda$ t the corner of St. James street and St. Lambert's Hill, very extensive work is in progress preparatory to a large structure being built; part of which will be occupied by La Presse newspaper. The proprictor of the Star is clearing away the building oceupied by its offices on St. James street, and the adjoining one, on the sites of which a large structure will be built capacious enough to accommodate its printing establishment. and oflices. The restoration of the McTntyre block on Tictoria Square and Craig strect, will loe an important work, and a very weleome one to the citizens at large, who will rejoice to sec the eminent firms, who were so ruthlessly driven out by fire, re-estailished in a building befitting their prominence and high rawk in the mercantile world.

A mongst the mininoi works miny tye nidined thie remodelling of the thlentro francais, which tye are asstred will ise fuised to the high standerd of nodeteri titeatres. The mame of this house needs a change; as it is devoted to the presentation of Jnglish comedies, which have proved very popular. Montreal still needs a Nusic Hall worthy of so large, so musical, and so wealtly a city, commodious chough to accommodate very much larger andiences than amy auditorium we possess, except the skating rinks, which are utterly unfit for concerts of any kind. The restrieted size of the rooms now available compel such high piritecs to be clingred as exelude the thousunds who troild be ghad to attentid coincerts of the highest cliass Fiere lovier pitices fixedi: It js nö̀t creditibibee to itoiit-
 rointo, Biuffalo; and other cities. . There is iot a robim in this city provided with a good organ; or with pitoper accommolation for a jurge oichestia and bloritis; yet there are ample evidences of the mass of the people, who camnot allioril to pay the current prices for concerts, being desirous of learing musicil performances.
Work has commenced on the harbour improvements, but how far they will be pushed, is uncertain. Never before, in this city, was building work so far behind as it is now, owing to the late opening of the season.
Other bivilding operations are projected, but those nibure mentioned; which lure beent conmeneed, or for which contracts have been called; or lett; are sufficient to show that this city has entered tuon an era ot strue. hural development which indicites the prevalence of prosperity, the existenee here of large resources, and of unlbounded confiilence being folt in the future progiess of: this, the national port and the commercial metropolis of. Canaili.

## moneral waters.

Minomal waters have been iraik and bathed in since remote autiquity. There is a city in Germany, oue in Austrin, onc in Switzerland, and one in Fagland, ench of which takes its mane from the use made of its mineril waters for bathing as a curative process. The use of these waters for drinking doubtless originated in the belief, which obtains to this day, that any water which has atepulsive taste must be medicinal. In this respect Marrogate water takes the palm, or the "cake" in modern phatascology. Th tastes like coal gas in a liquid form, or a decoction of roften eggs. An old Harrogate doctor onee siiill to us, "Ifif peopile would drink more good water and bathe in it daily, they would not need to drink the horrible stuff that connes from our springs." The German mineral waters are less vile in odour and taste. Some of the serenty springs at Baden pour out water which is rather agreecible, being little more than ordinary water impregnated with carbonic acid gas, like the soda waters made ly machinery. Schweppe led the way in developing the trade in minueral waters, but his supremacy las gone. The most popular water of the effervescent class is Apoilimuris, which rose into fance suddenly some years ngo from being associated willi a royal personage. This water, is made in Fature's mysterions laboratory, is held to have medicimal virtues, but it is too pleasant to have any lame of that kime. It the coneocters of Apollinaris were to give it a havour of assafootida it would command ath enornous sale as a medicinc. The stipply of this famous hecerage from the original spring, amonnts to only in small percentage of what is consmmed. We must confess that the product of Aet is too close an imitation of that of Trature to he detected, sure by chemieal analysis. To mect the enormons demmind of this continent, A poll-
inatis; or; as it is familidrly called, "Podiyy;" is mide in Nety Yofl: Ás a dilutent of whiskiky it is lield to liave' it sptecial tharm: Indded; if we atcepit the thieory' of some; that the dfes to whicli riaturail prodictions'are uniuiver: sally put slow wifiat Dinme Nature liad in view in making them, it is indisputable thiat Naturic made Ayollidaris to mix with whisky. This puts our prohibibitidrist friends in the position of attempting to thwart Nature. It is ssid, that "Polly" is used to dilute chanmagne, which reminds us of Handy-Andy's exploit of pouring the wine into an ice bucket. This sounds incredible, as any drinkable champague needs no help in its exuberance of faz; and its characteristic bougutet-which is the glory of thairipagie-is dissipated when drowned out by any watei; hioweyeei ffrisky or palatable per se. There arc
 are imitatedं; juist as copies of old masters ate re-copied, and as visistoris to Englanid who come back here with English ways they liave copied from British noodels, arte inititated by those who hiavic inever crossed the great heriniug pond. Apollinaris bottles are re-filied with aji inferior yater, and even the labels of celebrated vendors arie copied, just as are those of Lee \& Perrins, and of Scotch and Canadian whisky firms. Drinkerts to-day swalk, or rather drink, by faith, but it is faill based on sight, they mote the label on a bottle and are satisfied. Though the allusion is to Appolinaris we do not propose to "split." Some Canadians lold that this country produces a natural iniiteral water stryerior to Apollinaris. We:do not dispute their taste, as we cannot disparage patriotism. Probably both the rivals are made in the same factory. Certainly the only difference in some we have sampled was in the labols. The habit of drinking my form of mincral waters frequently is not advisable, not because of their mineral qualities so much as that the imbibing liquids, however pure, in excess of Nature's requirements, is injurrious to health. It is very significant that in England the habit of drinking mineral waters has spruug up in the last half century, having been created and developed by the temperance movement, yot, in the same prrioc, the consumption of beer and spirits per head has increased. Whether the increase in the consumption of "soft" drinks has developed an increased consumption of stronger ones, is, of course, unknown. But there is the faet, that as the demund for mineral waters grew, so also daveloped a larger consumption per head of the old-fashioned bercrages.

## THE COLLAPSE OF BIG CONBINES.

A number of the recently orgamized trusts, or combines, in the United States are in difficulties. Amongst these are the great biscuit manufacturing company lormed to control the trade in these goods. Another is, the national woollen company; which it was hoped by the promoters would bring the trade in wool into the hamds of one trust. The floating of so many vast enprises has proved too much for the resonrees of the States. Vast as have been the accumulations of capital in Amerien, and large as are the profits being made by manufacturing enterprises, there is not enongh money seeking investment to furnish the cipital called for by He new trusts. Besides this inadequacy there has come over the people a suspicion that these concerns do not ofier such a solid security to investors, as their promoters repecsent. One feature in the new trusts scemis to us to have been wholly overionked. They are formed not to establish new industries, or enterprises, but merely to combine those already existing, as one corporation. The objects aree avoyed to be, to efficet economies in produc.
tion, in managenents in distribution, in financind dild of establish prices beyond the reach of binipetitiont Now these results each and ath inatiiratly, tend to reloase cajiztal, they certainly to yot call for more of it to lise cmpoyed. The firms which hand otei their business to a trust if they have eonfidence in the new organizations, will leave their capital in the enterprise to onru divitends. IT the unterprise achieves its ingect, thie dividends on the amalgamated capital sutite be larger than the individual grofits whicel were realized by the several firms which have combined. If then these firms withdraw their capital it will prove their lack of confidence in the trutsi; so that the more capital is asked from the puiblic the nore proof this wi llafford that the firms whose business is alb: sorbed are doubthul of the trust's sutceess. The tery ealling on the public foi capital is indeed conelustive proof that the trusts are distrusted by those who kilow most about them. Of course a large anount of thie money asked for is boot to replace actual capital withdrawn, but is sought to be raised for bonuses to the firms being atmalgamated. So we get this situation, a number of firms are not receiving a satisfactory return on their capital, or fear the priesent return will not be maintained hence ate willing to be absorbed and paid of by a trust. Set they require to be paid a bonus to retirc, or, should they let their capital remain in the trust, the neve capital sulbscribed loy the public will be used to ereate watered slock, on which the dividends will bo smill for: themy but large to the original proprictors, whose actual capitnituill have been inflated by distributions of watered stock, that js, shares on which they have paid nothing. The whole frust scheme is financially rotten, The more the publie stand aloof from investing in these enterprises, the less disturbing will be their ultimate collapse.

## HALTFAX ON THE PROPOSED NFTV SERVICE FOR WEST INDIDS.

The reported establishment of a steamship service between this port and the West Indies has roused considerable feeling in Falifax which is headquarters of the existing service. Whether wholly justificed or not we do not say, but there has been an impression for a length of time that the Walifax service to and from the West Indies was not satisfactory. It has been complained of as being too iuregular, too slow, too uncertain for the requirements of shippers and travellers at both ents of the line. The effect of these conditions, it is alleged, has been to divert 4raffic between Canada and the West Indies towards New Tork. We have had commmications stating that the New York vessels are more to be relied upon in their sailings, and that they make the trip both ways, moro swittly. The complaints emanate chiefly from shippers in and west of this port, who are very emphatic in their olsjections to the Halifax boats and service generally. Where there is so much smoke there mast be fire, and Halifas must not imagine that the smoke arises from the heat of my jealousy of Thalifax existing in arontreal. Jealousy is natural enongh between rivals, but capitalists will not put down money to establish a new stamship line unless there is business in sight, or promising to arise which will make the venture prolitable. We jutage that New Tork has more renson to fear the rivalry of this city, in this respect than Halifax has, for the freight and passenger business which vessels from this city would secure would be diverted from the American rather than the Nova Scotion port. The Walifax serviec is performed by two stemmers, the Beta and the Erna: The former is a 12 -knots boat with excellent, accommodation for passengers and freight, being fittel with the latest improve-
ments. The Trmas is newer boat steainiug 10 knots: She also lins supdeliot accoumiodation: Tlic Beta calls
 trij occlpying y i-2 days. The Enial goes direct to Jamaich so does the toyage in 6 1-2 days. Both boats viait West Indian ports to secure home-bound cargoes, rates competing with American vossels. A large quantity of freight is brought from the West Indies to Malifax for transhipment to England by the Furness line. The firm conducting the Halibax service cham that every posible effort is being made to meet the tastes of passengers and neds of shippers, and that the enterprise is ste= cending:

##  MBAL:

An Ameitican syndicate has offered to purchase all the milk supply rontes in Thoronto on the basis of $\$ 1,000$ per cight-gallon can delivered each day. The milk dealers in Toronto mumber from four to five hundred. The seleme is similar to the one carried out in New York, where a syndicate secured a monopoly of the milk suphly dasoon as the deal was complete the price of all the milk soid in that city was raised one cent a quiart; by which adranee the pruchase moner was soon mased, and the additioind pitice gave the syndicate enomous profits. Al. lonring for Toronto talking only 50,000 quarts per day, ail advance of one cent pre quart would yield $\$ 152,500$ for the year. As the syndicate proposes to buy out the dealers at a cost of $\$ 1,000,000$, they would secure 18 per cent. per annum on this ontlay, by simply adding one cent per phart to the price of milk in Toronto. This would bo denr net profit. over and above the profit now mate by the present dealers. The syndicate would be able to distribute milk at a much less cost. than the dealers, whose routes are not organized, half a dozen milk waggons being often seen in one short strect. The syndicate would probably require less than half the men, borses, and carts now required, so the cost of distribution would be largely reduced. A very moderate estimate sives the syndicate a net profit of, ali; least, 2.1.-2 cents per fuart, which would yield from 25 to 30 per cent. net profit on the capital engaged, as the price would certainly be raised in Toronto, as it was in New York, by a monopoly of the milk supply being secured. It is rumoured that the syndicate is feeling its way for a similar operation in this city. The plan at New York embraces an agreement with all the farmers within a radius of 20 miles, who sign an undertaking not to furnish any milk to others than the syndieate agents. The prospect of a monoploy of the milk supply of Camdian cities being in the hands of an. American syndicate is not an agrecable one for Cunadians to contemplate.

## PATCEL POST CHANGES

Tti'gives us quite a shoek fo be asked by the Camalim Gazette, " How is it that Canada, with an excellent record in olher' postal depariments, still lags behind in the matier of parcel post?" . The idea of Canala lagging behind in anything is incongroons, as we are malerstoon to lead the van. What are the facts? When the Postal Conference was held in London for the consideration of Imperial Penny Postage, We liritish Postmaster-Gencral formulated a new and uniform seale of charges for parcels by parcels post between Hac various parts of the Einpire-viz.: Under :S Hos.;'1s; wider 7 lbs., 'Os.; under' 11 lhs., 3s. Canada has not yet adnpted the new scale, which has, however, been put into operation tion in many parts of the Empire-the Fialkland Islands, the Straits Setilements, Ceylon, Newfound and, and the

Niger thervitory among others. The result is that while a parcel weighing 3 lb . can be sent from England to the Falkland Islands, a distance of 8,130 miles, or Newfoundland, 2,500 miles, for 1 s , a similar parcel to Canada costs 1 s . Pd. The lostmaster-General should give attention to this, us the diserimination against Canata is too great.

White alluding to the above guery put by our English contemporary we take the opportunity of calling the attention of the Government to another question being very generally asked in Creat Britain. The Gazette says:-"Canula's perfectly sincere and well-meant eflorts to promote increased trade for this comatry are in no small measure wusted labour while the jegitimate legal protection to which the Brilish merchant is entitled is withheld from him. Ilow is it, then, that another session is being allowed to pass without some eflort to make good admitted defects?"

PHE APPTE BAKRETS ACT.
Aceording to the proposed Act relating to expots of upples, they must be "packed in eylindrical veneer barrels," or those made of seasonet wood. The mame of the first class of burrels excited the risibility and emriosity of the House of Commons. Sir H. Joly de Lotbiniere when questioned wats umble to explain what kind of a barrel was meant by the Aet he introdnced. The special form which differentiates a barrel from a box is, the former being eylindrical. A cylinder is explained by one writer as "it barrel," thus we speak of the barrel of a gun. The word cylindrical, as applied to a certain class of burres, is therefore as superfluous as it would be to say, that a certain class of square must have four square sides, or, thint a 'spherical body must be round. What is mennt by "a veneer barel?" We give it up. All authorities and trade custom ngree in defining "veneer" as a very thin layer of wood laid on a backing for decorative purposes in cabinet work, Will shippers of apples be required to use barrels covered with ornamental woods like piano cases and writing desks are? If so, the wood should have been mamed to avoid disputes, the Act then would have read, "All apples Sor export must be packed in barrels yeneered with mathogany, rosewool, or bird's-eye maple." Whether the veneer must be polished or noti should also have been stated in the Aet. These handsome barrols would cause a sensation in Great Britain, and, as they would, of course, not be charged for, they would ercate an enormons demand for Ganadian apples in order to secure a mahogany, rosewood or bird's-eye maple "cylindrical vencer barrel." All that is required is, that the apples exported be packed in strong barrels of a given and uniform capacity.

## 'line pacitic cablie.

The British Govermment has receded from the unrensonuble position it took up respecting the Pacific cable. Ass we poirted out some time ago, there was a distinct understanding between the Home authorities and the respective govermments of Canada and Australia that Great Britain wonld assume a cettain proportion of the cost. That proportion we spoke of as wholly disproportionate to the far greater advantages which Great Britain would derive from the Pacifie Cnble in comparison with the benefits to this country and Ausiralia. It was then announed that Great Bribain had withotawn from this arangement leaving the entire cost of the cable to be borne by this country and Australia. 'Ihe reason for this policy seems to have been the discovery that Great Britain was pledged to the sup)port of an castern cable with the interests of which the new one would conflict. Under pressure brought to bear npon it, the Home Govermment now offers to guananten the bonds issued to raise the funds for laying the cable. It can do this without any risk of being called upon to pay cither the interest on the bonts, or any of the prineipal when due. The goveruments of Canada and of Anstralia ure well able to pay any obligations existing, or to be entered into foe the new enterprise. The gramantee of the Home Goverument may enable a lom to be placed upon slightly more favourable ferms, but the oredit of Capadit
, snd of Australia, is now so:high that even an Imperinal guarantee will lave little effect in: Becuring better terms. As the Hone Government will make no sacrifice, present or contingent, nor invest one cent of money in'coninection with the Pacific cable, it will have no clain to use the line, as was proposed, on lower terms than other customers. We trust both the colonial governments will stand on their dignity in this matter, and give the authorities of the Colonial Office clearly to understand that if they build the Pacific cable at their own cost they will manage it in their own way and endeayour to -malse it a strictly ,business enterprise.

## TME GALLIA VIBRDICI.

The Harbour Commissioners have rendered a unamimous verdict in regard to the grounding of the Gallia. The judgment sets forth, that the channel at the point where the vessel went ashore is 600 feet wide, and 35 feet deep, and Unat all the buoys, bencons and landmarks were clearly visible. The pilot is blamed for running the ship at full speed around the bend in the river, when he knew the steering gear to be imperfect. The captain is also blamed for not cautioning the pilot against too great speed. TThe ship clannel, whinl some interested persons tried to show was responsible for the aceident, was proved to be as wholly blaneless as the English Channel is for the stranding of the leris. The Gallia remains fast ashore, but hopes are entertained that she will be floated are long. Meantime she is a.beacon of warning, which, though not needed, is still impressive.

## PIANO AND ORGAN MAKERS' ASSOCLAIION.

The principal manufncturers of pinnos and organs in Ontario have formed an association for promoting the interests of their trade. One of the grievances they will seek to have remedied is, the method of showing musical instruments at the Provincial and other exhibitions. One of the leading firms declined to send any more of their pianos to 1his show some years ago, owing to the bad arrangements. The managers of these exhibitions seem to have no other itlea about a piano, or organ, than, thạt it is a piece of furniture, like a table or bureau. Hence they crowd them together in one section where the visitors can studiously compare the polish used by the several makers, and pass very critical and lighly intelligent remarks upon the merits of the pianos on show, based upon the different patterns of their legs, or fret work. Should some prejudiced person, who is pernickity enough to wish to hear the tones of a piano before judging its merits, he, or she, has to play it or listen to its being played, amid a babel of sounds which reminds us of Hogarth's "Entaged Musician." To judge the tones of any one piano or organ, when the air is vibrating with the noise of cows bellowing, bands performing, chiddren yelling, thousands of people stamping round, and other pianos and organs are being played double fortissimo in order to get heard at all, is a farce. Yet our instrument makers have to display their goods under such conditions and there are people who seem to find ecstatic delight in having their ears bombarded with such confused noises, if only one ingredient in the din is, a piano being pounded by a musical athlete. To secure more rational arrangements at Exhibitions will be one aim of the new association.
Another effort will be directed towards securing changes in the tariff on the raw materials used in pianos and organs. The present duty on such materinls gives an unfair advanresponding duties to pay on the raw materials used in Ancrican made instruments, consequently they can produce a responding duties to pay on the raw materialis used on Ampiano at a less cost than a Canadian maker, by the amount of duty on raw materials they are saved. The Americans, besides this great advantage, use. Canada as a surplus, or slaughtior market, to the serious disturbance of the trade, Were the conditions equal, Oanada would do a Jarge trade in pianos and organs with the States. But our goods are practically prohibited from entering that country, whila
our tariff favours the importation of American goods.. Such a fiscal condition is utterly irrational, it is neither Protections nor Free ? 'rade, nor Reciprocity; or Jariff for Revenue only, but a muddle based on no definite principle, and having no definite object. The new asociation, we trust; will.succeed in getting the tariff put into a more intelligible shape as a protection to a most important native industry, which spraug.up and has flourished under the favouring influences of a policy designed to effeet, such results.

There was a sharp decline in Pacific, owing to the retirencat of Sir. Willian Van Home from the presidency. The ehanges in that line seem to have enuseal no lithe uncasi, ess in Berlin, where the real nnture of them is not understood. The quotations went down to $95 \%$, which would ralher trouble those who were speculating on par being reached.
