AT a Session of the Special Council, begun and holden at the Government House, in the City of *Montreal*, in pursuance of an Act passed in the Parliament of the United Kingdom of *Great Britain and Ireland*, intituled, "*An Act to make temporary provision for the Government of Lower Canada.*"

THURSDAY, 14TH FEBRUARY, 1839.

Alexander Maurice Delisle, Esquire, Commissioner appointed by *Dedimus Potestatem*, for administering the Oath to the Members of the Council, was introduced in the Council Chamber, when the Oath prescribed by the Act 1st *Victoria*, Cap. IX. was administered to the following Members, who, after having subscribed the Roll containing the Oath, took their seats at the Council Table, viz. :—

HUMBLY REPRESENTS,

That your Memorialists having just ascertained, that an Ordinance is at present before the Special Council, contemplating very serious reductions in every branch of their department, beg leave most respectfully to submit to Your Excellency's consideration the following reasons against the adoption of such a measure: Because the situation of Inspector of Ashes being one of the highest trust and responsibility, it is essential that the emoluments connected therewith should be of so respectable a nature as to insure the office being filled by persons of character, above all suspicion of fraud or connivance: Because the present tariff of fees was established, and has been confirmed by the most influential merchants of this City as a fair and reasonable remuneration for the services of the Inspectors, and that, too, at a period when the costs of labour, storeroom, and, your Memorialists may be permitted to add, all the necessaries of life were infinitely lower than at present, and when the quantity of ashes coming into market, and consequently the emolument arising therefrom, was nearly double: Because, though at every renewal of the Inspection Act, the decreasing of fees has been discussed, the only reduction hitherto found available has been that of a few pence in the article of cooperage, which was then considered as reduced to the lowest rate at which that branch of the department could be effectively carried on: Because the rate of storage on Ashes is proportionably much lower than that charged by merchants on any other article of produce, and the indulgence of ten days, during which period the holders of bills may have their properties stored or removed without any expense whatever, is, we believe, wholly unprecedented in any other establishment: Because the Inspection business has been for some time past, and still continues, falling off, while your Memorialists are compelled to remain under the same heavy liabilities for store rent, stock, &c.: Because your Memorialists, the youngest of whom has been fifteen years in the Inspection Office, are prohibited from engaging in, and indeed are unfitted for any other species of business, and are wholly dependant on the income arising from their office for the support of themselves and families: Your Memorialists, therefore, respectfully pray, that, instead of the proposed reduction, the present sys-

tem, both as respects the mode of Inspection and the emoluments arising therefrom, may be continued in force.
