An ACT for the further Amendment of the Act for the Incorporation of the General Water Company.

[Passed 25th June 1861.]

WHEREAS, by an Act passed in the Twenty-second Year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, entitled "An Act to Incorporate the General Water Company," it was, amongst other matters, enacted, that the Capital Stock of the said Company should consist of Thirty Thousand Pounds, in Six Thousand Shares of Five Pounds each, with power to the said Company to extend their Stock to the amount of Fifty \$50 000. Thousand Pounds, in manner prescribed by the said Act :

And whereas, by an Act passed in the Twenty-third Year of the Reign of Her present Majesty entitled "An Act to Amend an Act passed in the Twenty-second Year of the Reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, entitled an Act to Incorporate the General Water Company," the first mentioned Act was in some respects amended :

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the first recited Act (the amount of Fifty Thousand Pounds therein mentioned having been found Expedient to uninsufficient for the purposes of the said Act) by enabling the said Company still further to increase their Capital Stock :

Be it therefore enacted, by the Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, in Legislative Session convened, as follows:

I.-It shall be lawful for the said Company, at a General Meeting of Additional Stock Stockholders, to be called in manner prescribed in the said Acts, to extend

their Capital Stock to the further and additional amount of Thirty Thousand Pounds, or of such proportion thereof as may be requisite.

To be distributed as in former Acts.

II.—Such additional Stock shall be distributed in Shares of the like amount, and be payable in the same manner, and shall have the like advantages, and be attended by the like incidents, in all respects, as in and by the said recited Acts, or either of them, are declared of and concerning the Shares therein mentioned.

III.—It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to appoint a Director of the said Company, to hold office during pleasure of the Government, in addition to the Directors chosen by the Shareholders thereof, and that the number of the Directors to be so chosen shall be reduced from Seven to Five, Three of whom shall be a Quorum; and no proceeding of the Board of Directors shall be of any effect or validity against which such Director, in his place at the Board, shall record his Vote, until such proceeding of the Board of Directors shall be submitted to and approved of by the Governor in Council.

Directors reduced to Five; Three a Quorum.

No proceeding of the Board valid without consent of Government Director, or Governor in Council.

CAP. II.

An AUT to Provide for the Organization of a Volunteer Force for the Protection of Newfoundland.

[Passed 25th June, 1861.]

Naval Resources of the British Empire should be ascertained and organized, to preserve its Integrity and protect its Commerce against Foreign Aggression at Home and Abroad, and, in the event of Emergencies arising requiring their Services, to aid the Civil Power in the preservation of the Public Peace and the Tranquillity and Happiness of their Homes : And Whereas many Individuals in this Colony have come forward to enrol themselves as Volunteers for the Defence of their Country, and as it is necessary to provide them with the Means of acquiring such Discipline and Training as will render them an Effective Force :

Be it therefore enacted, by the Governor, Council, and Assembly, as follows :

I.—The Governor and Commander-in-Chief may, during the continuation of this Act, draw from the Receiver General of this Province a sum not exceeding One Hundred and Fifty Pounds Sterling, and may expend genus, is the same in the payment of Drill Sergeants who have been trained in the British Army; of Ammunition for Practice and Drill; the Storage and Preservation of the Arms furnished by Her Majesty's Government; and generally in such other Services as may from time to time appear to him to be necessary for the efficient Organization and Maintenance of such Volunteer Force.

Power of Commander-in-Chief.

II.—The Commander-in-Chief may combine the Volunteer Companies so raised, or may organize and drill them as a separate and distinct Force, in Companies, Regiments or Brigades.

Quarterly Accounts.

III.—Accounts with Vouchers for the Expenditure authorized by this Act shall be rendered Quarterly to the Colonial Secretary, certified by the Captains or Officers commanding the Companies, and laid before the House of Assembly.

Oath of Allegiance.

IV.—Every Person who shall be enrolled in any Volunteer Company shall take the Oath of Allegiance to Her Majesty, which Oath any commissioned Officer, or other Person duly authorized by the Governor, may administer.

Duration of Act.

V.—This Act shall continue in force for One Year, and from thence to the end of the then next Session of the General Assembly.

CAP. III.

An Act to make further Provision for the Prevention of Nuisances.

[Passed 25th June, 1861.]

HEREAS it is expedient and necessary to make further Provision for the Prevention of Nuisances :

Be it therefore enacted, by the Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly, in Legislative Session convened, as follows :

I.-Any Person who shall commit, or be guilty of any of the Offences in this or in the Second Section named and specified, in the respective Towns of St. John's, Harbor Grace, Carbonear and Brigus, shall be subject and liable to such Penalties as are hereinafter mentioned, that is to say: Any Person who shall cast or throw, or order to be cast or thrown, Ings. any Dung, Dirt, Rubbish, or any other offensive Matter, in or upon the Highways. Gratings in any of the Public Streets, Roads or Highways; or any Person who shall have deposited, or order to be deposited, before his or her Dwelling Houses, Stores or other Buildings, any Dung, Dirt, Rubbish or other offensive Matter; or any Person who shall fail in keeping the Causeways or Sidewalks free of Snow and Ice to the extent of the breadth of such Sidewalks, and the Surface Drains adjoining the same, opposite to his or her Dwelling House, Stores, or other Buildings, or shall throw any Snow or Lee on Sidewalks, or thrown Snow, Ice, or Rubbish, in any of the Streets, Lanes or Passages, without into Streets without levelling the same; every such Person shall, for the first Offence, forfeit and pay a Sum not exceeding Twenty Shillings, and not less than Five

Shillings; and for the second Offence shall forfeit and pay a Sim not exceeding Forty Shillings and not less than Ten Shillings; and for a third or subsequent Offence, shall forfeit and pay a Sim not exceeding Five Pounds and not less than Twenty Shillings.

II.—Any Person who shall not keep in good Condition and Repair the Stone or Plank Pavement, or Causeway, opposite to his or her respective Dwelling Houses, Stores or other Buildings, shall forfeit and pay for the first Offence a Sum not exceeding Twenty Shillings and not less than Five Shillings, and for a second or subsequent Offence shall forfeit and pay a Sam not exceeding Forty Shillings and not less than Ten Shillings; and after the first Offence the Surveyor-General of the Colony may cause to be repaired and amended the said Pavement or Causeway, and shall thereupon be entitled to recover from the Owner or Occupier of such Dwelling House, Store or other Building, before any Stipendiary Justice of the Peace, in a summary way, the Expenses incurred in such Reparation and Amendment, together with Costs of Suit.

III.—The said Penalties and Forfeitures shall be recovered in a sum-Recovery of Penal- mary way, by Order and Adjudication of any one Stipendiary Justice of the Peace, resident in the Town in which the Offence shall be committed, under the Provisions and by virtue of the Sixth Section of an Act passed in the Twenty-third Year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, entitled "An Act for the Prevention of Nuisances in the Towns of Saint John's, Harbor Grace, Carbonear and Brigus."

IV.—That the Eighth Section of the hereinbefore recited Act 23 Vic., Cap. 6, be and the same is hereby repealed.

V.—That all Building Lots and improved and occupied Lands fronting any Road, Street, Lane or Cove, within this Colony, and dangerous to Passengers, or in other respects a Nuisance, shall be protected and enclosed with a sufficient Fence.

Building Lots not fenced a nuisance. VI.—If the Owner or Occupier of any Building Lots, improved or occupied Lands, shall neglect, after receiving Notice, to protect and enclose the same with such Fence, the Surveyor-General of the Colony may cause the same to be erected or repaired, and shall thereupon recover from such Owner or Occupier, before any Justice of the Peace, in a summary way, or in any Court of Record, the Expenses incurred in such Erection and Reparation of such Fences, together with Costs of Suit.

Mummers without Licence a nuisance.

VII.—Any Person who shall be found, at any Season of the Year, in any Town or Settlement in this Colony, without a written Licence from a Magistrate, dressed as a Mummer, masked, or otherwise disguised, shall be deemed to be guilty of a Public Nuisance, and may be arrested by any Peace Officer, with or without a Warrant, and taken before any Justice of the Peace, in the District or Place where such Person may be found; and

CAP. IV.

An Act for granting to Her Majesty a Sum of Money for defraying the Expenses of the Civil Government of this Colony for the Year ending the Thirty-first Day of December, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixtyone, and for other Purposes.

[Passed 25th June, 1861.]

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY :

E, Your Majesty's dutiful and loyal Subjects the Commons of Newfoundland, having freely and voluntarily resolved to give and grant unto Your Majesty a Supply to defray certain Charges for the Support of the Civil Government, for the Administration of Justice, and the general Improvement of this Colony, do beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and

Be it therefore enacted, by the Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, in General Session convened : That from and out of such Monies as shall from time to time remain in the hands of the Receiver General, propriated for purand unappropriated, there be granted to Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors, the Sum of Fifty-two Thousand and Seven Hundred and Thirty-two Pounds Thirteen Shillings and Four Pence, which said Sum of Money shall be applied in payment of the following Charges; for the Year commencing on the First Day of January, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty-one, and ending on the Thirty first Day of December in the same Year-that is to say:

An Act to Provide for the Contingent Expenses of the Legislature.

[Passed 25th June, 1861.]

THEREAS it is expedient to provide for the Contingent Expenses of Preamble. the Legislature of this Colony :

Be it therefore enacted by the Governor, Legislative Council, and Assembly, in Legislative Session convened :

That from and out of such Monies as shall from time to time remain in Contingencies Alethe hands of the Receiver General, and unappropriated, there be granted to Her Majesty, Her Heirs and Successors, the Sum of Fifteen Thousand Three Hundred and Ninety-three Pounds Six Shillings and Eleven Pence, to be applied towards remunerating the Officers of the Legislature for their Services, and towards defraying the Contingent Expenses of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, as follows :
