

At the General ASSEMBLY of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on Tuefday the Twenty Eighth Day of May, 1765, in the Fifth Year of His Majesty's Reign, and there continued by feveral Prorogations, to Thurfday the 23d Day of October, 1766, in the Sixth Year of His Majesty's Reign.

An AC-T to prevent the Cutting or Breaking down the Bank of any River, Seabank, or Dykes.

HEREAS there are large Tracks of Marsh Lands within this Province dyked in, great Part of which are, at this Time, under actual Improvement, from which great Advantages must arife, and as the dyking or draining those Lands are attended with a very great Expence; which Extence and Advantages may be lost, to the Ruin of many industrious Persons, by wicked and evil minded Persons cutting or destroying faid Dykes, or the Piles or Picketts, which are drove into the faid Marshes, their Banks or Dykes; For REMEDY WHEREOF, Be it Enasted by the Lieutenant Governor, Council, and Assembly, That if any Person or Persons from and after the Publication of this Act, shall unlawfully and maliciously break down, or cut down the Bank or Banks of any River or any Seabank or Dykes, whereby any Lands shall be overflowed or damaged, every Person so offending, being thereof lawfully convicted, shall be adjudged guilty of Felony, and shall fuffer Death as in Cases of Felony, without Benefit of Clergy.

And be it further enacled, That if any Perfon or Perfons shall, at any Time or Times hereafter, unlawfully cut off, draw up or remove and carry away, any Piles or other Materials, which are, or at any Time hereafter shall be, driven into the Ground and used for the securing any Marsh Lands, or Sea Walls, Banks, or Dykes, in order to prevent the Lands lying within the same from being overflowed and damaged, it shall and may be lawful to and for any Two or more of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace, residing near the Place where the faid Offence or Offences shall be committed, and such Justices are hereby respectively authorised and required, upon Complaint or Information upon Oath of such Offence, to fummon

mon the Party or Parties so complained of, or to issue their Warrant or Warrants to apprehend and bring before them, the Perfon or Persons to accused, complained of, or suspected, and upon his, her, or their Appearance, or neglect to appear, to proceed to examine the Matter of Factwith which he, flie, or they, are charged, and upon due Proof thereof made, either by Confession of the Party or Rarties * fo acculed, or upon the Oath or Oaths of One or more credible Witness or Witnesses, to determine the same, and to convict the Offender or Offenders; and every Person offending herein, and being thereof convicted as aforetaid, shall forfeit and pay the Sun of Twenty Pounds; one Moiety thereof to the Informer, and the other Moiety to the Overfeers of, and for the Ufe of the Poor of the Township or Place wherein such Offence shall be committee; the fame to be levied by Diftrefs and Sale of the Offender's Goods and Chattels, together with the Charges of fuch Diftreis and Sale, rendering the Overplus (if any be) to the Owner or Owners thereof; and for Want of furticient Diftrefs the faid Juffices are hereby required to commit the Person or Persons convicted as aforefaid, to the Houle of Correction or Common Gaol of the County, Town or Place, where the Offence shall be committed, there to remain and be kept at hard Labour for the Space of Six Months,

An A C'I in Addition to and Amendment of an A t made and paffed in the Second Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, intitled; An AEt for regulating the Exportation of Fifth, and the Affixe of Barrels, Staves, Hoaps, Boards, and all other Kinds of Lumber; and for appointing Officers to furvey the fume.

HEREAS the Laws and Regulations made and provided, W, refpecting the packing of Mackarel, and all other Kinds of pickled Fifh, within this Province, do not appear to furly answer the Purposes for which they were intended; Be it enasted by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Assembly, That from and after the First Day of January, which will be in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty Seven, all and every Person or Persons packing Mackarel or any other Kind of pickled Fish within this Province for Sale, or Exportation, shall brand each Cask and Barrel by him or them so packed, on the Head of such Cask or Barrel, with the initial Letter or Letters of his or their Christian Name, and his or their Sizname at Length, before he or they shall shall prefume to thip for Exportation or expose to Sale any Mackarel or other Kind of pickled Fish, before the fame be branded

as aforefaid, fhall, on due Conviction thereof, by the Oath credible Witnels', before any of His Majefty's Juffices of the Peace, forfeit and pay the Sum of *Ten Shillings* for each and every Cafk or Barrel fo exported or exposed to Sale, one Moiety thereof to the Informer, and the other Moiety to the Overfeers of, and for the Ufe of the Poor of the Township, Town or Place, wherein fuch Offence shall be committed; the fame to be levied by Diftress and Sale of the Offender's Goods and Chattels, together with the Charges of such Diftress and Sale, rendering the Overplus (if any be) to the Owner or Owners thereof.

An Act for impowering the Justices of the Peace for the County of *Queen's County* to hold Courts of Special Sessions of the Peace, at *Yarmouth* and *Barring*ton, in faid County, for the faid Townships of *Yar*mouth and *Barrington*.

HEREAS for Want of Roads, and the Distance between W the Township of Liverpool in the County of Queen's County, and the Townships of Yarmouth and Barrington, makes the Attendance of Perfons residing in the faid Townships of Yarmouth and Barrington, at the General Session of the Peace held for the faid County of Queen's County, at Liverpool, very inconvenient; For REMEDY WHEREOF, Be it Enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Council, and Asfemby, That Courts of General Sessions of the Peace, shall and may be held and kept within the Township of Yarmouth in Queen's County, on the First Tuesday of April, and within the Township of Barrington in the faid County, on the First Tuesday of November, in every Year; and any Three or more of the Justices for the County of Queen's County, shall and may hold the faid Courts, and fuch Courts shall have, hold, use, exercise, and enjoy, all and fingular, the Powers which are by Law already given and granted unto Courts of General Sessions of the Peace, so far as relates to all fuch Matters and Things as shall be cognizable by fuch Courts within the faid Townships of Yarmouth and Barrington.

An Act for altering, amending, and prolonging an Acc made in the Fifth Year of the Reign of His prefent Majefty, intitled, An Act for Granting to His Majefty an Excife on Wines, Tea, Coffee, and Playing Cards Sold within this Province.

E it Enasted by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Affembly, That all Wines, Tea, Coffee, and Playing Cards, fold or by any ways or Means brought into this Province, thall pay the following Rates and Duties of Excife, viz. Wines per Gallon, Six Pence; Tea per Pound, One Shilling; Coffee per Pound, Two Pence; Cards per Pack, One Shilling.

And be it further Enabled, That the Collector or Receiver or Collectors or Receivers of the Dutics, or one of them, thall grant Permits Gratis, to all Retailers and others, as well for Tea, Coffee, and Playing Cards, as for Wines, for all fuch Quantities of Tea, Coffee, and Playing Cards, as they thall from Time to Time purchase from any Merchant or other Perfon, That is to fay, for Tea and Coffee in any Quantity not lefs than Fifty Pounds Weight, and for Cards not lefs than Fifty Packs, and thall deliver a Duplicate of fuch Permit, One to remain in the Hands of the Buyer, and the other to be delivered to the Seller, at the Time of Delivery of fuch Tea, Coffee and Playing Cards.

And be it also Enasted, That the Collector or Receiver, or Collectors or Receivers aforefaid, is and are hereby impowered and directed to take and receive from the Purchafer or Purchafers of fuch Tea and Coffee, and Playing Cards, the Duty of Excue at and after the Rate aforementioned, for the Quantity expressed in faid Permit and Duplicate, before the Delivery of the fame, without allowing any Credit therefor.

And be it further Enabled, That from and after the Publication hereof, no Deduction or Allowance shall be made for Wassage and Leakage upon any Wines, in the Hands of any Merchant or other Person, but that the Collector or Receiver or Collectors or Receivers aforesaid, are hereby impowered, in Lieu thereof, to give Credit to such Merchant or other Person, for so much only of such Wines, as shall bona fide appear to have been wassed or leaked out, to be proved upon Oath at the Quarterly Settlement of Accounts for Duties on such Wines; and no Allowance or Abatement whatever shall be hereafter made on any Wines that shall be exported.

And be it also Enacted, That if any Tea, Coffee, or Cards shall be fraudulently relanded in any Port or Place of this Province after after Inipped for Expertation, the fame shall be forfeited, together with the Vessel out of which the faid Coffee, Tea, and Playing-Çards, shall have been fo fraudulently relanded.

And be it Enabled, That all and every Perfon bringing in, or caufing to be brought into this Province, any Wines, Tea, Coffee, or Playing Cards, for their own Confumption, fhall render a just and full Account of all fuch Wines, Tea, Coffee, and Playing Cards, to the Collector or Receiver, or Collectors or Receivers aforetaid, within Twenty For-Hours after the Arrival of the Veffel wherein fuch Wines, Tea, Coffee, on Playing Cards, shall be fo brought in, and shall pay or secure to be paid the Duties of Excise aforetaid thereon, under the Penalty of forfeiting all such Wines, Tea, Coffee, and Playing Cards, so introduced, in wholefoever Posses of the fame may be found; and shall also forfeit and pay the Sum of Twenty Pounds for every such Offence.

And be it alfo Enacted, That all Wines, Tea, Coffee, and Playing Cards, feized for illicit and contraband Trade, which. shall be brought into any Port within this Province, upon Condemnation thereof, shall be subject to the Duties of Excise imposed by this Act, and if fuch Condemnation shall be in the Court of Vice Admiralty, the Marshal of such Court or his Deputy, or any Auctioneer or Vendue Master, shall not deliver any fuch Wines, Tea, Coffee, and Plaving Cards, fold by him or them at Publick Auction, or otherwise, without a Permit from the Collector or Receiver, or Collectors or Receivers of the Duties, and shall render an Account to the Collector or Receiver, or Collectors or Receivers aforefaid (upon Oath) of the Quantity of all fuch Wines, Tea, Coffee, and Playing Cards, which he or they shall fell at Publick Auction or otherwife, and of the Perfons Names to whom the same shall be fold, under the Penalty and Forfeiture of I wo Hundred Pounds for each and every Offence,

And be it also further Enacted, That the Act made in the Fifth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intitled, An Ast for granting to His Majesty an Excise on Wines, Tea, Coffee, and Playing Cards, Sold within this Province, with the Alterations and Amendments thereto made by this Act, shall be and continue, and the fame is hereby continued in Force until the First Day of December, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty Seven.

An Act in Amendment of an Act made in the Third Year of His prefent Majesty's Reign, intitled, An Act for altering and amending feveral Acts of this Province relating to the Duties of Excise on Wines, Rum, and other distilled Spirituous Liquors Sold within this Province.

FOOT HEREAS by the Act made in the Third Year of His Ma-W g jesty's Reign, intitled, an Act for altering and amending several Acts of this Province, relating to the Duties of Excise on Wines Rum, and other distilled Spirituous Liquors, fold within this Province, the Collector or Receiver, or Collectors or Receivers of the Duties, is and are directed to make and allow Five ver Cent for Wastage and Leakage on all Rum, and other diffiled Stillituots Liquors in the Hands of any Merchant. Diftiller, or other Perfon, subich Allowance has been found productive of many Difudvantages to the Revenue of the Province, Be it therefore Enacted by the Licuterant Governor, Council, and Alfembly, 'I hat from and after the Publication of this Act, no fuch Allowance of Five per Cent for Wastage and Leakage, shall be allowed, but in Lieu thereof, if thro' Accident any Part of the Stock of Rum or other distilled Spirituous Liquors, in the Hands of any Merchant, Distiller, or other Perion, shall by Leakage or otherwise be lost, the Collector or Receiver, or Collectors or Receivers of the Duties fhall, on due Proof of the fame on Oath, credit the Stock of fuch Merchant, Distiller, or other Person, for the Quantity so lost, any Law, Ufuage, or Cuftom to the contrary notwithftanding .-

Mat he it further Enasted, That the Collector or Receiver, or Collectors or Receivers of the Duries of Excise granted by the aforesaid Act, and any Persons employed by or under them, shall observe the aforesaid Act, with the Additions and Amendments that have since been made to the same, and also this Act, for their Rule and Guide in receiving the aforesaid Duties, any Law, Usuage, or Custom to the contrary notwithstanding.

An Act for difcontinuing the Bounty on Stone Walls.

W HEREAS the heavy Load of Debt which this Province da-W bours under, renders it unable any longer to pay the Bounty granted on Stone Walls built on the Peninfula of Halifax, Be it Enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Council, and Affembly, That from and after the First Day of January, One Thousand Seven Hunwred and Sixty Eight, all Bounties and Premiums what foever, which have have heretofore been granted by any Law of this Province on Stone Walls built on the Peninfula of *Halifax*, thall abfolutely ceafe and determine, any Law, Ufuage, or Cuftom to the contrary in any wife notwithflanding.

An Act for continuing an Act, intitled an Act for reviving an Act made and passed in the 33d Year of His late Mujesty's Reign, intitled "An Act for fur-"ther prolonging a Resolution of the Governor and "Council, revived and putsin Force by the General As-"jumbly in the 32d Year of His Majesty's Reign."

判定其书 HEREAS the Law hereafter mentioned, hath by Experi-W H ence been found useful and beneficial, and no Inconvenience baving arose thereform, and that the same is near expiring, Be it therefore Enabled by the Lieutenant Governor, Council, and Alfembly, That an Act for reviving an Act made and passed in the Thiriy Third Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intitled An Act for further prolonging a Refolution of the Governor and Council, revived and put in Force by the General Affembly in the Thirty Second Y-ir of His Minfly's Rrign, which was to continue in Force for Three Years from the Twenty Eighth Day of November, One Thoufond Seven Hundred and Sixty Three, and from thence to the End of the Seffion of the General Affembly then next following, shall be and the fame is hereby further continued from the Expiration thereof, until the Twenty Eighth Day of November, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty Nine, and from thence to the End of the then next Seffion of the General Affembly.

An A C T for preventing Frauds in the Revenue.

HERFAS many Perfons coming from the neighbouring Co-W 1 nies as Paff ngers and Traders, as also the Mariners on board the Trading Veffels, do frequently, without the Knowledge, Privity, or Confent of the respective Masters, put on board such

Veffcls fundry Quantities of Goods, fubject by Law to Duties in this Prowince, taking out feperate Cockets therefor, with Intention to land and conceal the fame, without making any Report; or if diffeovered, to make Post Post Entries under frivolous Pretences: And whereas the Officers of the Revenue are put to great Difficulties in bringing fuch Offenders to Speedy Juffice, as it frequently happens that the Masters of Velses and other Evidences for convicting them, are obliged to leave the Province before the Return of the flated Times for holding Courts; For REMEDY whereof, Be it Enacted by the Linutenant Governor, Council, and Affembly, That from and after the Publication hereof, no Post Entry shall be allowed of any Goods hable to the Payment of Duties, which are not contained in the Manifest entered at the Impost Office, and sworn to by the Master of the Vessel entering according to Law, but the same shall be feized, forfeited, and applied as other Forfeitures are declared to be by the Laws already made eftablishing the faid. Duties.

And he it further Evected, That upon every Information made to any Two or more of the Judges of the Common Law Courts, the faid Judges shall be and are hereby impowered and directed to hold a Special Settions, and to try and determine the Matters therein contained, and for this Purpose to iffue Process to the Provost Marshal, returnable at a short Day, to summon a Special Jury to pass on the Trial, asals to convene the Party complained of before the Court, to join Iffue in the fud Trial, and to hold him or them to Special Bail to abide by the Judgment and Determination of the faid Special Court, which final Judgments and Determinations shall be as good and effectual to all Intents and Purposes, as if the Trialshad been profecuated in any of His Majesty's Courts of Record, at the usual and stated Terms thereof, any Law or Custom to the contrary notwith standing.

And be it also further Enacted, That in Cafe it shall happen, that any of the Evidences for supporting any Information that may be sobrought, are obliged to leave the Province before the Day appointed by the Special Seffions for the Trial of the Cause, that then and in that Case it shall be in the Power of any One of the faid Judges, upon Notice given to the adverse Party to be prefent, to take the Depositions of the faid Evidences in Writing, which Depositions, so taken and subscribed by the Judge and Witnesses, shall be admitted as Evidence to the Jury upon the Trial.

HEREAS the feveral Acts for laying Duties of Impost and W Excise on Wines, Beer, Rum, and other distilled Spirituous Liquors, have been found infufficient to answer the Purpose thereby intended, We do hereby Grant unto His Most Excevent Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, for the Uses hereinaster mentioned,
