The Japanese Delegation to the Second Meeting of the CanadaJapan Ministerial Committee, which will be led by the Honourable
Munenori Akagi, Minister of Agriculture and Forestry, will arrive at
6:30 p.m. EDT Tuesday, September 24, at Uplands Airport (Department of
Transport side) from Toronto and Vancouver. They will be met by the
Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Honourable Paul Martin
and by the Japanese Ambassador to Canada and Mrs. Ushiba.

The meetings will begin at 9.30 a.m. on Wednesday, September 25, (Room 308, West Block - photographers and cameramen may shoot opening ceremonies). In addition to Mr. Martin, Canada will be represented at the meeting by the Minister of Finance, the Honourable Walter L. Gordon, the Minister of Trade and Commerce, the Honourable Mitchell W. Sharp, the Minister of Fisheries, the Honourable Hedard Robichaud, the Minister of Agriculture, the Honourable Harry Hays, the Canadian Ambassador to Japan, Mr. Richard Bower, and senior Government officials. In addition to Mr. Akagi, Japan will be represented at the meeting by the Minister of Finance, the Honourable Kakuei Tanaka, the Minister for International Trade and Industry, the Honourable Hajime Fukuda, the Vice-Minister for Forcign Affairs, Mr. Shigenobu Shima, the Japanese Ambassador to Canada, Mr. Nobuhiko Ushiba and Japanese Government officials.

A luncheon will be given for the delegations by the Prime Minister, the Right Honourable Lester B. Fearson, on Thursday, September 26, and a dinner by Mr. Martin on the same day. The Japanese Ambassador, Mr. Ushiba, will give a luncheon for both delegations on Wednesday, September 25, and that evening separate dinners will be given by Mr. Gordon for Mr. Tanaka, by Mr. Sharp for Mr. Fukuda, by Mr. Robichaud for Mr. Akagi, and by Mr. N.A. Robertson, Under-Secretary of State for External Affairs, for Mr. Shima.

A separate programme is planned for the ladies accompanying he Japanese Delegation, with Mrs. Mitchell Sharp accompanying them on informal trip to Montreal on Wednesday, and Mrs. Walter Gordon joining them for a visit to Upper Canada Village on Thursday. Mrs. shiba will give a dinner on Wednesday evening.

The meetings will conclude with the issuing of a final communiqué, and a press conference to be held in Room 208 of the West clock at 5.00 p.m. Thursday, September 26.

Following the Ministerial Committee meeting, a number of the apanese participants, including Mr. Akagi and Mr. Fukuda, will visit foronto and the Niagara Peninsula on Friday, September 27. They will separt from Uplands Airport by D.O.T. Viscount at 9.30 a.m., and lying by way of the St. Lawrence Seaway, will arrive at Toronto's alton Airport at 11.15 a.m. They will be guests at a luncheon given for them by Premier John Robarts in Toronto. In the afternoon the group will travel by car to Niagara Falls, visiting as well Niagara tydro developments and the Welland Canal, and that evening will be guests at a dinner offered in their honour by the Honourable undy LaMarsh, Minister of National Health and Welfare, at the city of liagara Falls.

The Canada-Japan Ministerial Committee was established during the visit to Ottawa of the Prime Minister of Japan in June 1961 when it was agreed by the Canadian and Japanese Prime Ministers that, in view of the increasing importance of Canadian-Japanese relations, Ministers of the two Governments should meet from time to time to exchange views on matters of common interest, particularly in the economic field, and to familiarize themselves with the problems of the other country. The Ministerial Committee was not intended to be a negotiating body.

The first meeting of the Ministerial Committee took place in Tokyo in January 1963. Discussions were held at that time on the trade and economic relations between Canada and Japan as well as on economic Tatters of an international nature affecting the two countries. It was agreed then that the second meeting would be held in Ottawa.
